North Carolina Governor's Highway Safety Program Agreement of Conditions

This Agreement is made by and between the North Carolina Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the "Department", to include the Governor's Highway Safety Program, hereinafter referred to as "GHSP"; and the applicant agency, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest, hereinafter referred to as the "Agency". During the performance of this contract, and by signing this contract, the Agency agrees as follows:

A. Federal Provisions

- 1. Equal Opportunity/Nondiscrimination. The Agency will agree to comply with all Federal statutes and implementing regulations relating to nondiscrimination concerning race, color, sex, religion, national origin, handicaps, and age. These include but are not limited to:
 - (a) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., 78 stat. 252);
 - (b) The Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, (42 U.S.C. 4601)
 - (c) Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973, (23 U.S.C. 324 et seq.), and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683 and 1685-1686);
 - (d) Non-Discrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the United States Department of Transportation Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (49 CFR Part 21), hereinafter referred to as "USDOT", as amended;
 - (e) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, (29 U.S.C. 794 et seq.), as amended, and 49 CFR Part 27; and
 - (f) The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101 et seq.);
 - (g) The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, (Pub. L. 100-209);
 - (h) Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12131-12189) and 49 CFR parts 37 and 38:
 - (i) Executive Order 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations;
 - (j) Executive Order 13166, Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency
- 2. Drug Free Workplace. The Agency agrees to comply with the provisions cited in the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 (41 U.S.C. 8103).
- 3. Federal Grant Requirements and Contracts. The Agency shall comply with the following statutes and implementing regulations as applicable:
 - (a) Highway Safety Act of 1966 (23 U.S.C. Chapter 4 -), as amended;
 - (b) Sec. 1906, Pub. L.109-59, as amended by Sec. 4011, Pub. L. 114-94;
 - (c) Uniform Procedures for State Highway Safety Grant Programs (23 CFR part 1300);
 - (d) Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR Part 1201):
 - (e) Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR Part 200) and all other relevant Federal regulations covering the Highway Safety Program;
 - (f) NHTSA Highway Safety Grant Funding Guidance, as revised, July 2015 (www.nhtsa.gov) and additions or amendments thereto.
- 4. Political Activity (Hatch Act) The Agency will comply with provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501-1508), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.

5. Lobbying.

- (a) Certification Regarding Federal Lobbying. The undersigned certifies, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that:
 - (i) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

- (ii) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for Influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.
- (iii) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-award at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grant, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$10,000 for each such failure

(b) Restriction on State Lobbying. None of the funds under this program will be used for any activity specifically designed to urge or influence a State or local legislator to favor or oppose the adoption of any specific legislative proposal pending before any State or local legislative body. Such activities include both direct and indirect (e.g., "grassroots") lobbying activities, with one exception. This does not preclude a State official whose salary is supported with NHTSA funds from engaging in direct communications with State or local legislative officials, in accordance with customary State practice, even if such communications urge legislative officials to favor or oppose the adoption of a specific pending legislative proposal.

6. Audits.

- (a) Audit Required. Non-Federal entities that expend \$750,000 or more in a year in Federal awards shall have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR, Subpart F, §200.500. Guidance on determining Federal awards expended is provided in 2 CFR, Subpart F, §200.502.
- (b) Single Audit. Non-Federal entities that expend \$750,000 or more in a year in Federal awards shall have a single audit conducted in accordance with 2 CFR, Subpart F, §200.501, except when they elect to have a program-specific audit conducted in accordance with 2 CFR, Subpart F, §200.501, paragraph (c).
- (c) Non-Governmental Entities. Non-governmental entities (not-for-profit and for-profit entities) must adhere to North Carolina General Statute 143C-6.22 and 09 NCAC Subchapter 03M.

7. Instructions for Lower Tier Certification.

- (a) By signing and submitting this proposal, the prospective lower tier participant (the Agency) is providing the certification set out below and agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 CFR Parts 180 and 1200.
- (b) The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was entered into. If it is later determined that the prospective lower tier participant knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies, including suspension or debarment.
- (c) The prospective lower tier participant shall provide immediate written notice to the person to which this proposal is submitted if at any time the prospective lower tier participant learns that its certification was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
- (d) The terms covered transaction, civil judgement, debarment, suspension, ineligible, participant, person, principal, and voluntarily excluded, as used in this clause, are defined in 2 CFR Part 180 and 1200. You may contact the person to whom this proposal is submitted for assistance in obtaining a copy of those regulations.
- (e) The prospective lower tier participant agrees by submitting this proposal that, should the proposed covered transaction be entered into, it shall not knowingly enter into any lower tier covered transaction with a person who is proposed for debarment under 48 CFR part 9, subpart 9.4, debarred,

- suspended, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this covered transaction, unless authorized by the department or agency with which this transaction originated.
- (f) The prospective lower tier participant further agrees by submitting this proposal that it will include the clause titled "Instructions for Lower Tier Participant Certification" including the "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion Lower Tier Covered Transaction," without modification, in all lower tier covered transactions and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions and will require lower tier participants to comply with 2 CFR Parts 180 and 1200.
- (g) A participant in a covered transaction may rely upon a certification of a prospective participant in a lower tier covered transaction that it is not proposed for debarment under 48 CFR part 9, subpart 9.4, debarred, suspended, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from the covered transaction, unless it knows that the certification is erroneous. A participant is responsible for ensuring that its principals are not suspended, debarred, or otherwise ineligible to participate in covered transactions. To verify the eligibility of its principals, as well as the eligibility of any prospective lower tier participants, each participant may, but is not required to, check the System for Award Management Exclusions website (https://www.sam.gov/).
- (h) Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good falth the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.
- (i) Except for transactions authorized under paragraph 7(e) of these instructions, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is proposed for debarment under 48 CFR part 9, subpart 9.4, suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies including suspension or debarment.
- (j) Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion Lower Tier Covered Transactions.
 - (i) The prospective lower tier participant (the Agency) certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in covered transactions by any Federal department or agency.
 - (ii) Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participants shall attach an explanation to this contract proposal.
- 8. Buy America Act. The Agency and each subrecipient will comply with the Buy America requirement (23 U.S.C. 313) when purchasing items using Federal funds. Buy America requires a State, or subrecipient, to purchase with Federal funds only steel, iron and manufactured products produced in the United States, unless the Secretary of Transportation determines that such domestically produced items would be inconsistent with the public interest, that such materials are not reasonably available and of a satisfactory quality, or that inclusion of domestic materials will increase the cost of the overall project contract by more than 25 percent. In order to use Federal funds to purchase foreign produced items, the State must submit a waiver request that provides an adequate basis and justification for approval by the Secretary of Transportation.
- 9. Prohibition On Using Grant Funds To Check For Helmet Usage. The Agency and each subrecipient will not use 23 U.S.C. Chapter 4 grant funds for programs to check helmet usage or to create checkpoints that specifically target motorcyclists.
- 10. Conditions for State, Local and Indian Tribal Governments. State, local and Indian tribal government Agencies shall adhere to the standards established by 2 CFR Part 225, Cost Principles for State, Local, and Indian Tribal Governments and additions or amendments thereto, for principles for determining costs applicable to grants and contracts with state, local and Indian tribal governments.
- 11. Conditions for Institutions of Higher Education. If the Agency is an institution of higher education, it shall adhere to the standards established by 2 CFR Part 215 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations and 2 CFR 220 Cost Principles for Educational Institutions for determining costs applicable to grants and contracts with educational institutions.

- 12. Conditions for Non-Profit Organizations. If the Agency is a non-profit organization, it shall adhere to the standards established by 2 CFR Part 215 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations and 2 CFR Part 230 Cost Principles for Non-Profit Organizations for determining costs applicable to grants and contracts with non-profit organizations.
- 13. Conditions for Hospitals. If the Agency is a hospital, it shall adhere to the standards established by 2 CFR Part 215 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations.

