2015-2016 Cooperative Extension Highlights

- Cooperative Extension has gone digital, emailing a monthly newsletter highlighting upcoming programs. Look for it on the first of each month.
- In 2015, all volunteer programs were distinguished at the State-Level!
- · Master Gardener's Coastal Gardening Festival, Award for Excellence
- · Master Gardener, Lois Chatham, Excellence in Service Award
- •A graduate of the 4-H leadership program was inducted into the North Carolina 4-H Honor Club (only .05% of North Carolina 4-H members are eligible for induction).
- •The Extension and Community Association Volunteers, Gold Seal Award (the highest state honor from their state association) in recognition of the hours of volunteer service they give to Dare County.
- Greenline, the horticultural hotline for Dare County, is now accessible online and through remote access voicemail, and in Manteo 5 days a week from 8:30 to 5:00. Additionally, face-to-face access is now offered in Manteo, Kill Devil Hills, and Hatteras.
- Dare County Master Gardeners have provided 5 televised programs about landscaping and gardening in our unique Outer Banks' coastal community.
- Dare Master Gardeners continue to provide upkeep, improvements, planning, financial support, and labor for the Arboretum and Teaching Garden that is used for education, exercise, dog walking, and the general enjoyment of thousands of citizens and visitors.
- 4-H Summer Day Camp hosted 125 kids in 2016. A licensed program, it is especially designed to provide affordable, safe child care for kids that have working parents. Day-to-day activities stress healthy exercise, educational field trips, and hands-on, curriculum-based learning. Partially funded through a JCPC grant; full and partial scholarships are awarded.
- In 2016, for the first time in 10 years, the Dare County 4-H program has trained, fully
 qualified, and registered 4-H Club Leaders that are working with Dare County kids.
 Cooperative Extension continues to provide regional and state opportunities to Dare County
 youth.
- The Extension and Community Association works to strengthen families through leadership development and volunteerism. In 2016, 12 members provided over 877 hours of service.
- Dare County now has a Family Consumer Science Agent. She has already begun teaching nutrition and food safety classes such as Healthy Crock Pot Meals for the Family, Making and Canning Fig Preserves, Med instead of Meds (an introduction to the nutritious and hearthealthy Mediterranean diet). City Beverage Group Development -- CUP Amendment

STAFF REPORT: City Beverage Warehouse-- Amendment to CUP 5-2012

DATE: May 1, 2017 Board of Commissioners Meeting

This item was originally scheduled for discussion on January 3 but was tabled to allow the Dare County Airport Authority to review the site plan. It was determined during the DCAA review that additional review by the FAA was needed. The FAA has reviewed the proposal and issued a determination of no hazard to air navigation.

There are currently two other structures on the site. The location of more than one principal use structure on the property constitutes a group development under section 22-31 of the Dare County Zoning Ordinance. Group developments are subject to conditional use review and approval by the Planning Board and Board of Commissioners. The site is zone 1-I industrial.

The two new buildings will be constructed in phases as noted on the site plan. The first building will consist of 19,800 square feet and the second building will consist of 4,500 square feet. Access and parking improvements shall be constructed as shown on the site plan. The proposed buildings will be used for storage only and will not be used for retail or office space. A condition to this effect is included in the CUP amendment.

Condition # 2 of the CUP amendment provides three years for the applicant to secure a Dare County building permit. A copy of the draft CUP amendment and a copy of the original CUP 5-2012 is included with this staff report.

The Planning Board reviewed this CUP amendment request on December 12, 2016 and voted to recommend approval of the revised site plan and CUP amendment subject to approval of the request by the Dare County Airport Authority.

The State stormwater permit and sedimentation control permit will be modified for the construction of the additional improvements.



AMENDMENT to CUP No. 5-2012

Dare County Sections 22-27, 22-31 and 22-68.

Application of: J.T. Dixon Sr. for City Beverage Company

On May 1, 2017 the Dare County Board of Commissioners considered an amendment to CUP 5-2012 issued to J.T. Dixon Sr for the City Beverage group development on Roanoke Island. The original CUP was issued in February 2013 by the Dare County Board of Commissioners for the construction of a 10,800 square foot storage building. This amendment is for the construction of two additional mini storage warehouses.


On December 12, 2016 the Dare County Planning Board reviewed the proposed amendment and recommended approval of the amendment.


The following conditions shall be added to the original conditional use permit authorized by Dare County:


- 1. Two additional mini storage warehouses shall be constructed with associated site improvements. One building shall consist of 19,800 square feet and the second building shall consist of 4,500square feet.
- 2. A Dare County building permit for the first phase shall be secured within three (3) years of the date of approval of this CUP amendment.
- 3. The building shall be used for storage. The buildings shall not be used for residential, retail, office or other commercial uses. Approval from the Dare County Airport Authority shall be secured before a building permit can be issued. An as-built site plan shall be submitted to Dare County at completion of each of the proposed structures.
- 4. Additional lighting fixtures shall be installed similar to existing fixtures on site.
- 5. All fencing new and existing shall be compliant with Dare County Code and prior conditions set forth in CUP 5-2012
- 6. All other terms and conditions as set forth in CUP 5-2012 remain in effect.



Construction of metal self storage building and associated infrastructure







On February 4, 2013 the Dare County Board of Commissioners considered the application of the Petitioner above named which application is on file with the Dare County Planning Department, and the Board finds as follows:

- 1. That the written application of Petitioner with attachments has been duly submitted to the Dare County Planning Board as required by Section 22 of the Dare County Code (hereinafter referred to as "Code");
- 2. That the application substantially complies with the requirements of the Code in that it requests uses permitted by conditional use permit under the Code, including family housing complexes;
- 3. That the Petitioner owns 4.67 acres located at which is identified on the Dare County Tax Records as Parcel No. 025252000. The property is zoned I-1 industrial and group developments are permitted in the district as conditional uses;
- 4. That the Dare County Planning Board recommended for approval the granting of this Conditional Use Permit as requested. The Planning Board made this recommendation on December 10, 2012.
- 5. That the Dare County Board of Commissioners is empowered under sections of the Code set out above to grant uses such as allowed herein and insofar as the conditional use is hereinafter allowed it will not adversely affect the public interest;
- 6. That the hereinafter described conditional use is deemed to be reasonable and is not in degradation of the intent of the ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, under the provisions of the Code, the following conditional use is granted to City Beverage Company for a group development subject to such conditions as are hereinafter set out:

CONDITIONAL USE: a group development consisting of two storage warehouses as depicted on the site plan identified as Appendix B and made a part of this conditional use permit.

