RESOLUTION SUPPORTING SOUTHERN SHORES CIVIC ASSOCIATION REQUEST FOR WATER SAMPLING AND REMEDIATION

WHEREAS, the Southern Shores Civic Association (SSCA) is a non-profit, non-commercial organization dedicated to promoting the interests and welfare of its members and of the property owners and residents within the Town of Southern Shores; and

WHEREAS, membership in the SSCA represents approximately 1,800 households; and

WHEREAS, the SSCA retains ownership of numerous common properties including marinas, park areas, and accesses to the ocean and the Currituck Sound/Ginguite Bay, and maintains them as a community resource; and

WHEREAS, one of the SSCA properties, Soundview Park located on North Dogwood Trail, is designated as a picnic and wading area; and

WHEREAS, from 1998 until 2010 the North Carolina Division of Marine Fisheries (NCDMF) provided seasonal weekly water quality testing of bacteria levels in the Currituck Sound at the Soundview Park site; and

WHEREAS, after testing was stopped by NCDMF, the SSCA began re-testing in July 2016 after concerns were raised regarding the health and welfare of its residents and visitors and unsafe enterococci levels were measured during four out of six months; and

WHEREAS, the SSCA has posted signs that swimming and wading are not recommended and although Soundview Park is private property, the waters are a public trust that should be tested in view of the continued high level of bacteria; and

WHEREAS, the SSCA has asked the North Carolina General Assembly to provide the funds necessary for the NCDMF to again sample and analyze the bacteria levels in the Currituck Sound at Soundview Park and for the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) to assist in the remediation of the water quality issue.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Dare County Board of Commissioners supports the request of the SSSCA that, as a matter of public safety, the North Carolina General Assembly provide the funds necessary for the NCDMF to again sample and analyze the bacteria levels in the Currituck Sound at Soundview Park and for the NCDEQ to assist in the remediation of the water quality issue.

As the NC Senate budget deadline draws near, the Southern Shores Civic Association (SSCA) is again urgently requesting that the N.C. General Assembly provide the funds needed by the NC Division of Marine Fisheries to again sample and analyze our coastal waters to ensure they are safe for wading, swimming and shellfishing. We understand that the Division will need to open and staff a laboratory in northeastern N.C. to be able to perform this work. The SSCA also requests that the N.C. Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) help with determining the root cause for the high levels of enterococci at our wading beach and assist in remediating this issue.

The SSCA is a non-profit, non-commercial organization dedicated to promoting the interests and welfare of its members and of the property owners and residents within Southern Shores. The SSCA membership includes approximately 1,800 households. The SSCA retains ownership of numerous common properties, including marinas, park areas, and accesses to the ocean and the Currituck Sound/Ginguite Bay, and continues to maintain and improve them as a community resource.

One of the SSCA properties, Soundview Park located on N. Dogwood Trail, is designated as a picnic and wading area. From October 2002 until December 2010, the NC Division of Marine Fisheries provided weekly water quality testing of enterococci levels of the Currituck Sound at this site. Despite consistent unsafe levels of enterococci, testing was stopped. In July 2016, the SSCA began re-testing after concerns from Board members were raised regarding the health and welfare of our residents and our numerous seasonal visitors. Monthly results have ranged from enterococci readings of 12 to >2419 (standard <104) with four out of the six months at unsafe levels. The SSCA Board is very concerned for the health of the many families (especially the small children) that wade in that area and has posted signs that swimming and wading are not recommended. Although the "beach" at Soundview Park is considered a private property of the SSCA, the waters are public trust and should be tested – especially with the continued high levels of bacteria present. The SSCA has reached out to the North Carolina Coastal Federation and Dare Soil and Water Conservation District to help us investigate root causes and implement Best Management Practices.

Kings Point Oysters LLC Conditional Use Permit

Spurgeon and Katherine Stowe d/b/a Kings Point Oysters have submitted a conditional use permit to operate a fish house at 57193 Olen's Lane in Hatteras, NC. The site is zoned R2-AH and fish houses are permitted as conditional uses in this district. A staff report, draft CUP, site plan and other documents regarding this CUP application are attached with this cover sheet.

STAFF REPORT: June 5, 2017 Dare County Board of Commissioners Meeting

ITEM: Kings Point Oysters LLC Conditional Use Permit

FROM: Donna Creef, Planning Director

Spurgeon and Katherine Stowe have applied for a conditional use permit to operate a fish house at 57193 Olens Lane in Hatteras, NC. The site is zoned R2-AH and fish houses are permitted as conditional uses in this district. There is an existing structure on the site which will be modified to function as a fish house for the processing of oysters. The property is adjacent to Slash Creek and there is an existing dock at the site. The CUP process provides an opportunity for Dare County to impose reasonable and appropriate conditions upon the permit. Quasijudicial procedures shall be followed by the Board of Commissioners in deciding conditional use permits. The applicant has the burden of presenting sufficient evidence demonstrating the CUP application meets the requirements of the Dare County Zoning Ordinance.