B. General Provisions

- 1. Contract Changes. This document contains the entire agreement of the parties. No other contract, either oral or implied, shall supercede this Agreement. Any proposed changes in this contract that would result in any change in the nature, scope, character, or amount of funding provided for in this contract, shall require a written addendum to this contract on a form provided by the Department.
- 2. Subcontracts Under This Contract. The Agency shall not assign any portion of the work to be performed under this contract, or execute any contract, amendment or change order thereto, or obligate itself in any manner with any third party with respect to its rights and responsibilities under this contract without the prior written concurrence of the Department. Any subcontract under this contract must include all required and applicable clauses and provisions of this contract. Subcontracting does not relieve the Agency of any of the duties and responsibilities of this agreement. The subcontractor must comply with standards contained in this agreement and provide information that is needed by the Agency to comply with these standards. The Agency must submit any proposed contracts for subcontracted services to the Governor's Highway Safety Program for final approval no less than 30 days prior to acceptance.
- 3. Solicitation for Subcontracts, Including Procurements of Materials and Equipment. In all solicitations, either by competitive bidding or negotiation, made by the Agency for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the Agency of the Agency's obligations under this contract. Additionally, Agencies making purchases or entering into contracts as provided for by this contract must adhere to the policies and procedures of 2 CFR Part 200 and North Carolina General Statute 143-128.4. Historically underutilized business defined; statewide uniform certification as it pertains to Historically Underutilized Businesses.
- 4. Incorporation of Provisions in Subcontracts. The Agency shall include the provisions of section A-1 through A-13 of this Agreement in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempted by the regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto. The Agency shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the Department, the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the "State", the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, hereinafter referred to as "NHTSA", or the Federal Highway Administration, hereinafter referred to as "FHWA", may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance. Provided, however, that in the event the Agency becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the Agency may request the Department or the State to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the Department or the State. In addition, the Agency may request the NHTSA or FHWA to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.
- Outsourcing. All work shall be performed in the United States of America. No work will be allowed to be outsourced outside the United States of America.

6. Property and Equipment.

- (a) Maintenance and Inventory. The Agency shall maintain and inventory all property and equipment purchased under this contract.
- (b) Utilization. The property and equipment purchased under this contract must be utilized by the Agency for the sole purpose of furthering the traffic safety efforts of the Agency for the entire useful life of the property or equipment.
- (c) Title Interest. The Department and NHTSA retain title interest in all property and equipment purchased under this contract. In the event that the Agency fails or refuses to comply with the provisions of this Agreement or terminates this contract, the Department, at its discretion, may take either of the following actions:
 - Require the Agency to purchase the property or equipment at fair market value or other mutually agreed to amount; or

- (ii) Require the Agency to transfer the property or equipment and title of said property or equipment, if any, to the Department or to another Agency, as directed by the Department.
- (d) Non-expendable Property. Non-expendable property is defined as property or equipment having a value of \$5000 or more with a life expectancy of more than one year. Non-expendable property purchased under this contract cannot be sold, traded, or disposed of in any manner without the expressed written permission of the Department.
- 7. Educational or Other Materials. If allowed, any educational or other materials developed using funds from this contract must be reviewed and approved by the GHSP prior to their production or purchase. The cost of these materials is generally limited to a maximum of \$5.00 per item. The purchase of promotional items and memorabilia are not an allowable cost.
- 8. Review of Reports and Publications. Any reports, papers, publications, or other items developed using funds from this contract must be reviewed and approved by the GHSP prior to their release.

9. Reimbursement.

- (a) General. Payments are made on a reimbursement basis. There is no schedule of advance payments. Only actual allowable costs are eligible for reimbursement. Claims for reimbursement must be made a minimum of quarterly and no more than once a month via the Grants Management System. Claims for reimbursement not made within the three month threshold are subject to denial. The itemized invoice shall be supported by documentation of costs as prescribed by the Department. Reimbursements will not be processed if other required reports are incomplete or have not been submitted. Failure to submit complete reports by the required deadline may result in denial of reimbursement.
- (b) Approval. The Governor's Highway Safety Program and the Department's Fiscal Section shall approve the itemized invoice prior to payment.
- (c) Unapproved Costs. Any rejected or unaccepted costs shall be borne by the Agency. The Agency agrees that in the event the Department determines that, due to Federal or State regulations that grant funds must be refunded, the Agency will reimburse the Department a sum of money equal to the amount of Federal and State participation in the rejected costs.
- (d) Final Claims for Reimbursement. Final claims for reimbursement must be received by the GHSP within 30 days following the close of the approved contract period. Project funds not claimed by this date are subject to reversion.
- (e) Expending Funds Under This Contract. Under no circumstances will reimbursement be made for costs incurred prior to the contract effective date or after the contract ending date.
- 10. Project Costs. it is understood and agreed that the work conducted pursuant to this contract shall be done on an actual cost basis by the Agency. The amount of reimbursement from the Department shall not exceed the estimated funds budgeted in the approved contract. The Agency shall initiate and prosecute to completion all actions necessary to enable the Agency to provide its share of the project costs at or prior to the conclusion of the project.
- 11. Program Income. The Agency shall account for program income related to projects financed in whole or in part with federal funds in accordance with 2 CFR 200.307. Program income earned during the contract period shall be retained by the Agency and deducted from the federal funds committed to the project by the GHSP unless approved in advance by the Federal awarding agency as an addition to the project. Program income must be accounted for separately and the records made available for audit purposes.
- 12. Project Directors. The Project Director, as specified on the signature page of this Agreement, must be an employee of the Agency's governing body. Any exception to this provision must have the expressed written approval of GHSP.

13. Reports Required.

- (a) Quarterly Progress Reports. Unless otherwise directed, the Agency must submit Quarterly Progress Reports to the GHSP, on forms provided by the Department, which reflect the status of project implementation and attainment of stated goals. Each progress report shall describe the project status by quarter and shall be submitted to GHSP no later than fifteen (15) days after the end of each quarter. If the Agency fails to submit a Quarterly Progress Report or submits an incomplete Quarterly Progress Report, the Agency will be subject to having claims for reimbursement withheld. Once a Quarterly Progress Report that substantiates adequate progress is received, cost reimbursement requests may be processed or denied at the discretion of GHSP.
- (b) Final Accomplishments Report. A Final Accomplishments Report must be submitted to the GHSP within fifteen (15) days of completion of the project, on forms provided by the Department, unless otherwise directed. If the Agency fails to submit a Final Accomplishments Report or submits an

- incomplete Final Accomplishments Report, the Agency will be subject to having claims for reimbursement withheld. Once a Final Accomplishments Report that substantiates adequate progress is received, claims for reimbursement may be processed or denied at the discretion of GHSP.
- (c) Audit Reports. Audit reports required in Section A-6 above shall be provided to the Department within thirty (30) days of completion of the audit.