CONDITIONS:

- 1. There is an existing 15,277 square foot storage facility on the site that was constructed in 2004. A 10,800 square foot second building is proposed for construction as part of this group development permit. The units shall be used for unconditioned storage and no storage unit shall be used or occupied for residential or commercial purposes.
- 2. A building permit for construction of the proposed 10,800 square foot storage building shall be secured from Dare County within twelve months of the date of CUP approval by the Board of Commissioners. An as-built survey of the site shall be submitted to the Planning Department prior to issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy for the new storage building.
- 3. The existing chainlink fencing on the site shall be modified to feature slatting in the fence in those sections of the fence that abut the residential uses as depicted on Appendix B. The applicant shall be responsible for the maintenance of the fencing.
- 4. Parking for the individual storage units shall be allowed immediately adjacent to the storage buildings to facilitate the loading and unloading of any individual units.
- 5. Parking of RVs, boats shall be permitted in those areas as noted on Appendix B.
- 6. Additional lighting fixtures shall be installed that are similar to the existing fixtures on the site. The new light fixtures shall be installed so that no light illuminates or reflects on any adjacent property or public right-of-way.
- 7. Tenants of the storage buildings shall be allowed access to the site between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. daily.
- 8. State permits for stormwater management and soil erosion and sedimentation control shall be secured prior to the issuance of any Dare County building permit. Copies of the State permits shall be submitted with the building permit application and building plans.
- 9. The Planning Department staff shall monitor the site. The applicant shall be notified in writing of any violation of this CUP. Appropriate measures to correct any violation identified by the Dare County Planning Department shall be made upon receipt of notice. Failure to correct any violations may void this CUP and may result in the assessment of civil penalties as provided for in Chapter 10 of the Dare County Code of Ordinance and/or any other legal remedy available to Dare County.
- 10. A copy of the site plan shall be provided to the Dare County Airport Authority to review the proposed location of the second storage building to ensure there are no conflicts with the airport overlay district. If any conflicts are identified by the DCAA, then revisions shall be

made to the site plan as needed to ensure compliance with the regulations of the airport overlay district.

11. It is understood that all other terms and provisions of the Code shall remain in full force and effect except as herein lawfully permitted;

The Roanoke Island Volunteer Fire Department has submitted a conditional use permit application to construct a training facility at their Wanchese station located at 323 Old Schoolhouse Road. The facility will resemble a residential structure and will be located in the rear of the property behind the firehouse. The facility will not be used for live fire training but will be used for smoke training, search and rescue and hose handling. The facility is needed to support the ISO insurance rating for the fire department. Another site currently used by RIVFD is no longer available to them and to avoid a decrease in their ISO rating, the department is proposing to construct another facility at their Wanchese site. The Wanchese site is zoned Village Residential and public buildings are conditional uses in this district.

The Planning Board reviewed the CUP application and site plan at their April 10, 2017 meeting and voted to recommend approval. The draft CUP is attached for the Board's review. Joe and Nan Willis, adjoining property owners, spoke at the Planning Board meeting in opposition to the proposed training facility. They expressed concerns about noise, lights and late hours. Several conditions were recommended by the Planning Board in response the their concerns – a privacy fence along the rear of the site, activities in the training facility shall not occur after 10:00 p.m. on those evening when the facility is used, and a sign shall be posted on the property advising when the facility will be used. Chief Talmadge Jones, representing the RIVFD, indicated to the Planning Board that the training in the facility will not involve live fire training and sometimes training will occur at the site but not in the facility. Training takes place on the third and fourth Thursday nights of each month. I have included a copy of the aerial tax photo and some photos taken by staff of the existing vegetation that surrounds some portions of the facility.

Notice of the Board meeting has been posted on the property and the adjoining property owners notified as required by the zoning ordinance. I anticipate that the Mr. and Mrs. Willis will attend the Board meeting on May 1. As noted earlier, public buildings are conditional uses in the Village Residential district. The Board may apply reasonable and appropriate conditions to the use but cannot deny the conditional use permit if the proposal meets the technical requirements of the ordinance.

- 2. Training sessions not to included live fire training
- 3. A solid privacy fence, not to exceed 6 feet in height, shall be installed along the rear of the RIVFD property line.
- 4. Training activities in the facility shall cease by 10:00 p.m. on the nights when the facility is being used.
- 5. A sign shall be posted on the property to be used for general informational purposes and to notify the community when training in the facility will occur.
- 6. All other terms and provisions of the Dare County Zoning Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect except as herein specifically permitted otherwise;





AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into in duplicate originals this 3rd day of May, 2017 by and between the COUNTY OF DARE, NORTH CAROLINA, a body politic, hereinafter designated as "County", and the OUTER BANKS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, INC., a non-profit corporation, hereinafter designated as "Chamber":

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County initiated and received from NC State University Office of Outreach and Engagement, Industry Expansion Solutions, an Economic Development and Diversification Strategic Plan (the Plan) to optimize proven economic successes while working to diversify economic development and enhance the quality of life for all citizens and communities, which Plan is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHERAS, the Plan has a multi-year implementation strategy; and

WHEREAS, Chamber is a leader and catalyst for economic growth for both existing and future businesses in Dare County and has the staff, expertise and desire to take the steps necessary to implement year one of the Plan; and

WHEREAS, County desires to retain the services of Chamber to implement the first year of the Plan strategy; and

WHEREAS, for purposes of this Contract, Chamber is an independent contractor and is not an agent, agency or employee of County; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises it is mutually agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

1. CHAMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

Chamber agrees that in furtherance of this contract it shall:

- A. Implement a Business Retention & Expansion (BRE) program, which among other things
 - Survey Chamber members and Dare County businesses

 - Works to grow existing business and seek new businesses

- H. Explore and develop new opportunities with existing resources (commercial kitchen, locally packed products)
- I. Marketing: Develop recruitment packages (collateral)
- J. Connect business to resources available/catalog those resources
 - a. East Alliance
 - b. NC Commerce
 - c. Rural Center
 - d. EDPNC
 - e. Workforce Development Board
 - f. Albemarle Commission
 - g. Dare County local governments
 - h. Cooperative Extension
 - i. Industry Expansion Solutions
 - i. SBTDC
 - k. SBC
 - I. SCORE
- K. Establish and meet quarterly with an economic development coordinating council (consisting of representatives of all of the stakeholders who participated in the development of the Plan) for shared communication and alignment.
- L. Develop a public economic development dashboard to measure progress and identify ongoing areas of concern.
- M. Take such other and further actions as may be necessary to implement the goals of year one of the Plan.
- N. All websites, materials, work product of Chamber shall be for the benefit of County and shall be property of County.
- O. Meet with County officials every 60 days to review progress towards goals

2. COUNTY OBLIGATIONS

County agrees that in furtherance of this contract it shall:

- A. Pay chamber the sum of \$25,000.00, said sum to be paid in 4 quarterly payments beginning on the 15 day of May, 2017 and quarterly thereafter during the term of this agreement.
- B. Assist and cooperate with Chamber to accomplish the goals set forth above.
- C. Participate, provide input, attend meetings, and assist Chamber in the performance of this agreement as mutually desired by the parties, without cost to County.