The Planning Board reviewed this proposed CUP at their May 8, 2017 meeting. Based on information provided by Mr. and Mrs. Stowe, the draft CUP attached with this staff report was prepared to address the operation of the site. These conditions include the limitation on the processing of oysters only and no other seafood at the site. Other conditions address the hours of operation, pick-up and delivery of goods, lighting improvements, signage, and others as detailed in the draft CUP. The Stowes have reviewed the set of conditions as recommended by the Planning Board and a signed acknowledgment of the conditions will be submitted as part of the CUP file. Other conditions may be added to the draft CUP, if needed, as a result of the June 5 Commissioners review.

The property was posted and letters mailed to the adjoining property owners. We have been contacted by some of the adjoining property owners opposed to the proposed use of the property. Copies of the emails sent during the Planning Board review of the item are attached with my comments. The adjoining property owners were also notified of the Board of Commissioners meeting as required by the Zoning Ordinance.

As noted previously, the R2-AH zoning allows fish houses as conditional uses and such uses must be granted approval by the Board of Commissioners with reasonable and appropriate conditions applied to the proposal to address impacts of the use. A draft motion for the Board's consideration is included should it be the consensus of the Board that the Stowes have presented sufficient evidence and testimony to support the approval of the conditional use permit application.

Draft motions for the Board's consideration.

<u>Draft motion for granting of CUP:</u> "I move that the conditional use permit and site plan for the proposed Kings Point Oysters LLC oyster processing facility be approved. Sufficient information documenting compliance with the R2-AH zoning requirements has been submitted by the applicants and reasonable and appropriate conditions have been identified and applied to the proposed facility."

Should it be the consensus of the Board that additional information is needed before any action is taken on the conditional use permit application, then a motion to defer action until a later date is appropriate.

<u>Draft motion to defer action pending additional information:</u> "I move that the Kings Point Oysters conditional use permit be tabled until (insert reason for tabling). Once this information is submitted, staff can re-schedule the item for consideration as needed."



Conditional Use Permit No.4--2017

Dare County Sections: 22-22.4, and 22-68.

Application of: Spurgeon and Katherine Stowe d/b/a Kings Point Oysters

On June 5, 2017 the Dare County Board of Commissioners considered the application of the Petitioner above named which application is on file with the Dare County Planning Department, and the Board finds as follows:

- 1. That the written application of Petitioner with attachments has been duly submitted to the Dare County Planning Board as required by Section 22 of the Dare County Code (hereinafter referred to as "Code");
- 2. The subject property is zoned R2-AH (alternative medium density residential) and located at 57193 Olens Lane in Hatteras, NC. This property is identified on the Dare County tax records as parcel and located in the Hatteras tax district.
- 3. That the application substantially complies with the requirements of the Code in that it requests uses permitted by conditional use permit under the Code, including fish houses and dockage;
- 4. That the Dare County Planning Board recommended for approval the granting of this Conditional Use Permit as requested. The Planning Board made this recommendation on May8, 2017.
- 5. That the Dare County Board of Commissioners is empowered under sections of the Code set out above to grant uses such as allowed herein and insofar as the conditional use is hereinafter allowed it will not adversely affect the public interest;
- 6. That the hereinafter described conditional use is deemed to be reasonable and is not in degradation of the intent of the ordinance.
- 7. That upon the evidence received, the testimony presented, and the submitted written record, there are sufficient facts to support the issuance of this Conditional Use Permit according to the terms and conditions below:


NOW, THEREFORE, under the provisions of the Code, the following conditional use is granted to Spurgeon and Katherine Stowe d/b/a Kings Point Oysters LLC for a fish house and dockage at 57193 Olens Lane as depicted on a site plan labelled as Appendix B and subject to such conditions as are hereinafter set out:

CONDITIONAL USE: An existing structure shall be modified for use as a fish house to process oysters and store associated equipment used in the oyster processing and dock facilities.