14. Out-of-State Travel.

- (a) General. All out-of-state travel funded under this contract must have prior written approval by the Governor's Highway Safety Program.
- (b) Requests. Requests for approval must be submitted to the GHSP, on forms provided by the Department, no less than thirty (30) days prior to the intended departure date of travel.
- (c) Agency Travel Policy Required. For Agencies other than state agencies, out-of-state travel requests must include a copy of the Agency's travel policy, to include allowances for lodging, meals, and other travel-related expenses. For state agencies, maximum allowable subsistence is limited to the prevailing per diem rates as established by the North Carolina General Assembly.
- (d) Agenda Required. Out-of-state travel requests must include a copy of the agenda for the travel requested.
- 15. Conditions for Law Enforcement. In addition to the other conditions provided for in this Agreement, grants to law enforcement agencies are subject to the following:
 - (a) Certifications Required.
 - (i) In-car Camera or Video System. For any in-car camera or video system purchased under this contract, it is required that the operator of that equipment has successfully completed Standardized Field Sobriety Testing training (SFST). A copy of this certificate must be filed with GHSP prior to reimbursement of in-car camera or video systems.
 - (ii) Radar. For any radar equipment purchased under this contract, it is required that the operator of that equipment has successfully completed Radar Certification Training. A copy of this certificate must be filed with GHSP prior to reimbursement of radar equipment.
 - (iii) Alcohol Screening Devices. For any preliminary alcohol screening devices purchased under this contract, it is required that the operator of that equipment has successfully completed the Alcohol Screening Test Device training offered by the Forensic Test for Alcohol Branch.
 - (b) Report Required Monthly Enforcement Data Report. In addition to the reports mentioned above, law enforcement agencies engaging in enforcement activities must submit a Monthly Enforcement Data Report on the form provided by the Department no later than fifteen (15) days after the end of each month. If the Agency fails to submit a Monthly Enforcement Data Report or submits an incomplete Monthly Enforcement Data Report, the Agency will be subject to having cost reimbursement requests withheld. Once a Monthly Enforcement Data Report that substantiates adequate progress is received, cost reimbursement requests will be processed. The agency head must sign the form. However, the agency head may assign a designee to sign the form by providing written signature authority to the GHSP.

16. Conditions for Local Governmental Agencies.

- (a) Resolution Required. If the Agency is a local governmental entity, a resolution from the governing body of the Agency is required on a form provided by the Department.
- (b) Resolution Content. The resolution must contain a commitment from the governing body to provide the local funds as indicated in this contract. Additionally, the resolution is required even if the funding is one hundred percent from federal sources, as it serves as recognition by the governing body of federal funding for purposes of Section A-6 above.
- 17. Seat Belt Policy and Use. Agency must adopt and enforce a seat belt use policy required for all seating positions unless exempted by state law.
- 18. Text Messaging Policy. Agency must adopt and enforce a policy banning text messaging while driving unless exempted by state law.
- 19. Prohibited Interests. No member, officer, or employee of the Agency during his or her tenure, and for at least one (1) year thereafter, shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in this contract or the proceeds thereof or therefrom.

20. Continued Federal and State Funding.

(a) Federal Funding. The Agency agrees and understands that continuation of this project with Federal funds is contingent upon Federal funds being appropriated by the United States Congress specifically for that purpose. The Agency further agrees and understands that in the event funds originally

- appropriated by Congress for these grants are subsequently reduced by further acts of Congress, funding to the Agency may be proportionately reduced.
- (b) State Funding. The Agency agrees and understands that continuation of this project with funds from the State of North Carolina is contingent upon State funds being appropriated by the General Assembly specifically for that purpose. The Agency also agrees that any state funds received under this contract are subject to the same terms and conditions stated in this Agreement.
- 21. Performance. All grants provided by the Governor's Highway Safety Program are performance-based and, as such, require that continual progress be made toward the reduction of the number and severity of traffic crashes. Any agency, whose performance is deemed unsatisfactory by the GHSP, shall be subject to the sanctions as provided for in this contract. Additionally, unsatisfactory performance shall be cause for the Department to reduce or deny future funding.
- 22. Resolution of Disputes. Any dispute concerning a question of fact in connection with the work not disposed of by contract by and between the Agency and the Department, or otherwise arising between the parties to this contract, shall be referred to the Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the authorized official of the Agency for a negotiated settlement. In any dispute concerning a question of fact in connection with the project where such negotiated settlement cannot be resolved in a timely fashion, the final decision regarding such dispute shall be made by the Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Transportation, with the concurrence of the Federal funding agency, and shall be final and conclusive for all parties.

23. Department Held Harmless.

- (a) For State Agencies. Subject to the limitations of the North Carolina Tort Claims Act, the Agency shall be responsible for its own negligence and holds harmless the Department, its officers, employees, or agents, from all claims and liability due to its negligent acts, or the negligent acts of its subcontractors, agents, or employees in connection with their services under this contract.
- (b) For Agencies Other Than State Agencies. The Agency shall be responsible for its own negligence and holds harmless the Department, its officers, employees, or agents, from all claims and liability due to its negligent acts, or the negligent acts of its subcontractors, agents, or employees in connection with their services under this contract.
- 24. Records Access and Retention. The Agency shall provide all information and reports required by the regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Department, the State, NHTSA, or FHWA, as appropriate, to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such regulations, orders and instructions. Furthermore, the Agency shall maintain such materials during the contract period, and for five (5) years from the date of final payment from the Department or until all audit exceptions have been resolved, for such inspection and audit. Where any information required of the Agency is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the Agency shall so certify to the Department, State, NHTSA, or FHWA, as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. §147-64.7, the Department, the State Auditor, appropriate federal officials, and their respective authorized employees or agents are authorized to examine all books, records, and accounts of the Agency insofar as they relate to transactions with any department, board, officer, commission, institution, or other agency of the State of North Carolina pursuant to the performance of this Agreement or to costs charged to this Agreement.
- 25. Sanctions for Non-Compliance. The applicant Agency agrees that if it fails or refuses to comply with any provisions and assurances in this contract, the Department may take any or all of the following actions:
 - (a) Cancel, terminate, or suspend this contract in whole or in part;
 - (b) Withhold reimbursement to the Agency until satisfactory compliance has been attained by the Agency;
 - (c) Refrain from extending any further funding to the Agency under this contract with respect to which the failure or refusal occurred until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from the Agency:
 - (d) Refer the case to the United States Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

26. Cancellation, Termination, or Suspension of Contract.

(a) By the Department. For noncompliance with any of the said rules, regulations, orders or conditions, due to management deficiencies or criminal activity this contract may be immediately canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part by the Department. For noncompliance not indicative of management deficiencies or criminal activity the Department shall give sixty (60) days written notice

- to take corrective action. If the Agency has not taken the appropriate corrective action after sixty (60) days the Department may cancel, terminate, or suspend this contract in whole or in part.
- (b) By mutual consent. The Agency or the Department may terminate this contract by providing sixty (60) days advanced written notice to the other party.
- (c) Unexpended funds. Any unexpended funds remaining after cancelation or termination will revert to the Department.
- 27. Completion Date. Unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Department, the Agency shall commence, carry on, and complete the project as described in the approved Highway Safety Project Contract by September 30 of the Federal fiscal year for which it was approved.
- 28. E-Verify requirements. If this contract is subject to NCGS 143-133.3, the contractor and its subcontractors shall comply with the requirements of Article 2 of Chapter 64 of the NC General Statutes.
- 29. Certification of Eligibility Under the Iran Divestment Act. Pursuant to G.S. 147-86.59, any person identified as engaging in investment activities in Iran, determined by appearing on the Final Divestment List created by the State Treasurer pursuant to G.S. 147-86.58, is ineligible to contract with the State of North Carolina or any political subdivision of the State. The Iran Divestment Act of 2015, G.S. 147-55 et seq. requires that each Agency, prior to contracting with the State certify, and the undersigned Agency Authorizing Official on behalf of the Agency does hereby certify, to the following:
 - (a) that the Agency is <u>not now and was not at the time of the execution of the Contract dated below</u> identified on the Final Divestment List of entities that the State Treasurer has determined engages in investment activities in Iran:
 - (b) that the Agency shall not utilize on any contract with the State agency any subcontractor that is identified on the Final Divestment List; and
 - (c) that the undersigned Agency Authorizing Official is authorized by the Agency to make this Certification.
- 30. Agency Fiscal Year. The end date for the Agency's fiscal year is ___June 30, 2019
- 31. Signature. By signing below, the Agency agrees to adhere to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Golf Carts in Buxton

Description

At the last meeting, the Board instructed me to research the use of golf carts in Buxton village. Attached with this cover sheet is a map which depicts the State maintained roads in Buxton. The applicable NC law allows the operation of golf carts on State-maintained roads with a 35 mph speed limit or less. The speed limit on NC 12 through Buxton is 35 mph. However, in speaking with Sheriff Doughty, it is his recommendation to not allow golf carts on NC 12 in Buxton. Chapter 100, Streets and Sidewalks, will need to be amended by the Board before golf carts can be operated in Buxton. It is my recommendation that a hearing on the matter be scheduled for August 20, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. Draft changes to Chapter 100 are also attached.