3. TERM

The term of this agreement shall be for a period of one year beginning on the 3rd day of May 2017, unless sooner terminated as provided herein. If, mutually agreed by the parties, this contract may be extended in writing for additional terms to accomplish the some or all of the "Future Duties" set forth in paragraph 9 and if County elects to extend the contract for such duties, Chamber shall perform such duties for the cost set forth in paragraph 9 and County shall pay for such additional services quarterly as set forth above.

4. TERMINATION

County may terminate this agreement at any time for any reason or no reason upon thirty (30) days written notice to Chamber. Upon such termination, all sums due from County to Chamber shall be prorated through the date of termination and paid to Chamber within thirty (30) days from the termination date.

5. RECORDS AND WORK PRODUCT

The Chamber shall keep full and accurate records of all of its activities and duties hereunder and agrees to maintain such records and to have them available for inspection by the County during the Chamber's normal business hours. Such records and any intellectual property, written, tangible, or electronic materials, including social media accounts and webpages, created under the terms of this agreement shall be deemed "work" product and shall be the property of County and delivered to County upon request or upon the expiration or termination of this agreement. Though it may be used for the benefit of the parties to this agreement, work product shall not include Chamber's "OBX Made" initiative.

6. LIABILITY AND INSURANCE

The Chamber will indemnify and save harmless the County from all demands, claims, causes of action or judgments, and from all expenses that may be incurred arising from, or growing out of, any act or neglect of the Chamber, its agents or employees in connection with the performance of Chamber's d duties under the terms of this agreement. Chamber shall maintain during the term of this contract, a comprehensive general liability insurance policy that shall protect the County from claims for damages for personal injury or other liabilities arising from services rendered under this agreement, whether such services be by Chamber, its employees, subcontractor, officers, volunteers or agents. The policy shall have a minimum coverage amount of ONE MILLION NO/100 (\$1,000,000.00) DOLLARS. Chamber shall designate Dare County as an additional named insured in the policy. Chamber shall request that the cancellation clause contain a 30-day written notice to County of cancellation of the policy. Chamber shall provide county with a copy of the policy. Chamber shall maintain during the term of this agreement Workers' Compensation Insurance as prescribed by the laws of the State of North Carolina.

7. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Chamber shall operate as an independent contractor and its employees, agents, officers, directors and shall not be deemed or treated as an employee of the County with respect to the services performed hereunder or for any other purpose.

8. REPRESENTATIONS OF CHAMBER

In agreeing to undertake the responsibilities set forth in this Contract, Chamber represents and warrants to County that Chamber is a properly constituted nonprofit corporation operating under the laws of the State of North Carolina; that all corporate action necessary to approve this Contract has been undertaken by the Chamber; that the officers signing on behalf of Chamber have requisite corporate authority to do so; and that this Contract has been approved by its Board of Directors.

Nags Head Beach Nourishment Funding Request

Description

Please see the attached letter from the Town of Nags Head requesting funding of 50% of the updated cost estimate of \$25.596m for a 2018 or 2019 beach nourishment maintenance project. The cost estimate, prepared by CS&E, is also attached. DEC has updated the County Beach Nourishment model to version 17a. Assuming a 2018 project, County debt issuance would increase from \$8.5m to \$9.8m and annual debt service support would increase from \$0 to \$600,000 a year from 2019 through 2023. The minimum County fund balance would change from \$19.3m in 2020 to \$17.1m in 2020.

Bobby,

I appreciate the time that you and Dave took to meet with Andy and myself last week to discuss Nags Head's plans for re-nourishing our beach.

As you know, Nags Head is in the process of planning for our next beach re-nourishment project. Our plan is to be prepared to go to construction in either the spring of 2018 or 2019. Based on estimates provided by our consultant, Coastal Science and Engineering, construction costs are considerably higher now than they were when we did our original beach nourishment construction in 2011. Based on recent per cubic yard costs, we are planning for a sand cost of \$9.50 per cubic yard. In 2011, our cost was roughly \$6.50 per cubic yard. This estimate has been approved by FEMA as part of the cost estimates we are calculating for sand loss during Hurricane Matthew.

Several years ago when we originally worked with the County to provide an estimate for renourishment, this was based off our figures from the 2011 project. Unfortunately, we now realize that these costs are woefully underestimated. When we provided this original estimate to you, the County incorporated this into its financing model and indicated that the Town would receive a 50 percent County match towards the planned maintenance project. Based on an estimated \$17 million project cost, the County model assumed an \$8.5 million match to the Nags Head maintenance project. Based on our revised cost estimate of \$26 million, I am writing to request that the County consider revising its contribution towards the Nags Head maintenance project to maintain the 50 percent funding scenario. This would provide a County match of \$13 million to the Town's project. As we discussed in our meeting, we will make every effort to keep this cost down and understand that any savings realized would be credited back to the County fund first.

I appreciate your consideration and look forward to working with you on this next project.

Policy for Naming of Dare County Facilities and Improvements

The Dare County Board of Commissioners may name any County owned building or portion thereof, athletic field, recreation area, or other improvement (hereinafter Facility) as set forth in the following procedures:

Nomination Procedures

Any individual (or group?) may be nominated to have a Facility named in his/her honor to memorialize his or her contributions to Dare County. A nomination form can be obtained from the Dare County Board of Commissioners office and should be returned to the Clerk to the Board of Commissioners upon completion. Anonymous nominations shall not be accepted. Additional information such as letters of support or resolutions from other agencies may be submitted with the nomination form. Upon receipt, the Clerk will submit the nomination and accompanying materials to the Chairman of the Dare Board of Commissioners. The Chairman may place the nomination on a Board of Commissioners meeting agenda under the normal and customary procedures for agenda approval.

Criteria for Nomination:

The following criteria shall be used to evaluate the nominee:

- Must have been a full-time Dare County resident for a minimum of ____ years, or if deceased, have been a full-time Dare County resident for a minimum of ____ years.
- 2. Must be of good character and have supporting documentation of good character from multiple sources.
- 3. Must not have any pending criminal charges or have been found guilty of any criminal acts. (Exclude for felonyonly?)
- 4. Must have a satisfactory background check
- 5. Must have made significant contributions to Dare County through public service or volunteer activities. These contributions should be detailed on the nomination form or by separate attachment.
- 6. Should have some connection to the facility being named or the community in which the facility is located.
- 7. If nominee is alive, approval from nominees.
- 8. If nominee is deceased, a letter of support from the surviving legal next of kin.