CONDITIONS:

- 1. The facility shall be used for processing and bagging of oysters farmed by Kings Point Oysters LLC from leased areas of the Pamlico Sound. There shall be no processing of fish, crabs, shrimp, clams or other seafood products at the site. Oysters shall be washed down on boats and then bagged and tagged at the facility for delivery to market.
- 2. There shall be no on-site retail sales of oysters at the property.
- 3. Hours of operation at the site shall be from sunrise to sunset Sunday to Sunday. No after dark (sunset) unloading of boats or processing of oysters shall occur at the facility.
- 4. No more than five persons, in addition to the applicants, shall be employed by Kings Point Oysters.
- 5. No signage for the business shall be posted at the site
- 6. There shall be no deliveries of supplies used by the business or pick-up of products from the site by tractor trailer trucks. Only single axle box-style trucks or pick-up trucks shall be used for transporting oysters from the site for market delivery.
- 7. No refrigerator units or walk-in coolers shall be located outside of the structure. All refrigeration of the oysters shall occur inside the structure.
- 8. A maximum of three boats shall be docked at the site. These boats shall not exceed 30' in length.
- 9. Light fixtures may be installed on the building and shall be designed as cut-off fixtures and/or motion sensors style fixtures. Low-level wattage light fixtures may be attached to the dock to provide for safe passage and security.
- 10. Wetlands on the site shall be delineated on a site plan and parking improvements at the site shall not encroach into any delineated wetland area.
- 11. Other conditions that may be identified during DCBC review.

12. All other terms and provisions of the force and effect except as herein specific	ne Dare County Zoning Ordinance shall remain in full cifically permitted otherwise;

We are homeowners on Kohler Dr in Hatteras Village, we have owned our property for 18 years. We are aware of a proposed conditional use unit for parcel 015434000 in Hatteras Village, Kohler Dr.

We strongly state our opposition to the parcel above being able to operate as a business in our residential neighborhood. The neighborhood is a quiet, peaceful area with almost all the homes being single family houses lived in full time. The area is coveted as a safe place for our children, grandchildren and elderly able to walk the streets, ride their bikes or walk their dogs. These properties are residential and we do not want to change that. This street has been in place since the late 1800's and it is quiet and safe.

There is no need for another fish house, Back Creek has 2 fish houses with dredged waterways, fueling facilities and waterfront commercial sites. Back Creek is not on Kohler Drive but tucked off the main thruway and not affecting our residential properties.

There is no interest whatsoever in having a business placed in the middle of our quiet residential street. Please decline this application.

In response to the letter dated April 25th, referencing parcel number 015434000, I would like to voice my apprehensions and objections concerning the issuance of a conditional use for the proposed fish house. The parcel is located in a quiet residential neighborhood that has limited safe access. With the tight confines and narrow access road, I'm certain that a fish truck would not be able to enter the property without interfering with adjacent property owners. This parcel has been a personal residence since the 1800's and is not suitable for this type of commercial application and if approved would have negative consequences to the environment. Slash Creek is a pristine waterway that attracts a lot of eco-tourists interested in non-motorized water activities. The additional boat traffic to the fish house will cause a reduction in these activities, causing additional loss to the already suffering Hatteras Village economy. In addition, the property abuts my primary residence and the noise and light pollution would interfere with day-to-day life. Large refrigeration, large trucks and the potential for 24 hours of operation are not acceptable and will be damaging to the property values on Kohler Road. As an 88 year old native of Hatteras Island, I understand the value of commercial fishing, I support commercial fishing, but I think there are better locations for a fish house. I'm confident that Mr. Stowe could find alternative sites, or alternative methods to offload their catches that would be suitable for everyone in Hatteras Village. I urge each member of the planning board to deny the conditional use permit for parcel number 015434000.

I have received a copy of your letter to Richard Midgett concerning the conditional use permit application for parcel 015434000 in Hatteras Village, Kohler Drive. As Richard's adjoining neighbor and owner of 57187 Water Oak Dr., a property in clear view of sight of this proposed change, I am extremely concerned and opposed.

This is a residential neighborhood. I am a full time resident and very concerned about the added traffic, noise and smell that a neighboring fish house would engender. Kohler is very narrow and not suitable to truck traffic. Slash Creek is very shallow and much used by kayakers. One of my great pleasures is watching the colorful kayaks paddle by and noting the various bird and wildlife that frequent my "piece" of the Slash. Increased boat traffic would put these in jeopardy.

I purchased and improved this property due to the quietness and peaceful surroundings. Rezoning this parcel not only destroys what I have now, but opens it up to whatever could follow a fish house. I am surrounded by wetlands and am wary of what this change could do to the tides and storm flooding.

Let me state again that I am opposed to this change. I moved 1500 miles to relocate to Hatteras Village and make it my home. I have invested considerable amounts of time and money in my properties to make them enjoyable. I would hate to see that disappear.

Mr. Spurgeon Stowe has submitted a conditional use permit to the Dare Co. Planning Board for a conditional use permit for a fish house on parcel 015434000, in Hatteras Village, in a residential neighborhood. I am aware that R2-AH zoning allows a fish house at this site (line #9).

I have deep very negative concerns about this project. This will be on Slash Creek. There will be a major environmental impact to the ecosystem. This narrow pristine creek meanders throughout Hatteras village affecting many homeowners. In most places it is only 50-100 feet wide and 1-3 feet deep. At this time there is no commercial enterprise on the creek except for one at Teaches Lair Marina @ the other end of the creek, several miles away, where there is deep water and direct access to the Pamlico Sound. This project will change the whole atmosphere of the neighborhood. Fish houses sometimes are a 24 hour operation.