Chapter 100 STREETS AND SIDEWALKS (proposed language is underlined)

Golf Carts on Streets and Roads in Specified Areas of Unincorporated Dare County.

100.30 Operation of Golf Carts

- a. Golf carts may be operated on all streets and roads in Hatteras village west of and including Austin Road and Austin Lane where the speed limit is 35 mph or less.
- b. Golf carts may be operated on Bayview Drive and First Street in Stumpy Point village where the speed limit is 35 mph or less.
- c. Golf carts may be operated in the Village of Avon on the following streets where the speed limit is 35 mph or less: a) Harbor Road west of North End Road and the streets connected to Harbor Road located west of North End Road; b) the following streets and the streets connected to the following streets: North End Road, McMullen Road, Reef Drive, Old Main Road and Williams Road.
- d. Golf carts may be operated in Waves village in the St. Waves Subdivision on Sea Vista Court and Sea Vista Drive where the speed limit is 35 mph or less.
 - e. Golf carts may be operated in Buxton Village on the following streets where the speed limit is 35 mph or less: Old Lighthouse Road; Cape Point Way, Diamond Shoals Drive, Buxton Back Road, Dippin Vat Road, Cross Way Road, Lost Tree Trail, Rocky Rollinson Rd, Webb Lane, Middle Ridge Trail, Crooked Ridge Trail, and Light Plant Road

100.31 Definitions

A golf cart is defined for the purposes of this subchapter as a vehicle designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course for sporting or recreational purposes and that is not capable of exceeding speeds of 20 miles per hour. (Reference NCGS 20-4.01)

100.32 Age Restriction

No person less than the age of 16 may operate a golf cart on the streets of a specified area as authorized in subsection 100.30.

100.33 Hours of Operation

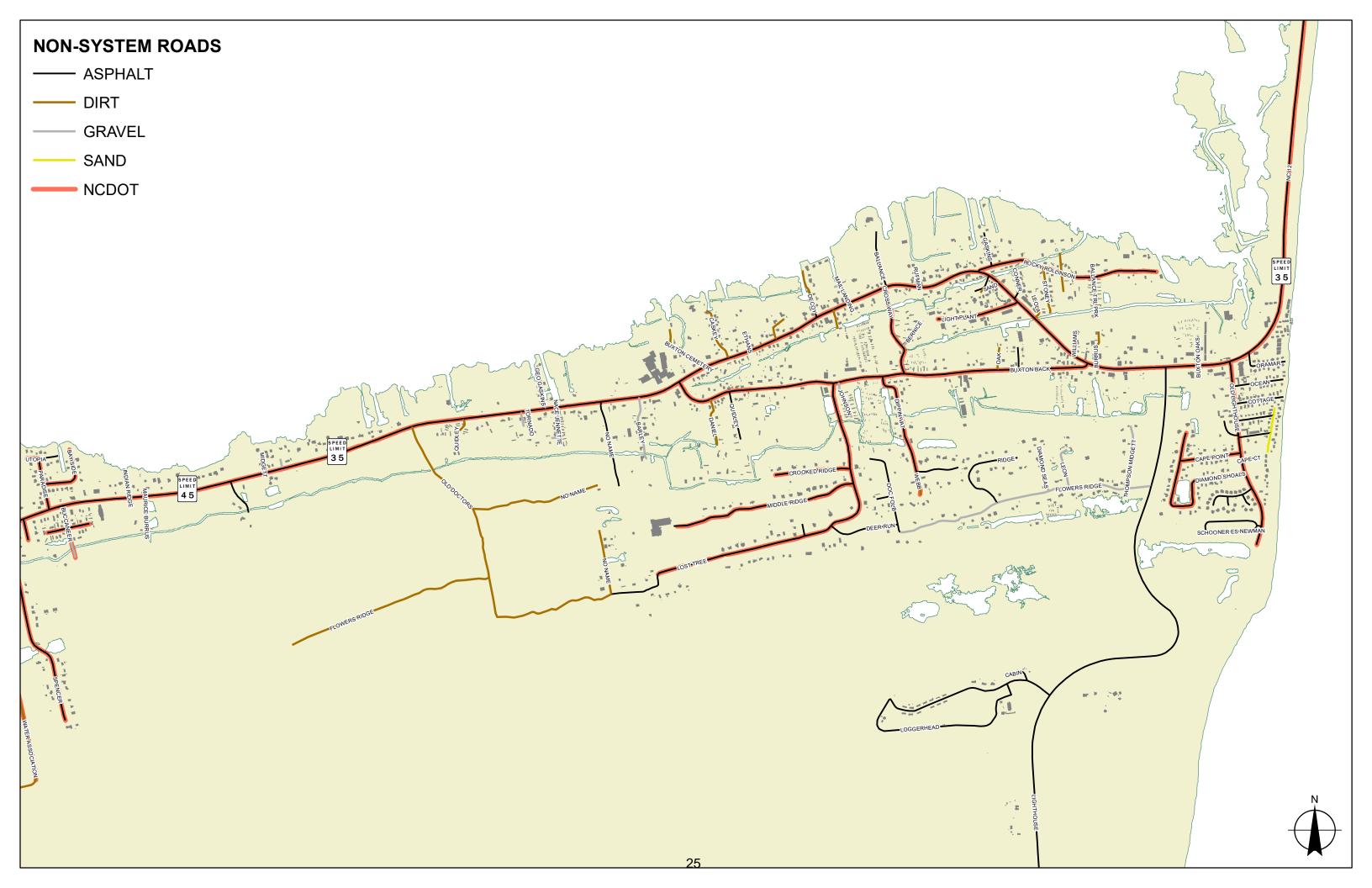
The operation of golf carts in those areas as specified in Subsection 100.30 shall be lawful during the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. eastern standard time and 6:00 a.m to 9:00 p.m. eastern (daylight) savings time until October 1 and from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. until the end of eastern (daylight) savings time.

100.34 Method of Operation

All persons operating golf carts as authorized in subsection 100.30 shall do so in a responsible and safe manner and shall obey all traffic safety laws and traffic control signage.

100.35 Violations

Any person operating a golf cart in violation of this subsection shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor and shall be fined \$50.00 for each violation.



§ 153A-245. Regulation of golf carts on streets, roads, and highways.

- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 20-50 and G.S. 20-54, a county may, by ordinance, regulate the operation of golf carts, as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(12a), on any public street, road, or highway where the speed limit is 35 miles per hour or less within the county that is located in any unincorporated areas of the county or on any property owned or leased by the county.
- (b) By ordinance, a county may require the registration of golf carts, charge a fee for the registration, specify who is authorized to operate golf carts, and specify the required equipment, load limits, and the hours and methods of operation of golf carts. No person less than 16 years of age may operate a golf cart on a public street, road, or highway. (2009-459, s. 1.)



Proposed Revisions to Chapter 99- Camping

Description

Chapter 99, Parks and Recreation of the Dare County Code of Ordinances, includes language regarding open air camping. The Zoning Ordinance prohibits the use of recreational vehicles and equipment for housekeeping purposes. Section 99.15, as currently written conflicts, with the Zoning Ordinance. Revisions to correct this conflict are needed. Suggested revisions are attached. The Planning Board discussed these revisions at their July 9 meeting and voted to recommended adoption of the proposed revisions. Although Chapter 99 is not a land use ordinance, we generally hold hearings on proposed changes to County ordinances. Such a hearing could be scheduled for August 20, 2018 at 5:30 p.m.