Factors that will be considered in the evaluation:

- 1. Past service as a Dare County elected official or other State or federal office on behalf of Dare County.
- 2. Financial contributions and/or land donations made by the individual or on his/her behalf for the benefit of the facility.
- 3. Significant volunteer activities related to the facility
- 4. Are there other facilities in Dare County already named for the individual.
- 5. Military service and accomplishments
- 6. Other factors as may be determined by the Dare County Board of Commissioners

Action by Board of Commissioners

The Dare County Board of Commissioners shall review all nominations and any accompanying documentation and shall only take action on the naming nomination at a Board meeting on. Any action to approve shall be by unanimous vote (would you rather have 5/7 or majority vote?) of the Board of Commissioners.

If a nomination is approved, the Clerk to the Board shall notify the individual submitting the nomination form. Dare County shall be responsible for the posting of any plaque or signage for the named Facility as appropriate for the Facility.

It is the duty of the Department to administer and enforce the provisions of this Subchapter pertaining to the conservation of marine and estuarine resources. In execution of this duty, the Department shall fully implement the policy set out in subsection (a) of this section and may collect such statistics, market information, and research data as is necessary or useful to the promotion of sports and commercial fisheries in North Carolina and the conservation of marine and estuarine resources generally; conduct or contract for research programs or research and development programs applicable to resources generally and to methods of cultivating, harvesting, marketing, or processing fish as may be beneficial in achieving the objectives of this Subchapter; enter into reciprocal agreements with other jurisdictions with regard to the conservation of marine and estuarine resources; and regulate placement of nets and other sports or commercial fishing apparatus in coastal fishing waters with regard to navigational and recreational safety as well as from a conservation standpoint.

The Department is directed to make every reasonable effort to carry out the duties imposed in this Subchapter."

SECTION 2.4. G.S. 143B-289.51 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143B-289.51. Marine Fisheries Commission – creation; purposes.

- There is hereby created the Marine Fisheries Commission in the Department of Environmental Quality.
- The legislative policy for the Department set out in G.S. 113-181(a) shall apply to the Marine Fisheries Commission in carrying out the functions, purposes, and duties set forth in subsection (b) of this section and in exercising the powers and duties set forth in G.S. 143B-289.52.
- In exercising each of its various powers and duties, the Marine Fisheries Commission shall apply the following coastal fisheries policies and standards to its actions:
 - The paramount concern of conservation and management measures shall be (1)the continuing health and abundance of the marine and estuarine resources of North Carolina.
 - Conservation and management measures shall be based upon the best (2) available biological information; allocation decisions shall be based upon the best available sociological, economic, and other information deemed relevant by the Commission.
 - Conservation and management measures shall permit reasonable means and (3) quantities of annual harvest, consistent with maintaining a viable residual stock biomass to ensure stock replenishment on a continuing basis.
 - When possible and practicable, stocks of fish shall be managed as a <u>(4)</u> biological unit.
 - State coastal fishery management plans shall be developed as set out in (5)G.S. 113-182.1 to implement conservation and management measures for all marine fishery resources of commercial, recreational, or ecological importance.
 - Conservation and management decisions shall be fair and equitable to all the (6) people of the State and carried out in such a manner that no individual, corporation, or entity acquires an excessive share of any privileges extended by the State regarding the use of marine and estuarine resources.
 - Federal fishery management plans and fishery management plans of other (7)states or interstate commissions shall be considered when developing State coastal fishery management plans. Inconsistencies should be avoided unless the Commission determines that the conflicting plan is not in the best interest of North Carolina fisheries.
 - The functions, purposes, and duties of the Marine Fisheries Commission are to: (b)

Manage, restore, regulate, develop, and cultivate, conserve, protect, and regulate cultivate the marine and estuarine resources within its jurisdiction, as described in G.S. 113-132. G.S. 113-132, in a manner intended to conserve, protect, restore, and enhance those resources for the benefit of current and future generations of State citizens.

...."

SECTION 2.5. G.S. 143B-289.52(a) is recodified as G.S. 143B-289.52(a1). **SECTION 2.6.** G.S. 143B-289.52, as amended by section 2.5 of this act, reads as

rewritten:

"§ 143B-289.52. Marine Fisheries Commission – powers and duties.

- (a) In adopting rules and exercising its other powers and duties under subsections (a1) through (i) of this section, the Commission shall implement the legislative policies set out in subsections (a1) and (a2) of G.S. 143B-289.51.
- (a1) The Marine Fisheries Commission shall adopt rules to be followed in the management, protection, preservation, and enhancement of the marine and estuarine resources within its jurisdiction, as described in G.S. 113-132, including commercial and sports fisheries resources. The Marine Fisheries Commission shall have the power and duty:

 - (3) To adopt rules and take all steps necessary to develop and improve mariculture, including the cultivation, harvesting, and marketing of shellfish and other marine resources in the State, involving the use of public grounds and private beds as provided in G.S. 113-201.
 - (4) To close areas of public bottoms under coastal fishing waters for such time as may be necessary in any program of propagation of shellfish as provided in G.S. 113-204.
 - (5) In the interest of conservation of the marine and estuarine resources of the State, to institute an action in the superior court to contest the claim of title or claimed right of fishery in any navigable waters of the State registered with the Department as provided in G.S. 113-206(d).
 - In the interest of conservation of the marine and estuarine resources of the State and in keeping with the public trust resource conservation policies set out in subsections (a1) and (a2) of G.S. 143B-289.51, to enact rules applicable to each State commercial or recreational fishery that eliminate bycatch mortality of nontargeted species. Where bycatch mortality cannot be eliminated entirely from a fishery, the Commission shall enact rules that minimize bycatch mortality of nontargeted species to the maximum practicable extent.

SECTION 2.7. G.S. 113-129(1f) is recodified as G.S. 113-129(1g).

Overfished. — The condition of a fishery that occurs when the spawning stock biomass of the fishery is below the level that is adequate for the recruitment class of a fishery to replace the spawning class of the fishery.

 (12d) Overfishing. – Fishing that causes a level of mortality that prevents a fishery from producing a sustainable harvest may prevent conservation of a fishery or fish stock by reducing the spawning stock biomass of the fishery to a level that causes the fishery to be overfished.