Other concerns—ingress/egress off Kohler Drive onto the 10" dirt path to the property, commercial refrigerated trucks and the number per day/night, volume of trucks, docks for boats, and the septic, and wetlands surrounding the property. Most wholesale places also turn into retail.

I live on the opposite side of this creek at 57176 Islington Court, full time.


I am in receipt of your letter concerning a proposed conditional use permit application for parcel 015434000 in Hatteras Village, Kohler Drive.

First I would like to state my opposition as this parcel is in a residential neighborhood of mostly year round residences, a quiet, peaceful area with an abundance of kids playing, bike riders, joggers, walkers, golf carts. This property has been a residence since late 1800's or early 1900', s as the residence existing is the second house on this parcel.

Item Summary: Series 2017 Water Revenue Refunding Bonds

The County's financing team has decided to move forward with the issuance of refunding (refinancing) water revenue bonds. The Local Government Commission's approval from 10/4/2016 is good for one year and the LGC has approved moving forward with a sale date of June 7 (and a back-up date of June 14).

Last September and October the Board approved all documents for the sale of the Series 2016 (since changed to S2017) Water Revenue Refunding Bonds and the Local Government Commission approved the issue.

The sale was delayed from 10/24/2016 due to deteriorating savings levels and growing negative arbitrage. Those numbers continued to deteriorate with December and January long-term interest rate movements against the refunding. The Board reversed and eliminated the originally adopted budget amendment for the sale in March.

Since that time there was a Federal Reserve overnight funds rate increase, helping escrow earnings, and in May there has been a "flight to quality" to municipal bonds, raising bond prices and therefore lowering yields/rates. Escrow earnings have increased from 0.90% in September to a current 1.51%. The true interest cost for the bonds has decreased from 3.49% in January to a current 3.38%.

The history of the benchmarks the County uses to evaluate refunding is shown on the second attachment. Gross savings are up to \$1.58 million, net present value savings are up to \$1.2 million and negative arbitrage is down to 63%. The County's financial advisor (DEC & Associates), underwriter (Piper Jaffray), and Finance Director all recommend proceeding with the refunding. While all refunding targets are not met, we feel that another opportunity to achieve these savings may not occur.

The team's targets are to have the preliminary offering statement updated and released by May 26 and have the Standard & Poor's rating updated and release by May 31.

A budget amendment for the sale is attached along with the preliminary numbers. The Board is requested to adopt the budget amendment.

Chairman Woodard called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m. He invited Rev. Phillip Glick from Saint Andrews By-the-Sea Episcopal Church to share a prayer, and then he led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

ITEM 1 - OPENING REMARKS - CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE

Chairman Woodard mentioned the following items during his opening remarks -

- Commented on the funeral service that was recently held for the Mother of Arty Tillett and asked everyone to keep the family in their thoughts and prayers.
- Gave an update on the resumed dredging of Hatteras Inlet.
- Encouraged everyone to attend Dare Day on June 3.
- Said contractors are mobilizing for beach nourishment projects throughout the County.
- Congratulated the Colington Fire Department on achieving an outstanding "3" rating.
- Outlined several positive items contained in the Senate's version of the State budget.

ITEM 2 - PUBLIC COMMENTS

The Manager outlined the procedure for making public comments in Manteo and via the video link to the Fessenden Center in Buxton. There were no public comments.

ITEM 3 – REQUEST TO NAME SKYCO COMMUNITY WALKWAY IN HONOR OF MARSHALL AND GUSSIE COLLINS (Att. #1)

Joan Collins, a descendant of Marshall & Gussie Collins, asked the Board to consider honoring Marshall and Gussie Collins by naming the new Skyco community walkway in their honor. She shared excerpts of a published article by David Stick describing the impact that this remarkable African-American couple has had on the community. The walkway, which extends from the Visitors Center to Toler Road and picks up again at Skyco Road, is located on land that was previously owned by Marshall & Gussie Collins.