CAMPING (new language is underlined, text for deletion in strikethrough)

Section 99.15 DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this subchapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

IMMEDIATE FAMILY Father, mother, brother, sister, son, daughter or grandparent.

FAMILY -- Persons related by blood or marriage

NIGHT That period of time each day from 1 hour after sunset until 1 hour before sunrise.

OPEN AIR CAMPING Any act of living, residing or sleeping at night in the open air or in an automobile, other vehicle, a camper or mobile home. The term **CAMPING IN THE OPEN AIR** includes, but is not limited to sleeping out of doors in a tent, sleeping bag, blanket, hammock. or without any paraphernalia other than the clothes worn on the body.

99.16 OPEN AIR CAMPING RESTRICTED

No person shall engage in the act of open air camping within the county, in the unincorporated portions of Dare County, except as follows:

- (A) Open air camping is permitted on private property which is owned by the person engaged in the act of open air camping or by someone in the immediate family of the person engaged in open air camping. This exception applies to all members of the group or party of which the owner or member of the immediate family is a member.
- (B) Any person may engage in the act of open air camping on private property with written permission of the owner of that private property, provided that the written permission signed by the owner, must be exhibited to any peace officer or police officer upon request.

The total county real estate and personal property **levy** for **2017** was **\$ 60,402,326.92**. This total includes all real estate, mobile homes, boats, rental personal property, and business personal property. It also includes properties in bankruptcy, properties with unknown owners, and properties in conflict regarding ownership.

The total **collected** by June 30, 2018 was \$ **60,084,062.06** for a collection rate of **99.47%** on real estate and personal property taxes. All unpaid real estate and personal property taxes for the years 2007 through 2017 that are eligible are being processed for upload to the NC Debt Setoff program.

The total county **motor vehicle levy** was **\$ 0.00.** NC Motor Vehicle taxes are now being levied along with registration fees through the Tax & Tag Program of the NC Dept of Revenue. All 2007 thru 2012 Motor Vehicle delinquent taxes have been uploaded to Debt Setoff for Collection.

RESOLUTION OF THE DARE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO ADVANCE DARE COUNTY'S PROPERTY REVALUATION FROM JANUARY 1, 2021 TO JANUARY 1, 2020

WHEREAS, the Dare County Board of Commissioners advanced its scheduled octennial revaluation of all real property in Dare County to January 1, 2010, and implemented subsequent revaluations on a five year cycle by Resolution adopted October 16, 2006; and

WHEREAS, G.S. 105-286 (a) (2) provides that any county desiring to conduct a revaluation of real property earlier than required by this subsection (a) may do so upon adoption by the Board of County Commissioners of a resolution so providing; and

WHEREAS, Dare County postponed its scheduled revaluation of real property from January 1, 2010 to an effective date of January 1, 2011 by Resolution adopted September 21, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Dare County desires to advance its scheduled revaluation of real property from January 1, 2021 to an effective date of January 1, 2020, and to continue on its five year cycle subsequent to 2020; and

WHEREAS, the reappraisal work will be conducted by the staff of the Dare County Assessor's Office as part of its program of work each year;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dare County Board of Commissioners does hereby advance its scheduled revaluation of all real property in Dare County from January 1, 2021 to January 1, 2020, and will continue subsequent revaluations on a five year cycle; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded promptly by the Clerk to the Board to the Department of Revenue as required by G.S. 105-286.

Item Summary: Recommended FY19 – FY23 Capital Improvements Plan

The CIPC met July 16 and voted unanimously to recommend the attached as the FY19 through FY23 Capital Improvements Plan.

The recommended plan:

- With annual revenue growth of 1%, leaves projected Capital Reserve fund balances over the five years estimated at \$662,000, \$635,000, \$687,000, \$736,000, and \$1,217,000;
 - o The CIPC set fund balance goals of \$650,000 for each year in order to maintain a reserve;
- Funds the total requested for each year by the Dare County Schools for local capital outlay (when combined with General Fund contributions)(project 2);
- Funds over the five years the total amount requested for CIP projects by the Dare County Schools (project 3);

The recommended plan funds the following projects:

- 1 Completes replacement of HVAC units #2 through #10 at the Jail over 3 years (FY17-FY19) with \$80,500;
- 2 Funds the total requested for each year by the Dare County Schools for local capital outlay;
- 3 Funds over the five years the total amount requested for CIP projects by the Dare County Schools;
- 4 Replaces HVAC units #12 and #13 at the Jail in FY20 with \$78,000;
- 5 Delays the engineering, design and construction of C&D Landfill Cell #6 to begin with FY24 and an estimated opening date of 7/1/2026;
 - O At 6/30/2018 Cell #4 was 82% full and Cell #5, at twice the capacity of Cell #4, was 5% full:
 - o Cell #6 timing will be re-evaluated each year based upon use of cells #4 and #5;
- 6 and 8 Provided \$101,530 in FY17 for radios for EMS so that each staff member on duty has a radio, and then replaces Sheriff, remaining EMS, and Emergency Management 800mhrz radios in FY19 (the fall of 2018) via debt over 48 months at a combined \$1,025,361;
- 7 Continues \$96,250 a year for three years (FY17 FY19) for COA repairs and renovations;
 - o Projects are to be reviewed with COA staff for necessity in light of project #12 below;
- 9 \$188,950 spread over FY18 & FY19 (\$125,950) for various Building & Grounds facilities projects;
- 10 \$82,872 in FY20 for a second backhoe loader for Recycling;
- 11 \$241,250 in FY19 for a skid mounted knuckle boom unit and a roll-off truck for Public Works via debt in conjunction with projects 6 & 8.
- 12 & 12a \$7,500,000 for a new building on the COA Dare County campus and \$1,000,000 for demolition and renovation costs at the Russell Twiford location to be deeded to the County;
 - o \$1,500,000 of State bond funds are to be committed to the new building by COA;
 - The balance is recommended as a debt issuance to close after 7/1/2019 at \$7,175,000 (including debt costs of issuance);
- 14 \$275,000 in FY19 to change the County servers to a Vsan Infrastructure;
- 15 \$150,000 in FY19 for audio visual upgrades to the 2002 systems in the Courthouse;
- 17 \$332,000 in FY20 for mobile data computers and vehicles locators for EMS;
- 18 \$41,250 in FY19 to contract for a facilities study for Health & Human Services;
- 19 \$2,009,200 in FY20 for Health & Human Services facilities improvements per the results of project 18; to be financed in conjunction with projects 12 and 12a;

- 20 \$178,244 in FY19 to make site improvements at the old Administration Building site, including demolition of the building. The amount also includes demolition of the house behind the Manteo Library;
- 21 \$75,000 in FY19 for a facilities study for the Animal Shelter.
- 22 \$100,000 in FY21 for a facilities study for Public Works; and
- 23 \$100,000 in each year to be used for facilities improvements for EMS.

Projects not recommended are:

- 13 \$50,000 for fiber lines to Public Works and the Parks & Recreation at Wescott Park. The project was funded from the FY18 operating budget.
- 16 \$244,811 for various facilities improvement. The items requested were operating costs or repairs and maintenance not eligible for the CIP and will have to be completed or requested from the operating budget.

Debt Issuances (amounts include costs of issuance):

- \$1,266,611 for #6 & #8 portable radios and #11 skid boom and roll-off truck with an issue date of ~10/1/2018 and first debt service in FY19 over a 4 year term.
- \$7,175,000 for #12 & #12a COA campus consolidation \$7.5m for COA new construction, less \$1.5m COA state bond funds, plus \$1m for Russel Twiford campus demolition and renovation. Issue date to be ~9/1/2019 with first interest in FY20 and first principal in FY21 over a 15 year term with level principal.
- \$2,075,000 for #19 Health & Human Services facility improvements to be financed with project #12 & #12a with the same dates and terms.