(13) Private Pond. – A body of water arising within and lying wholly upon a single tract of privately owned land, from which fish cannot escape and into which fish cannot enter from public fishing waters at any time, except that all publicly owned ponds and lakes are classified as public fishing waters. In addition, the private owners of abutting tracts of land on which a pond not exceeding 10 acres is or has been established may by written agreement cooperate to maintain that pond as a private pond if it otherwise meets the requirements of this definition. If a copy of the agreement has been filed with the Wildlife Resources Commission and the pond in fact meets the requirements of this definition, it attains the status of private pond either 60 days after the agreement has been filed or upon the Commission's approving it as private, whichever occurs first.

(13a) Public Fishing Waters; Public Waters. — Coastal fishing waters, inland fishing waters, or both.

(13b) Public Hunting Grounds. — Privately owned lands open to the public for hunting under the terms of a cooperative agreement between the owner and the Wildlife Resources Commission.

(13c) Raptor. – A migratory bird of prey authorized under federal law and regulations for the taking of quarry by falconry.

(14) Shellfish. – Mollusca, specifically including oysters, clams, mussels, and scallops.

 (14a) Sustainable harvest. The amount of fish that can be taken from a fishery on a continuing basis without reducing the stock biomass of the fishery or causing the fishery to become overfished.

SECTION 2.9. G.S. 113-224(b) reads as rewritten:

Proposed Fishery Management Plans shall be developed in accordance with the Priority List, Schedule, and guidance criteria established by the Marine Fisheries Commission under G.S. 143B-289.52.

(b) The goal of the plans shall be to ensure the long-term viability of the State's commercially and recreationally significant species or fisheries. Each plan shall be designed to reflect fishing practices so that one plan may apply to a specific fishery, while other plans may be based on gear or geographic areas. Nevertheless, in accordance with the policy standards set

out in G.S. 143B-289.51(a2), stocks of fish, when possible and practicable, shall be managed as 1 a biological unit. Each plan shall: 2 Contain necessary information pertaining to the fishery or fisheries, 3 (1) including management goals and objectives, all biological and ecological 4 data necessary for the conservation of the fishery, status of relevant fish 5 stocks, stock assessments for multiyear species, fishery habitat and water 6 quality considerations consistent with Coastal Habitat Protection Plans 7 adopted pursuant to G.S. 143B-279.8, social and economic impact of the 8 fishery to the State, and user conflicts. 9 Recommend those management actions pertaining to the fishery or fisheries. 10 (2) Include conservation and management measures that will measures that (3)11 would provide the greatest overall benefit to the State, particularly with 12 respect to food production, recreational opportunities, and the protection of 13 marine ecosystems, and that will produce a sustainable harvest.ensuring the 14 conservation of marine and estuarine resources and ecosystems and 15 protecting those resources from overexploitation. - At the Commission's first regular meeting following the end of the two-year period, the Division shall report to the Commission whether overfishing has ended under plan management rules. Where the Commission determines that management measures under a plan have been insufficient to end overfishing within two years, the Commission shall utilize its supplemental authority under subdivision (e1) of this section to implement those measures necessary to end overfishing immediately. The Commission shall concurrently begin the process of adopting those permanent rules necessary to end overfishing. While the Commission is developing and implementing supplemental rules, the Fisheries Director shall exercise the Director's delegated proclamation authority under G.S. 143B-289.52(a)(8) to close the fishery to further harvest until the supplemental rules are in effect.
- Where the Commission determines that overfishing is occurring in a fishery at any time following the initial two-year overfishing assessment period under a plan, the management requirements for an overfished stock under sub-subdivision a. of this subdivision shall apply.
- (6) Specify a time period, not to exceed 10 years from the date of the adoption of the plan, for achieving a sustainable harvest.conservation in a fishery. This subdivision shall not apply if the Fisheries Director determines that the biology of the fish, environmental conditions, or lack of sufficient data make implementing the requirements of this subdivision incompatible with professional standards for fisheries management. In the event that the Commission is unable to achieve conservation in a fishery within 10 years despite closing the fishery to further harvest, the Commission shall recommend to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations those actions of other state agencies or proposed legislation the Commission finds necessary to restore the fishery.
- (7) Include a standard of at least fifty percent (50%) probability of achieving sustainable harvest for the fishery or fisheries. This subdivision shall not apply if the Fisheries Director determines that the biology of the fish, environmental conditions, or lack of sufficient data make implementing the requirements of this subdivision incompatible with professional standards for fisheries management.
- Recommend appropriate management actions pertaining to the fishery or fisheries as directed in this subsection. In doing so, the plan shall contain scientific data or other objective information that reasonably demonstrates that the time periods and standards specified in subdivisions (5) and (6) of this subsection will be achieved by the actions recommended in the plan. If such data are not available, then the plan shall recommend those management measures most likely to conserve and protect the fishery resource under consideration, thereby ensuring that the stock remains biologically viable.
- (c) To assist the Commission in the development of each Fishery Management Plan, the Chair of the Marine Fisheries Commission shall appoint a fishery management plan advisory committee. Each fishery management plan advisory committee shall be composed of commercial fishermen, recreational fishermen, and scientists, all with expertise in the fishery

for which the Fishery Management Plan is being developed. there is hereby established a council to be known as the Marine Fisheries Resources Advisory Council.

- Membership and terms. The Marine Fisheries Resources Advisory Council shall consist of not more than 20 members appointed by the Marine Fisheries Commission. The Council shall be composed of persons with appropriate expertise in coastal fishery resources. Counties and cities in the coastal area may nominate candidates for consideration by the Commission. The terms of all Council members serving on the Council on January 1, 2018, shall expire on July 31, 2018. A new Council shall be appointed in the manner provided by this subsection with terms beginning on August 1, 2018, and expiring on June 30, 2020. Thereafter, members shall be appointed to two-year terms beginning on July 1 of even-numbered years and expiring on June 30 of the next even-numbered year. Members may be reappointed at the discretion of the Commission, provided that one-half of the membership at the beginning of any two-year term is a resident of counties in the coastal area.
- (2) Functions and duties. The Advisory Council shall assist the Division and Commission in an advisory capacity in Fishery Management Plan development regarding all of the following:
 - a. On matters which may be submitted to it by either of them, including technical questions relating to the development of rules.
 - b. On such other matters pertaining to Plan development as the Council considers appropriate.
- (c1) The Department shall consult with the regional advisory committees established pursuant to G.S. 143B-289.57(e) regarding the preparation of each Fishery Management Plan. Before submission of a plan for review by the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, the Department shall review any comment or recommendation regarding the plan that a regional advisory committee submits to the Department within the time limits established in the Schedule for the development and adoption of Fishery Management Plans established by G.S. 143B-289.52. Before the Commission adopts a management measure to implement a plan, the Commission shall review any comment or recommendation regarding the management measure that a regional advisory committee submits to the Commission. Plan and shall inform the Commission of any comment or recommendation regarding plan management measures submitted to it by a regional advisory committee.
- (d) Each Fishery Management Plan shall be reviewed at least once every five years. The Marine Fisheries Commission may revise the Priority List and guidance criteria whenever it determines that a revision of the Priority List or guidance criteria will facilitate or improve the development of Fishery Management Plans or is necessary to restore, conserve, or protect the marine and estuarine resources of the State. The Marine Fisheries Commission may not revise the Schedule for the development of a Fishery Management Plan, once adopted, without the approval of the Secretary of Environmental Quality.
- (e) The Secretary of Environmental Quality shall monitor progress in the development and adoption of Fishery Management Plans in relation to the Schedule for development and adoption of the plans established by the Marine Fisheries Commission. The Secretary of Environmental Quality shall report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations within 30 days of the completion or substantial revision of each proposed Fishery Management Plan. The Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations shall review each proposed Fishery Management Plan within 30 days of the date the proposed Plan is submitted by the Secretary. The Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations may submit comments and recommendations on the proposed Plan to the Secretary within 30 days of the date the proposed Plan is submitted by the Secretary.