MOTION

Vice Chairman Overman motioned to name the Skyco community walkway as "The Marshall and Gussie Collins Walkway" with a plaque to be placed at the entryway providing information about Marshall and Gussie Collins to benefit future generations. Commissioner Shea seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 4 - POLICY FOR NAMING OF DARE COUNTY BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES

Mr. Outten reviewed a draft policy for the naming of County facilities, which was first presented at a previous meeting. He asked for Commissioner input to determine several blank spaces in the draft policy and the Board reached the following consensus –

- Individuals or groups can be nominated.
- Must be a full-time Dare County resident for a minimum of 20 years.
- If deceased, must have been a full-time County resident for a minimum of 20 years.
- No pending felony criminal charges or have been found guilty of any felony criminal act.
- Any action to approve shall be by a 5/7 vote of the Board of Commissioners.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the draft policy with language inserted into the blank spaces to reflect the consensus of the Board as outlined to the County Manager. Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 5 – APPROVAL OF CHICAMACOMICO BANKS FIRE DEPARTMENT SERVICE CONTRACT (Att. #2)

Dare County Fire Marshal Steve Kovacs noted that the Chicamacomico Banks Fire Department and the Salvo Volunteer Fire Department have been working on a merger and he presented a contract between the Chicamacomico Banks Fire Department (CBFD) and the County of Dare for the CBFD to provide service to the Village of Salvo.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the contract.

Commissioner Shea seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 6 – APPROVAL OF NEW CHICAMACOMICO BANKS FIRE INSURANCE DISTRICT (Att. #3)

Fire Marshal Kovacs summarized the boundary lines of a new Fire Insurance District that combines the existing Salvo and Chicamacomico Banks Fire Insurance Districts into one new Fire Insurance District reflecting the merger of the two fire departments.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the resolution for the new Chicamacomico Banks Fire Insurance District in accordance with the description and map as presented. Commissioner Shea seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 7 – INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT – SOUTHERN SHORES BEACH NOURISHMENT PROJECT (Att. #4)

Mr. Outten presented an Interlocal Agreement with the Town of Southern Shores outlining the Town's agreement with the County concerning the Town's beach nourishment project. He explained that the Southern Shores agreement has the same provisions as the beach nourishment agreements that are in place with other Dare County municipalities.

MOTION

Vice Chairman Overman motioned to approve the Southern Shores Interlocal Agreement. Commissioner Shea seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

The Board also took action on the following motions related to all the beach nourishment projects that are now underway in Dare County –

MOTION

Commissioner Shea motioned to authorize any Budget Amendments, Budget Ordinances, or financing documents that may be needed for any of the beach nourishment projects. Commissioner House seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

MOTION

Commissioner Shea motioned to authorize any ongoing change orders that may be needed for any of the beach nourishment projects without changing the budgeted amounts Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 8 – DOG TETHERING ORDINANCE (Att. #5)

Commissioner Ross engaged the Board in a discussion of a dog tethering ordinance that was prepared in response to an issue raised by a concerned citizen. John Graves, Director of the Outer Banks SPCA, applauded the ordinance saying it was incredibly well written. He noted that some dog owners face financial challenges and requested \$3,000 to help the SPCA bring dog owners into compliance. In discussing the ordinance,

Commissioner Ross indicated that a few grammatical changes were needed and the Board concurred in making the following modifications – Section (B)(3) to read: "The tether shall be connected to the dog by a body harness made of nylon or leather, not less than one inch in width and where the weight of the tethering device and the collar cannot exceed ten percent of the dog's body weight." Section (C) to read: "A chain or rope is acceptable in the place of a leash when walking a dog as long as the dog has an appropriate collar or harness." The County Manager clarified that this ordinance is for the purpose of addressing the tethering of dogs and it is not a leash law.

MOTION

Commissioner Tobin motioned to approve the dog tethering ordinance with the modifications that were outlined.

Commissioner Shea seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 9 - CONSENT AGENDA

The Manager announced the items as they were visually displayed in the meeting room. **MOTION**

Commissioner Shea and Commissioner Couch motioned to approve the Consent Agenda:

- 1) Approval of Minutes (May 1, 2017 & Budget Workshops on April 24, April 26, May 1) (Att. #6)
- 2) DCDHHS, Public Health Division Cabinetry & Equipment for Exam Rooms Vice Chairman Overman seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 10 - COMMISSIONERS' BUSINESS & MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

Following is a brief outline of items raised during this segment. Commissioners and the County Manager frequently make extensive remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety on a video archived on the Dare County website www.darenc.com.

<u>Commissioner Shea</u> – congratulated all high school and college graduates and wished them success in achieving their dreams. He also expressed hope that this summer will be happy and prosperous for everyone.

<u>Vice Chairman Overman</u> – gave a report on dredging activity at Hatteras Inlet and presented a video outlining the scope of the project.

<u>Commissioner House</u> – commended the Colington Fire Department on being awarded an outstanding fire rating. He complimented the beach nourishment informational campaign MoreBeachToLove.com. He expressed hope that the State budget under consideration in Raleigh will have a positive impact on the structure and function of the North Carolina Marine Fisheries Commission. He reminded everyone to remember police Sgt. Earl Murray who lost his life in a motor vehicle accident while responding to an emergency call on this date in 2009. Commissioner House presented the Pet of the Month video.