The recommended CIP is attached:

- The projected Capital Reserve Fund activity and fund balances;
- The schedule of CIP projects at gross project amounts;
- The schedule of CIP projects at net project amounts (net of other sources and showing debt service); and
- A schedule of planned debt issuance.

The Board is requested to approve the recommended CIP and to authorize the County Manager to execute the necessary capital project ordinances and budget amendments with a report to the Board of those actions on a following board meeting's consent agenda.

Chairman Woodard called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m. He invited Rev. Jerald Craddock to share a prayer, and then he led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. Chairman Woodard noted that Commissioner Shea had an excused absence due to illness

ITEM 1 - OPENING REMARKS - CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE

Following is a brief outline of the items mentioned by Chairman Woodard during his opening remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety in a video on the Dare County website –

ITEM 4 - PUBLIC COMMENTS

The Manager outlined the procedure for making public comments in Manteo and via the video link to the Fessenden Center in Buxton. Following is a brief summary of citizen remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety in a video on the Dare County website –

The following comments were made in Manteo –

- Cole Phelps introduced himself as a candidate for the District One North Carolina Senate seat that includes Dare County. He explained why Dare County holds a special place in his heart and voiced his opposition to offshore drilling.
- 2. Jennifer Alexander thanked the Board of Commissioners for their support of Dare County schools. She expressed gratitude for the local contribution that the Board provides for education, which she said is making a significant difference.
- 3. Rosemarie Doshier reported that she attended the recent Planning Board meeting on affordable housing and noted that no County Commissioners were present. She said she would like to have seen Commissioner participation.

4. Jerald Craddock – voiced thanks for the work of Vice Chairman Overman and others on the problem that Manns Harbor residents are having with the overpopulation of bears. He encouraged the Board to proceed in working out a solution.

The following comments were made in Buxton –

5. Chris McCall – cited the need for sidewalks in the Village of Buxton. He explained that there are serious safety concerns and noted that multi-use pathways would accommodate cyclists and pedestrians traveling to the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse.

ITEM 5 – JON MIDGETT CONSTRUCTION CS TEXT AMENDMENT REQUEST

Planning Director Donna Creef explained that Elizabeth Robbins, on behalf of Jon Midgett Construction, has submitted a zoning text amendment request to add boat and small engine repairs to the list of permitted uses in the Commercial Services (CS) District. She provided background information about the request and noted that several members of the Planning Board felt that the requested use was consistent with other CS uses but it should be added as a "conditional" use and not a "permitted" use. Ms. Creef reported that the Planning Board motion failed to pass on a 3-3 vote, with one seat vacant on the panel. She added that those who voted against the motion indicated that noise was a factor in their decision. She also advised the Board that two emails from area residents have been received opposing the request. Elizabeth Robbins outlined reasons why her client's request should be approved saying that it would be a less intensive use than other currently permitted uses such as marina operations, boat building and boat sales, and the servicing of automobiles and farm machinery. Commissioners discussed the request including potential noise issues and it was the consensus of the Board to schedule a Public Hearing to gather community input on the requested text amendment.

MOTION

Chairman Woodard motioned to schedule a public hearing for 5:30 p.m., August 20, 2018. Commissioner House seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 6 – NCDOT BUILD GRANT PROGRAM (Att. #1)

At the onset of this agenda item Commissioner Couch asked to be recused from discussion and voting because of a potential pecuniary interest regarding this matter.

MOTION

Commissioner Tobin motioned to approve Commissioner Couch's recusal request. Commissioner House seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

After voting on the recusal motion, Commissioner Couch exited the room at 6:06 p.m. and did not reenter until 6:12 p.m., when the agenda item was completed.

After Commissioner Couch departed from the room, the Planning Director informed the Board of a grant opportunity that may be available for multiuse pathways and tram facilities in Hatteras Village similar to what is planned for Ocracoke Village associated with NCDOT's passenger ferry service scheduled to operate between Hatteras and Ocracoke. She explained that no local match funds are necessary because Dare County is considered a rural county. A resolution was read by the County Manager. Via the video link to the Fessenden Center, Beth Midgett thanked the Board noting that this project will promote public safety and enhance the visitor experience. Dennis Robinson thanked Planning Director Donna Creef for pulling together this grant opportunity.

MOTION

Vice Chairman Overman motioned to approve a resolution supporting the grant request and authorize staff to submit the necessary paperwork.

Commissioner House seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous (note: Commissioner Couch was recused from voting on this item)

ITEM 7 - DEBRIS MANAGEMENT CONTRACT

The County Manager outlined the process that was used to evaluate the four proposals the County received in response to the Request for Proposals (RFP) for debris management. It was reported that based upon FEMA's "best value" criteria, the Selection Committee recommends – Southern Disaster Recovery as the Primary Contractor & Crowder Gulf as the Secondary Contractor.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the proposals submitted by Southern Disaster Recovery as Primary Contractor & Crowder Gulf as Secondary Contractor and authorize the County Manager to sign the Debris Management Form of Contract with each firm. Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 8 - PROPOSAL FOR PERMITTING RELATED TO THE NEW DREDGE

The County Manager presented a proposal from Aptim Coastal Planning and Engineering of North Carolina concerning environmental and engineering consulting services associated with the County's efforts to obtain permits for the new dredge that is planned for Dare County. He described the scope of work for the project and noted that Oregon Inlet has unique permitting issues based on certain environmental documents that do not apply to the existing permits that are in place for Hatteras Inlet.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the proposal and services agreement and authorize the County Manager to execute the necessary documents.

Vice Chairman Overman seconded the motion.

ITEM 11 - COMMISSIONERS' BUSINESS & MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

Commissioners and the County Manager frequently make extensive remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety in a video on the Dare County website. Following is a brief summary outline of the items mentioned by Commissioners during this segment –

Commissioner Tobin

- Reported that the recent Community Advisory Council meeting did not have a quorum.
- Presented a video showcasing the 4-H Service & Citizenship Workshop that was
 recently held in the Commissioner's Meeting Room. Commissioner Tobin thanked those
 who assisted with the workshop, which provided a valuable educational experience to an
 exceptional group of young people.
- Gave an update on the Request for Proposal phase that is now underway for the Dare County public/private partnership for a new dredge.
- Provided statistics related to the problem that Manns Harbor residents are having with bears roaming throughout their community, which poses serious safety concerns. The Board discussed the issue and the need for bear-resistant trash containers that can effectively be used by the Public Works Department. The County Manager reported on his conversation with NC Wildlife Resources about the bear over-population problem.

Commissioner Ross

- Explained that the Albemarle Commission is still working on the issue of office space and for the time being will remain at their existing facility in Hertford. He noted that there have been a couple of recent newspaper articles referencing an alleged conflict of interest, which is being addressed by the Commission's legal counsel and auditors.
- Reported that there was a reported violation of the Dare County animal tether ordinance recently in Colington and noted that the Sheriff is issuing a citation.
- Thanked the Dare County Capital Improvements Committee for moving forward in recommending that a study be done to determine what might be needed at the Dare County Animal Shelter.

Commissioner House

- Provided details about the U.S. Coast Guard Appreciation Day to be held August 18th at Harkers Island where retired Coast Guard Chief Ira Lewis will be honored in celebration of his 100th birthday.
- Updated the Board on recent meetings held by the North Caroline Marine Fisheries
 Commission. Commissioner House also gave a briefing on recent action in Washington,
 D.C. regarding the reauthorization of the Magnuson-Stevens Act, which governs federal
 fisheries. He outlined an amendment to the bill requiring that the economic impact of a
 fishery be taken into consideration in making fisheries management decisions.
- Described a fundraising event being held July 28 at Manteo High School to benefit the SPCA and the school's athletic program.
- Commissioner House presented a video showcasing the Dare County Animal Shelter "Pet of the Week" and urged people to consider pet adoption.