Chairman Woodard called the meeting to order at 5:02 p.m. He invited Rev. Fran Peel to share a prayer, and then he led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. The Chairman explained that Commissioner Ross had an excused absence due to holiday travel.

ITEM 1 - OPENING REMARKS - CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE

- 4. Process all and, when required, investigate complaints of discrimination consistent with the procedures contained within this Plan. Log all complaints for the administrative record.
- 5. Collect statistical data (race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability) on participants in, and beneficiaries of, programs and activities carried out by the organization.
- 6. Participate in training offered on Title VI and other nondiscrimination requirements. Conduct or request training for employees or the organization's sub recipients.
- 7. Take affirmative action, if reviewed or investigated by NCDOT, to correct any deficiencies found within a reasonable time period, not to exceed 90 calendar days, unless reasonable provisions are granted by NCDOT.
- 8. Document all Title VI nondiscrimination-related activities as evidence of compliance. Submit information and reports to NCDOT on a schedule outlined by NCDOT.

INTRODUCTION

DECISION MAKING PROCESS

The Dare County Board of Commissioners (BOC) is the governing board for Dare County Transportation and makes the final decisions on adopting program documents. The seven member board vote at one of the one or two monthly meetings on the first Monday or Third Monday of the month. Permission is granted to be on the agenda. Various Plans/Policies/documents are required to be adopted by the Board of Commissioners. Dare County Local Coordinated Plan (LCP) must be approved every four years, the Substance Abuse Policy (amended as needed), System Safety Program Plan (SSPP) yearly, Title VI Plan amended as needed or every 3 years. The Board of Commissioners approves by vote. A Resolution granting permission for Dare County to apply and receive the annual CTP funds must be passed by the BOC.

Any documents that do not need the commissioners' approval will be brought before the thirteen members Dare County Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) at a quarterly meeting. Members of the Advisory Board are appointed by the Board of Commissioners and serve a three year term. The Board of Commissioners and TAB must approve any rate changes.

Title VI and Related Authorities

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. Section 2000d) provides that, "No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance." The 1987 Civil Rights Restoration Act (P.L. 100-259) clarified and restored the original intent of Title VI by expanding the definition of "programs and activities" to include all programs and activities of federal-aid recipients (such as, Wilson County Transportation Services), sub recipients, and contractors, whether such programs and activities are federally-assisted or not.

EXTERNAL DISCRIMINATION COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

These discrimination complaint procedures describe the process used by DCTS to process and investigate complaints of alleged discrimination filed under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related nondiscrimination laws that are applicable to programs, services, and activities carried out by Wilson County Transportation Services.

Complaints will be investigated by the appropriate authority. Upon completion of every investigation, Wilson County Transportation Services will inform the complainant of all avenues of appeal. Wilson County Transportation Services will make every effort to obtain early resolution of complaints at the lowest level possible. The option of informal mediation between the affected parties and DCTS staff may be utilized for resolution.

FILING OF COMPLAINTS

- 1. **Applicability** The complaint procedures apply to the beneficiaries of Wilson County Transportation Services programs, activities, and services, such as the members of the public and any consultants/contractors hired by Wilson County Transportation Services.
- 2. Eligibility Any person or class of persons who believes that he/she has been subjected to discrimination or retaliation prohibited by any of the Civil Rights authorities based upon race, color, sex, age, national origin, creed (religion), or disability, may file a written complaint with Wilson County Transportation Services. The law prohibits intimidation or retaliation of any sort. The complaint may be filed by the affected individual or a representative, and must be in writing.
- 3. Time Limits and Filing Options A complaint must be filed no later than 180 calendar days after the following:
 - The date of the alleged act of discrimination; or
 - > The date when the person(s) became aware of the alleged discrimination; or
 - Where there has been a continuing course of conduct, the date on which that conduct was discontinued or the latest instance of the conduct.

Complaints will be accepted in other languages, including Braille.
- **5. Discrimination Complaint Form –** The Discrimination Complaint Form is consistent with the Nondiscrimination Assurance in Group 01.D of the FTA Certifications & Assurances.

6. Complaint Basis – Allegations must be based on issues involving race, color, national origin, sex, creed (religion,), age, or disability. The term "basis" refers to the complainant's membership in a protected group category.

Complaint Processing

- 1. When a complaint is received by DCTS, a written acknowledgment and a Consent Release form will be mailed to the complainant within ten (10) business days by registered mail.
- 2. DCTS cannot investigate Title VI complaints filed against itself, but can investigate ADA complaints against itself. DCTS will consult with the NCDOT External Civil Rights Section to determine the acceptability and jurisdiction of all complaints received. (Note: If NCDOT has jurisdiction, the External Civil Rights Section will be responsible for the remainder of this process. DCTS will record the transfer of responsibility in its complaints log).
- 3. Additional information will be requested if the complaint is incomplete. The complainant will be provided 15 business days to submit any requested information and the signed Consent Release form. Failure to do so may be considered good cause for a determination of no investigative merit.
- 4. Upon receipt of the requested information and determination of jurisdiction, DCTS will notify the complainant and respondent of whether the complaint has sufficient merit to warrant investigation.
- 5. If the complaint is investigated, the notification shall state the grounds of the DCTS's jurisdiction, while informing the parties that their full cooperation will be required in gathering additional information and assisting the investigator.
- 6. If the complaint does not warrant investigation, the notification to the complainant shall specifically state the reason for the decision.