<u>Commissioner Ross</u> – thanked the Board for adopting the Dog Tethering Ordinance. He reminded everyone about the upcoming meeting of the Rural Center at Jennette's Pier. He said he has been assured that the Outer Banks Chamber of Commerce is not part of the North Carolina Chamber, which is the state-level organization that is supporting House Bill 867. Commissioner Ross added that along with the Board of Commissioners, the Outer Banks Chamber of Commerce is opposed to House Bill 867, which would hurt our seafood industry.

<u>Commissioner Tobin</u> – thanked Senator Cook for the effort that is underway in Raleigh to more effectively restructure the Marine Fisheries Commission. Commissioner Tobin gave an update on shoaling at the Oregon Inlet center span and provided details about plans for dredging later this month and during June.

<u>Commissioner Couch</u> – provided details about the recent British War Graves Ceremony and the solemn honor that was bestowed on members of the British Royal Navy who lost their lives during the sinking of the San Delfino and Bedfordshire. Commissioner Couch also commented on the recent funeral service for the Mother of Arty Tillett. He noted that there is a provision in the Senate version of the State budget to provide funding for a maintenance mechanic at the Graveyard of the Atlantic Museum.

Chairman Woodard – described the need for a resolution or letter supporting the Director's position at Jennette's Pier so that funding for it is not eliminated in the State budget, which would cause the position to be consolidated with the Roanoke Island Aquarium. Commissioner Tobin said this issue is the Aquarium's business and not that of the Dare County Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Ross asked whether the Director of the Aquarium has expressed a position on this matter and said he was baffled that input from the Aquarium is missing. Commissioner House agreed that more information is needed from the Aquarium. Vice Chairman Overman noted that Jennette's Pier operates off its own revenue and none of the reasons have changed that were outlined in a previous resolution supporting the Pier Director position. Commissioner Shea said the pier needs to be properly managed. Commissioner Couch said Jennette's Pier has been a success and eliminating the Director's position is short sighted and made the following motion –

MOTION

Commissioner Couch motioned to send a letter to Senator Cook & Representative Boswell expressing concern about the elimination of the Director's position at Jennette's Pier. Vice Chairman Overman seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES: 4 (Commissioners: Woodard, Overman, Shea, Couch)

NOES: 3 (Commissioners: House, Ross, Tobin)

Motion carried in a 4 to 3 vote

MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

1. The County Manager informed the Board that a request has been submitted for abandonment of an unused portion of State Road 1160 (Dare Avenue). He explained that since it involves a public road, the recommendation of the Board of

Commissioners is needed. He noted that one person had previously expressed concern about this road and asked the Board if they wanted to seek public input before proceeding. By consensus, the Board agreed that the item should be advertised and placed on an upcoming agenda.

2. Mr. Outten explained that mobilization for the Buxton beach nourishment project involves transporting equipment on Old Lighthouse Road. He reported that there is a problem getting the necessary equipment to the beach when people park vehicles on both sides of the street. He said NCDOT will put up no parking signs and asked the Board for authorization to submit any resolutions or documents with the Chairman's signature that may be needed in order for NCDOT to proceed.

MOTION

Commissioner Shea motioned to approve the request presented by the Manager. Commissioner Couch seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

3. The Manager reported that there is discussion in Raleigh proposing consolidation among counties for children's social services programs. He noted that Health and Human Services Director Jay Burrus does not think this arrangement would be beneficial for Dare County. Mr. Outten said he would keep the Board informed about any developments on this issue.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Chairman Woodard asked for a motion to adjourn.

MOTION

Commissioner Shea motioned to adjourn the meeting.

Commissioner House seconded the motion.

Chairman Woodard called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m. and conducted the workshop until 4:02 p.m. at which time the workshop was recessed until the conclusion of the 5:00 p.m. regularly scheduled Board of Commissioners meeting. The workshop then reconvened at 6:52 p.m. with all seven Commissioners present.

BUDGET WORKSHOP

The County Manager provided an updated summary of the two year General Fund for FY18 and FY19. Mr. Outten and the Board engaged in a lengthy, line by line review and discussion of all budget requests; changes since the previous workshop; vehicle needs; on call, part time and holiday pay policies; special appropriation requests; and Planning Department fees.

After the comprehensive review, the Board provided the Manager with guidance on various line items. A two year combined deficit of \$8,670,845 from the first four budget workshops was reduced to \$6,459,001 (\$2,987,802 in FY18 and \$3,471,199 in FY19). In order to maintain the current level of service and after making all changes the combined budget deficit remained at \$6.459 mil, which would require 4 cents in ad valorem tax to fund.

After much discussion, the Chairman queried each Commissioner and it was the consensus of all members of the Board to direct the County Manager to prepare a budget that maintains the current level of County services, reflects the changes made by the Board, and address the two year deficit of \$6.459 mil with a 4 cents ad valorem tax increase. Chairman Woodard noted, and the other Board members concurred, that Dare County is, and will remain, among the counties with the lowest ad valorem rates in the State of North Carolina.