Vice Chairman Overman

- Congratulated the service pin recipients and the Employee of the Month.
- Voiced his concern about the serious safety issues associated with the bear overpopulation problem, which is a life threatening situation for the people of Manns Harbor.
 The Vice Chairman reported on his conversations with wildlife officials and said this problem needs to be properly addressed by the appropriate State and Federal agencies.

Commissioner Couch

- Reported on the Change of Command Ceremony held recently at the Hatteras Civic Center when Coast Guard Senior Chief Petty Officer James Pond relieved Master Chief Petty Officer Christopher Wright as the Officer in Charge of Station Hatteras Inlet.
- Commissioner Couch shared a concern that law enforcement officials have voiced to him about pedestrian safety issues associated with the high volume of traffic that is occurring on Hatteras Island. He asked the Board to have the County Manager reach out to NCDOT to look into the possibility of having lighted pedestrian signs.
- Presented a request from a Hatteras Pines homeowner asking that golf carts be allowed in the Village of Buxton. Chairman Woodard called Planning Director Donna Creef to the podium and asked her to outline the procedural process for addressing golf cart requests. After discussing the issue, it was the consensus of the Board that Ms. Creef should meet with Commissioner Couch to determine which roads might be appropriate and bring a list back to the Board so that Commissioners can review specific streets and consider setting the matter for public hearing.

Chairman Woodard

 Updated the Board about an encouraging new legislative development in Washington, D.C. related to the issue of offshore drilling, which he reported has the support of Congressman Walter Jones. Chairman Woodard noted that this is an important concern for Dare County and said he would continue to stay focused on this.

MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

1. The County Manager presented a renewal proposal from the Outer Banks Chamber of Commerce for implementation of Dare County's Economic Diversification plan. He outlined the components of the \$25,000 proposal, which he said is already budgeted. Mr. Outten noted that the Chamber has offered to add-on additional services for a Housing Initiative at an extra cost of \$10,000. Commissioners questioned Chamber President and CEO Karen Brown about aspects of the proposal to clarify whether the County would be paying for previous Chamber projects. She outlined the advantages of approving the proposal with the addition of the \$10,000 add-on for the Housing Initiative. Ms. Brown explained that it would allow the Chamber to allocate more resources and provide increased credibility in attracting potential partners and grant opportunities. While discussing the Housing Initiative, Chairman Woodard noted that he believes the term "affordable housing" is counterproductive. He added that attitudes will have to change and the municipalities need to have skin in the game. He promised to continue working with the Town Mayors advocating on this issue. The Chairman reminded everyone that the Board of Commissioners is committed to this issue and has asked the Dare County Planning Board to address it and we are waiting for their input. Commissioners discussed the Housing Initiative add-on and whether it should be done now or wait until the Planning Board gives its input so that benchmarks can better be determined, which resulted in the following motion - - -

Commissioner Ross motioned to approve the Economic Development Proposal submitted by the Outer Banks Chamber of Commerce in the amount of \$25,000 with the addition of a \$10,000 Housing Initiative add-on for a total of \$35,000. Commissioner Couch seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

2. Mr. Outten briefed the Board on the readiness status of the Rodanthe emergency ferry dock. He thanked Ann Daisey, John Delucia, and Basnight Construction for their work at the site.

Public Information Officer Dorothy Hester provided information about the concerted effort that is underway to promote beach safety. She showcased a video urging everyone to "Love the Beach & Respect the Ocean." Ms. Hester also outlined a text to join emergency notification system to help residents and visitors stay informed about beach conditions.

Finance Director David Clawson updated the Board on the timeline for the closing for the County's refinancing, which has been approved by the Local Government Commission.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Chairman Woodard asked for a motion to adjourn.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to adjourn the meeting.

Commissioner Ross seconded the motion.

Albemarle Regional Health Services has received funding through the North Carolina Department of Public Health, Chronic Disease and Injury Section Tobacco Prevention and Control Branch from the North Carolina General Assembly. This budget provides funding to develop strategies to prevent the use of new and emerging tobacco products, including e-cigarettes by youth and people of child bearing age.

By virtue of appropriate signatures on this agreement, Albemarle Regional Health Services agrees to provide technical assistance and resources through the services of the Tobacco Prevention Manager.

Period of Performance:

July 1, 2018 - May 31, 2019

Scope of Work & Deliverables:

- Identify a staff member within the local health department to be an engaged member of the Tobacco Free Living Coalition and participate in meetings and trainings conducted and work between meetings (if applicable) to implement deliverables of the Core Annual Action Plan (AAP).
 - a. Prevent the use of all tobacco products, with a focus on new and emerging tobacco products, including electronic cigarettes, by youth and people of childbearing age
 - b. Eliminate exposure to Secondhand Smoke
 - c. Decrease tobacco use among adults and youth
 - d. Identify and eliminate tobacco-related disparities
- 2. Identify and involve key stakeholders to support the implementation of goals and deliverables.
- 3. Work with existing youth groups or establish new ones.
- 4. Work with schools to promote available best practice interventions and curriculum for tobacco use prevention and the risks of e-cigarette use.
- 5. Educate, parents, teachers, coaches, college-aged young people, civic and community leaders, dental and health care professionals, public health, mental health and substance abuse prevention professionals, and other influencers of youth about the risks of all tobacco product use, including e-cigarettes, among youth and young adults.
- 6. Ensure the 100% tobacco-free schools policies are being implemented effectively to prohibit all tobacco product use, including e-cigarettes and other emerging tobacco products.
- 7. Identify a policy strategy, to implement or improve, to reduce tobacco use by including ecigarettes in the policy related to smoking and tobacco use.

- 8. Work with community partners in substance use prevention on educational efforts to reduce youth access to all tobacco products, including e-cigarettes cigars, little cigars, and hookah in retail settings.
- 9. Ensure that youth and young adults who use tobacco products receive tobacco use cessation messages and information on QuitlineNC services.
- 10. Attend or participate in tobacco related trainings, workshops or meetings.
- 11. Provide consistent and evidence-based messages about the health risks of all tobacco product use, including new and emerging tobacco products, such as e-cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, and hookah and exposure to secondhand smoke and aerosol from e-cigarettes and other tobacco products.

Method of Accountability:

The progress and performance of the Health Department will be monitored via participation of a selected Health Department representative at bi-monthly Coalition meetings as well as through a bi-monthly written report denoting progress to date related to the scope of work and deliverables.

Budget and Justification:

Approved Tobacco Free Living Project expenses;

Amount will be \$5,550.00 for use in salary, supplies, educational supplies, media, trainings, and/or travel (mileage, reservations, registration, meals, and/or other: parking, ferry tolls) for Dare County.

This Memorandum of Agreement is effective on the date of signatures and will remain in effect for the duration of the funded Core grant period with Albemarle Regional Health Services.

The Dare County Manager shall enact the following water shortage response provisions whenever the trigger conditions outlined in Section IV are met. In his or her absence, the Utility Director will assume this role.

II. Notification

The following notification methods will be used to inform water system employees and customers of a water shortage declaration: employee e-mail announcements, notices at municipal buildings, notices in water bills. Required water shortage response measures will be communicated through Municipal & County Government Information, PSA announcements and the Dare County website http://www.darenc.com, on local radio and cable stations. Declaration of emergency water restrictions or water rationing will be communicated on the Municipal & County Government Information, local radio station PSA's, and the Dare County Website.

III. Levels of Response

Five levels of water shortage response are outlined in the table below. The five levels of water shortage response are: voluntary reductions, mandatory reductions I and II, emergency reductions and water rationing. A detailed description of each response level and corresponding water reduction measures follow below.