Complaint Log

- 1. When a complaint is received by DCTS, the complaint will be entered into the Discrimination Complaints Log with other pertinent information, and assigned a **Case Number**. (Note: All complaints must be logged).
- 2. The complaints log will be submitted to the NCDOT's Civil Rights office during Title VI compliance reviews. (Note: NCDOT may also be request the complaints log during pre-grant approval processes).
- 3. The Log Year(s) since the last submittal will be entered (e.g., 2012-2015, 2014-2015, FFY 2015, or 2015) and the complaints log will be signed before submitting the log to NCDOT.
- 4. When reporting **no complaints**, check the **No Complaints or Lawsuits** box and sign the log.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

INTRODUCTION

Effective public involvement is a key element in addressing Title VI in decision-making. Recipients engaged in planning and other decision-making activities must have a documented public participation process that provides adequate notice of public participation activities, and early and continuous opportunities for public review and comment at key decision points. Underlying these efforts is our commitment to determining the most effective outreach methods for a given project or population.

This **Public Participation Plan** describes how the Organization Name will disseminate vital agency information and engage the public by seeking out and considering the needs and input of interested parties and those traditionally underserved by existing transportation systems, such as minority and limited English proficient persons, who may face challenges accessing programs and other services. General public involvement practices will include:

- Scheduling meetings at times and locations that are convenient and accessible for minority and LEP communities.
- Employing different meeting sizes and formats.
- Coordinating with community- and faith-based organizations, educational institutions, and other entities to implement public engagement strategies that reach out specifically to members of affected minority and/or LEP communities.
- Providing opportunities for public participation through means other than written communication, such as personal
 interviews or use of audio or video recording devices to capture oral comments.
- Considering radio, television, or newspaper ads on stations and in publications that serve LEP populations. Outreach to LEP persons could also include audio programming available on podcasts.

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION

Passengers and other interested persons will be informed of their rights under Title VI and related authorities with regard to our program. The primary means of achieving this will be posting and disseminating the policy statement and notice as stipulated in Sections 3.0 and 4.0, respectively. Additional measures may include openly stating our obligations and the public's rights at meetings, placing flyers at places frequented by targeted populations, and an equal opportunity tag-on at the end of radio announcements. The method of notification will be determined through an initial screening of the area.

DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION

Information on Title VI and other programs will be crafted and disseminated to employees, contractors and sub recipients, stakeholders, and the general public. Public dissemination efforts may vary depending on factors present, but will generally include: posting public statements setting forth our nondiscrimination policy in eye-catching designs and locations; placing brochures in public places, such as government offices, transit facilities, and libraries; having nondiscrimination language within contracts; including nondiscrimination notices in meeting announcements and handouts; and displaying our Notice of Nondiscrimination at all our public meetings.

At a minimum, nondiscrimination information will be disseminated on our website and on posters in conspicuous areas at our office(s). Project-related information and our most current Title VI-related information will be maintained online.

MEETINGS AND OUTREACH

There is no one-size-fits-all approach to public involvement. A variety of comprehensive and targeted public participation methods will be used to facilitate meaningful public involvement. Methods for engaging stakeholders and target audiences, including traditionally underserved and excluded populations (i.e., minorities, youth, low-income, the disabled, etc.) will include the following:

Public Relations and Outreach

Public relations and outreach (PRO) strategies aim to conduct well-planned, inclusive and meaningful public participation events that foster good relations and mutual trust through shared decision-making with the communities we serve.

- We will seek out and facilitate the involvement of those potentially affected.
- Public events will aim to be collaborative, fun, and educational for all, rather than confrontational and prescriptive.
- Media plans will typically involve multiple channels of communication like mailings, radio, TV, and newspaper ads.
- Abstract objectives will be avoided in meeting announcements. Specific "attention-grabbing" reasons to attend will be
 used, such as "Help us figure out how to relieve congestion on [corridor name]" or "How much should it cost to ride the
 bus? Let us know on [date]."
- Efforts will be made to show how the input of participants can, or did, influence final decisions.
- We will do our best to form decision-making committees that look like and relate to the populations we serve.
- We will seek out and identify community contacts and partner with local community- and faith-based organizations that can represent, and help us disseminate information to, target constituencies.
- Demographic data will be requested during public meetings, surveys, and from community contacts and committee members.

Public Meetings

"Public meeting" refers to any meeting open to the public, such as hearings, charrettes, open house and board meetings.

- Public meetings will be conducted at times, locations, and facilities that are convenient and accessible.
- Meeting materials will be available in a variety of predetermined formats to serve diverse audiences.
- An assortment of advertising means may be employed to inform the community of public meetings.
- Assistance to persons with disabilities or limited English proficiency will be provided, as required.

Small Group Meetings

A small group meeting is a targeted measure where a meeting is held with a specific group, usually at their request or consent. These are often closed meetings, as they will typically occur on private property at the owner's request.

- If it is determined that a targeted group has not been afforded adequate opportunities to participate, the group will be contacted to inquire about possible participation methods, including a group meeting with them individually.
- Unless unusual circumstances or safety concerns exist, hold the meeting at a location of the target group's choosing.
- Share facilitation duties or relinquish them to members of the target group.
- Small group discussion formats may be integrated into larger group public meetings and workshops. When this occurs, the smaller groups will be as diverse as the participants in the room.

Community Surveying

- Opinion surveys will occasionally be used to obtain input from targeted groups or the general public on their transportation needs, the quality or costs of our services, and feedback on our public outreach efforts.
- Surveys may be conducted via telephone, door-to-door canvassing, at community fairs, by placing drop boxes in ideal locations, or with assistance from other local agencies like social services.

Documented Public Outreach

The direct public outreach and involvement activities conducted by DCTS are summarized in the table below. Efforts include *meetings*, *surveys*, *focus groups*, *etc*.

Information pertinent to each event and/or activity will be provided to NCDOT upon request. Examples include copies of: meeting announcements, agendas, posters, attendee list, etc.

Language Assistance Plan

Plan Components

As a recipient of federal US DOT funding, **DCTS** is required to take reasonable steps to ensure meaningful access to our programs and activities by limited-English proficient (LEP) persons.

Limited English Proficient (LEP): Refers to persons for whom English is not their primary language and who have a limited ability to read, write, speak or understand English. This includes those who have reported to the U.S. Census that they speak English less than very well, not well, or not at all.