Description

Dare County Recycling would like to apply for the Convenience Center Commingled Recycling Collection Grant offered by the NC Dept of Environment and Natural Resources. This grant would provide funding in the amount of \$31,000 to purchase 2 compactors to commingle plastic, steel cans, and aluminum cans at the Kitty Hawk Recycle Center and the Public Works Recycle Center. Sub-Recipient: desires for the North Carolina Emergency Management to conduct activities described in Attachment 1 of this MOA, on its behalf with its allocation of \$8,500 awarded through the FY 2016 HSGP. Sub-Recipient authorizes Recipient to provide the funds to the State of North Carolina, Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management to conduct Planning, Equipment Purchases, Trainings and Exercises activities to improve prevention, protection, preparedness, response and recovery. - **3.** <u>Compensation</u>: Recipient agrees that it will pay the Sub-Recipient complete and total compensation for the services to be rendered by the Sub-Recipient. Payment to the Sub-Recipient for expenditures under this

Agreement will be reimbursed after the Sub-Recipient's cost report is submitted and approved for eligible scope of work activity. The original signed copy of this Award and MOA must be signed by the Official(s) authorized to sign below and returned to North Carolina Emergency Management no later than 45 after award date. The grant shall be effective upon return of the executed Grant Award and Memorandum of Agreement and final approval by North Carolina Emergency Management of the grant budget and program narrative. Grant funds will be disbursed (according to the approved project budget) upon receipt of evidence that funds have been invoiced and products received and/or that funds have been expended (i.e., invoices, contracts, itemized expenses, etc.) and/or that all work activities are completed.

- 11. Warranty. As an independent sub-recipient, the Sub-Recipient will hold the Recipient harmless for any liability and personal injury that may occur from or in connection with the performance of this Agreement to the extent permitted by the North Carolina Tort Claims Act. Nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended to confer on any other person any rights or remedies in or by reason of this Agreement. This Agreement does not give any person or entity other than the parties hereto any legal or equitable claim, right or remedy. This Agreement is intended for the sole and exclusive benefit of the parties hereto. This Agreement is not made for the benefit of any third person or persons. No third party may enforce any part of this Agreement or shall have any rights hereunder. This Agreement does not create, and shall not be construed as creating, any rights enforceable by any person not a party to this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the State of North Carolina.
- **12.** <u>Audit Requirements</u>: For all homeland security grant programs, Sub-Recipient is responsible for obtaining audits in accordance with 2 CFR 200 Subpart F.
- 13. <u>State Property.</u> Sub-Recipient shall be responsible for the custody and care of any property purchased with HSGP funds furnished for use in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall reimburse the Recipient for any loss or damage to said property until the property is disposed of in accordance with HSGP Program requirements. Recipient will not be held responsible for any property purchased under this MOU/MOA. Title to the property purchased with HSGP funds shall be in the Sub-Recipient unles noted in section 2 of the MOA.
- 14. Points of Contact. To provide consistent and effective communication between Sub-Recipient and the Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management, each party shall appoint a Principal Representative(s) to serve as its central point of contact responsible for coordinating and implementing this MOA. The Department of Public Safety, North Carolina Emergency Management contact shall be, Assistant Director for Planning & Homeland Security and the Homeland Security Grants Management Staff, and NCEM Branch Staff. The Sub-Recipient point of contact shall be the HSGP Program Manager or the person designated by the Sub-Recipient. All confidential information of either party disclosed to the other party in connection with the services provided hereunder will be treated by the receiving party as confidential and restricted in its use to only those uses contemplated by the terms of this MOA. Any information to be treated as confidential must be clearly marked as confidential prior to transmittal to the other party. Neither party shall disclose to third parties, the other party's confidential information without written authorization to do so from the other party. If a term of this agreement is inconsistent with such authority, then that term shall be invalid, but the remaining terms and conditions of this agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

- **26.** Assurance of Compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964: During the performance of this contract, the contractor, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest (hereinafter referred to as the "contractor") agrees as follows:
 - A. Compliance with Regulations: The contractor shall comply with the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination in Federally-Assisted Programs of the 2 C.F.R. 200 and North Carolina regulation as they may be amended from time to time, (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and

- B. - D. Information and Reports: The contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as my be determined by the Recipient or the Research and Special Programs Administration (RSPA) to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders and instructions. Where any information required of a contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information the contractor shall so certify to the Recipient or the Research and Special Programs Administration as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain such information.
- E. Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of the contractors noncompliance with nondiscrimination provisions of this contract, the Recipient shall impose contract sanctions as it or the Research and Special Programs Administration may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
 - i. Withholding of payments to the contractor under the contract until the contractor complies; and/or
 - ii. Cancellation, termination, or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.
- F. <u>Incorporation of Provisions:</u> The contractor shall include the provisions of every subcontract, including procumbent of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto. The contract shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurements as the Recipient or the Research and Special Programs Administration may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance: Provide, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontract or supplier as a result of such direction, the contractor may request the Recipient to enter into such litigation to protect the of the Recipient and, in addition the contractor may request the United States to enter such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.
- 27. - B. That the Sub-Recipient shall insert the following notification in all solicitations for bids for work or material subject to the Regulations and, in adapted form in all proposals for negotiated agreements:
 - i. The Sub-Recipient, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000d to 2000d-4 and 2 CFR Sub Part F issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively insure that in regard to any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, minority, business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, sex or national origin in consideration for an award.
- C. That the Sub-Recipient shall insert the clauses of this agreement in every contract subject to the Act and the Regulations.
- D. That this assurance obligates the Recipient for the period during which federal financial assistance is extended to the project.
- E. The Sub-Recipient shall provide for such methods of administration for the program as are found by the Secretary of USDHS or the official to whom he delegates specific authority to give reasonable guarantee that is, other recipients, sub-Recipients, contractors, subcontractors, transferees, successors in interest, and other participants of federal financial assistance under such program will comply with all requirements imposed or pursuant to the Act, the Regulations and this assurance.
- F. The Sub-Recipient agrees that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under the Act, and Regulations, and this assurance.

THIS ASSURANCE is given in consideration of and for the purpose of obtaining any and all federal grants, loans, contracts, property, discounts or other federal financial assistance extended after the date hereof to the Recipient by the USDHS and is binding on it, other recipients, sub Recipients, contractors, subcontractors, transferees, successors in interest and other participants in the Department of Transportation Program. The person or persons whose signatures appear below are authorized to sign this assurance on behalf of the recipients.

28. ASSURANCE OF COMPLIANCE WITH TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964

The following clauses shall be included in all deeds, licenses, leases, permits, or similar instruments entered into by Sub-Recipient executed in expending these grant funds.

The [Sub-Recipient, licensee, lessee, permittee, etc., as appropriate] for herself/himself, his/her heirs, personal representatives, successors in interest, and assigns, as a part of the consideration hereof, does hereby covenant and agree [in the case of deeds and leases add "as a covenant running with the land"] that in the event facilities are constructed, maintained, or otherwise operated on the said property described in this [deed, license, lease, permit, etc.] for a purpose for which a USDHS program or activity is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits, the Sub-Recipient, licensee, lessee, permittee, etc.] shall maintain and operate such facilities and services in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to 2 CFR Sub Part F and as said Regulations may be amended.

agree [in case of deeds, and leases add "as a covenant running with the land"] that (1) no person on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facilities, (2) that in the construction of any improvements on, over or under such land and the furnishing services thereon, no person on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin shall be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination, and (3) that the [Sub-Recipient, licensee, lessee, permittee, etc.] shall use the premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed by or pursuant 2 CFR Sub Part F Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulations may be amended.

After receiving his PhD from Florida State University and spending a short time at Tulane University in New Orleans, he returned to NC as an Assistant Professor at East Carolina University. He is now jointly appointed between the Department of Geological Sciences, Institute for Interdisciplinary Coastal Sciences and Policy at East Carolina University and the UNC Coastal Studies Institute. He is a coastal oceanographer/geochemist with an overall scientific interest in the cycling of biologically active constituents (e.g., carbon, nitrogen, phosphorus) in coastal and open ocean environments. He is especially interested in evaluating and quantifying pathways of nutrient delivery to the coastal ocean that have been either under estimated or potentially ignored altogether, such as groundwater discharge and advective transport associated with sediment disturbances. Reide Corbett was born and raised in coastal North Carolina. After receiving his PhD from Florida State University and spending a short time at Tulane University in New Orleans, he returned to NC as an Assistant Professor at East Carolina University. He is now jointly appointed between the Department of Geological Sciences, Institute for Interdisciplinary Coastal Sciences and Policy at East Carolina University and the UNC Coastal Studies Institute. He is a coastal oceanographer/geochemist with an overall scientific interest in the cycling of biologically active constituents (e.g., carbon, nitrogen, phosphorus) in coastal and open ocean environments. He is especially interested in evaluating and quantifying pathways of nutrient delivery to the coastal ocean that have been either under estimated or potentially ignored altogether, such as groundwater discharge and advective transport associated with sediment disturbances. These processes may play a critical role in understanding biogeochemical cycles and therefore must be described in order to fully constrain these cycles locally and globally. Ultimately, his hope is that information acquired through this research will lead to a clearer understanding of estuarine and coastal processes, providing better management and preservation of these critical environments.