DCTS's Language Assistance Plan includes the following elements:

- 1. The results of the Four Factor Analysis, including a description of the LEP population(s), served.
- 2. A description of how language assistance services are provided by language
- 3. A description of how LEP persons are informed of the availability of language assistance service
- 4. A description of how the language assistance plan is monitored and updated
- 5. A description of how employees are trained to provide language assistance to LEP persons
- 6. Additional information deemed necessary

Methodology

To determine if an individual is entitled to language assistance and what specific services are appropriate, **DCTS'** has conducted a Four Factor Analysis¹ of the following areas: 1) Demography, 2) Frequency, 3) Importance and 4) Resources and Costs.

LEP Four Factor Analysis

Factor 1 – Demography:

The Dare County Transportation System does not contract with a transit provider to provide transportation service for the Dare County Transportation System and in Dare County.

The US Census Bureau – American Fact Finder (2008-2012) reports there are numerous languages spoken in USA County. Some of these languages include Spanish, German, Russian, Japanese, Hmong, and Vietnamese. After English, the second largest language group is Spanish.

The Safe Harbor Threshold is calculated by dividing the population estimate for a language group that "speaks English less then very well" by the total population of the county. The LEP Safe Harbor Threshold provision stipulates that for each LEP group that meets the LEP language threshold (5% or 1,000 individuals, whichever is less), the Dare County Transportation System must provide translation of vital documents in written format for non-English speaking persons.

According to US Census Bureau American Fact Finder data for 2013, the Dare County population estimate is **32,549**, according to the US Census Bureau Language Mapper Tool 2011 data, approximately **965** (with a +/-320) Spanish speaking persons have identified themselves as "Speak English less than very well". According to the US Census, due to the possibility of 1,285 person (965 with a +/-320) DCTS passes the Safe Harbor Threshold of the 5% **or** 1,000 person. This means Dare County Transportation System is required to provide written translation of vital documents. All of the other language groups listed above are also below the safe harbor threshold. This means, at this time, Dare County Transportation System is also not required to provide written translation of vital documents in these languages.

Factor 2 - Frequency:

Dare County Transportation System (and its contractor/lessee, if relevant) will be trained on what to do when they encounter a person that speaks English less than well. Dare County Transportation System and/or its contractor/lessee will track the number of encounters and consider making adjustments as needed to its outreach efforts to ensure meaningful access to all persons and specifically to LEP and minority populations of the Dare County Transportation System's programs and services. Dare County Transportation will begin to log all incoming LEP calls.

The Dare County Transportation System provides rides to many persons each year. While formal data has not been collected, the system has indicated it has encountered (0) zero LEP persons using the service within the last six months.

The Dare County Transportation System has an open door policy and will provide rides to any person who requests a ride. If an individual has speech limitations, the dispatcher or driver will work with the Dare County Spanish Interpreter and or Transportation Director and the Dare County Transportation System, if needed to ensure the individual receives access to the transportation service.

Dare County Transportation will annually distribute a questionnaire printed in English and Spanish languages in an attempt to assist in determining assessment? The following questions will be asked:

- What means of Dare County Transportation System's services do you often use?
- How often a week are you utilizing these services?

Factor 3 – Importance

The Dare County Transportation System understands an LEP person with language barrier challenges also faces difficulties obtaining health care, education or access to employment. A transportation system is a key link to connecting LEP persons to these essential services.

The Dare County Transportation System's assessment of what programs, activities and services that are most critical included contact with community organization(s) that serve LEP persons, as well as contact with LEP persons themselves to obtain information on the importance of the modes or the types of services that are provided to the LEP populations.

Dare County Transportation will annually distribute a questionnaire printed in English and Spanish languages in an attempt to assist in determining assessment? The following questions will be asked:

- Is Dare County Transportation services important to you?
- If so for which destination? Ex. (employment, shopping, medical appointments, social activities)

Factor 4 – Resources and Costs

Even though the Dare County Transportation System does not have a separate budget for LEP outreach, it will work to implement low cost methods of reaching LEP populations meeting the Safe Harbor threshold. For example, the Dare County Transportation System will contract a LEP speaking person as needed to translate information to LEP persons meeting the Safe Harbor threshold. In addition, the Dare County Transportation System and our contractor/transit provider work with local advocacy groups to reach LEP populations.

Dare County has an F/T Spanish Interpreter who is available to assist with LEP outreach. There is no associated cost for this service to Dare County Transportation Interpretation Services

In the event that Dare County Transportation does not have an Interpreter available DCTS will utilize the services of Language Line Personal Interpreter. To access these services you will dial 1-888-808-9008, the system will then ask for your 8-digit Pin Number (88183613). Using the supplied Language Identification Desktop Poster, you will attempt to identify the language which will require Interpreter Services.

Item # 2 – Description of how Language Assistance Services are Provided, by Language

DCTS does not have a Spanish speaking person on staff but does have a volunteer on call when needed. This has ensured **DCTS** can provide assistance to LEP Spanish-speaking persons, if needed.

Agency staff will be provided a list of referral resources that can assist LEP persons with written translation and oral interpretation, including the Title VI Coordinator and any outside consultant contracted to provide language services. This list will be updated as needed, to remain current.

Training: All employees will be instructed on our procedures for providing timely and reasonable assistance to LEP persons. New employee orientation will also explain these procedures to new hires. Staff routinely encountering LEP persons by telephone or in person will receive annual refresher training. All other employees will be reminded of LEP requirements through annual Title VI program acknowledgements (Section 5.0) and basic Title VI trainings (Section 11.0).

Item #3 - Description of how LEP Persons are Informed of the Availability of Language Assistance Service

DCTS will do the following to inform LEP persons of the availability of language assistance services: provide pictograms and other symbols in relevant published materials, strived to employ multilingual staff when the need is sufficient, and create and post multi-language announcements, posters and other information.

Item #4 – Description of how the Language Assistance Plan is Monitored and Updated

DCTS reviews its plan on an annual basis or more frequently as needed. In particular, **DCTS** will evaluate the information collected during encounters with LEP persons, as well as public outreach efforts, to determine if adjustments should be made to the delivering of programs and services to ensure meaningful access to minority and LEP persons.

Item # 5 - Description of how Employees are Trained to Provide Language Assistance to LEP Persons

DCTS employees are oriented on the principles of Title VI and **DCTS**' Language Assistance Plan. New employees will be provided guidance on the needs of clients served and how best to meet their needs. **See Appendix A**

An important discussion point is that of language assistance. If a driver, dispatcher or employee needs further assistance related to LEP program participants, he/she will work with **DCTS** Title VI Coordinator to identify strategies to meet the language needs of the participants of the program or service. Also, annual training/retraining in non-discrimination will be provided, along with DCTS Policy and proper procedures for handling a complaint.