Stage	Response	Description
1	Voluntary Reductions	Water users are encouraged to reduce their water use and improve water use efficiency; however, no penalties apply for noncompliance. Water supply conditions indicate a potential for shortage.
2	Mandatory Reductions I	Water users must abide required water use reduction and efficiency measures; penalties apply for noncompliance. Water supply conditions are significantly lower than the seasonal norm and water shortage conditions are expected to persist.
3	Mandatory Reductions II	Customers must continue actions from all previous stages and further reduce water use by 20% compared to their previous month's water bill.
4	Emergency Reductions	Water supply conditions are substantially diminished and pose an imminent threat to human health or environmental integrity.
5	Water Rationing	Water supply conditions are substantially diminished and remaining supplies must be allocated to preserve human health and environmental integrity.

In Stage 1, Voluntary Reductions, all water users will be asked to reduce their normal water use by 5%. Customer education and outreach programs will encourage water conservation and efficiency measures including: irrigating landscapes a maximum of one inch per week; preventing water waste, runoff and watering impervious surfaces; watering plants deeply to encourage root growth; washing only full loads in clothes and dishwashers; using spring-loaded nozzles on garden hoses; and identifying and repairing all water leaks.

In Stage 2, Mandatory Reductions I, all customers are expected to reduce their water use by 10% in comparison to their previous month's water bill. In addition to continuing to encourage all voluntary reduction actions, the following restrictions apply: irrigation is limited to a half inch per week between 8PM and 8AM; outdoor use of drinking water for washing impervious surfaces is prohibited; and all testing and training purposes requiring drinking water (e.g. fire protection) will be limited.

In Stage 3, Mandatory Reductions II, customers must continue actions from all previous stages and further reduce water use by 20% compared to their previous month's water bill. All non-essential uses of drinking water are banned and garden and landscape irrigation must be reduced to the minimum amount necessary for survival. Additionally, in Stage 3, a drought surcharge of 1.5 times the normal water rate applies.

In Stage 4, Emergency Reductions, customers must continue all actions from previous stages and further reduce their water use by 25% compared to their previous month's water bill. A ban on all use of drinking water except to protect public health and safety is implemented and drought surcharges increase to 2 times the normal water rate.

The goal of Stage 5, Water Rationing, is to provide drinking water to protect public health (e.g. residences, residential health care facilities and correctional facilities). In Stage 5, all customers are only permitted to use water at the minimum required for public health protection. Firefighting is the only allowable outdoor water use and pickup locations for distributing potable water will be announced according to Dare County's Emergency Response Plan. Drought surcharges increase to 5 times the normal water rate.

IV. Triggers

Dare County's water source is groundwater. The following measurements of well pumping times and well levels in relationship to pump intake levels trigger entry into corresponding water restriction stages.

Stage	Well Operating Conditions
1	Pumping Time >10 hrs. 20% reduction in seasonal normal distance from static water level and pump intake 20% increase pumping time for same output
2	Pumping Time >12 hrs. 40% reduction in distance from static water level and pump intake 40% increase pumping time for same output
3	Pumping Time >14 hrs. 60% reduction in distance from static water level and pump intake 60% increase pumping time for same output
4	Pumping Time >20 hrs. 80% reduction in distance from static water level and pump intake
5	Water level at pump intake elevation

Return to Normal

When water shortage conditions have abated and the situation is returning to normal, water conservation measures employed during each phase should be decreased in reverse order of implementation. Permanent measures directed toward long-term monitoring and conservation should be implemented or continued so that the community will be in a better position to prevent shortages and respond to recurring water shortage conditions.

V. Enforcement

The provisions of the water shortage response plan will be enforced by the Dare County Water Department and police personnel. Violators may be reported to the dedicated water conservation hotline. Citations are assessed according to the following schedule depending on the number of prior violations and current level of water shortage.

Water Shortage Level	First Violation	Second Violation	Third Violation
Voluntary Reductions	N/A	N/A	N/A
Mandatory Reductions (Stages 2 and 3)	Warning	\$250	Discontinuation of Service
Emergency Reductions	\$250	Discontinuation of Service	Discontinuation of Service
Water Rationing	\$500	Discontinuation of Service	Discontinuation of Service

Drought surcharge rates are effective in Stages 3, 4 and 5.

VI. Public Comment

Customers will have multiple opportunities to comment on the provisions of the water shortage response plan. First, a draft plan will be will be available at the Dare County Water Department Office, 600 Mustian St, Kill Devil Hills, NC for customers to view. A notice will be included in customer water bill notifying them of such. Also a draft plan will be published on the Dare County Website http://darenc.com and all subsequent revisions to the draft plan will be published at least 30 days prior to an adoption vote by Dare County's Board of Commissioners.

VII. Variance Protocols

Applications for water use variance requests are available from the Dare County Water Department Office, 600 Mustian St., Kill Devil Hills, NC, 27948. All applications must be submitted to the Dare County Water Department for review by the Utilities Director or his designee. A decision to approve or deny individual variance requests will be determined within two weeks of submittal after careful consideration of the following criteria: impact on water demand, expected duration, alternative source options, social and economic importance, purpose (i.e. necessary use of drinking water) and the prevention of structural damage.

VIII. Effectiveness

The effectiveness of the Dare County water shortage response plan will be determined by comparing the stated water conservation goals with observed water use reduction data. Other factors to be considered include frequency of plan activation, any problem periods without activation, total number of violation citations, desired reductions attained and evaluation of demand reductions compared to the previous year's seasonal data.

IX. Revision

The water shortage response plan will be reviewed and revised as needed to adapt to new circumstances affecting water supply and demand, following implementation of emergency restrictions, and at a minimum of every five years in conjunction with the updating of our Local Water Supply Plan. Further, a water shortage response planning work group will review procedures following each emergency or rationing stage to recommend any necessary improvements to the plan to Dare County's Board of Commissioners. The Dare County Water Department is responsible for initiating all subsequent revisions.

I. Precedence Among Contract Documents:

In the event of a conflict between or among the terms of the Contract Documents, the terms in the Contract Document with the highest relative precedence shall prevail. The order of precedence shall be the order of documents as listed in Paragraph I, above, with the first-listed document having the highest precedence and the last-listed document having the lowest precedence. If there are multiple Contract Amendments, the most recent amendment shall have the highest precedence.

II. Effective Period:

VII. Reversion of Unexpended Funds:

Any unexpended grant funds shall revert to the Agency within 60 days of the termination of this Contract.

VIII. Reporting Requirements:

(1) State [N.C.G.S. 143C-6-23]:

The Agency has determined that the Grantee is a governmental entity and is not subject to the State reporting requirements mandated by N.C.G.S. § 143C-6-23. Therefore, the Grantee does not have to file annual electronic reports with the NC Office of State Budget & Management.

(2) Agency Reporting Requirements:

a) The Grantee shall submit quarterly progress reports, with each report due on or before the last day of April, July, October, and January, continuing until the project is complete and final project report is

- approved. The quarterly progress report is required even if no activity has occurred for the quarter and no reimbursement is requested for the quarter.
- b) The quarterly and final report shall include a narrative summary of the work completed each quarter and for the project to date and a summary of cash and in-kind expenditures for the quarter and total project.
- Grantee shall submit a Final Financial report and Final Invoice not later than 60 days after the expiration or termination of this Contract.

IX. Payment Provisions:

Upon execution of this Contract the Grantee shall submit to the Agency Contract Administrator a completed Request for Payment form, to be provided by the Agency. All Request for Payment forms should be received no more than monthly, a certified invoice showing expenditures and matching funds, if applicable, for the current period and cumulatively for the entire project and, upon approval by the Agency, shall receive payment within 30 days. Twenty percent (20%) of the total funds awarded under this Contract shall be retained by the Agency until both the final performance and financial reports are submitted by the Grantee and approved by the Agency.

Up to 12 percent (12%) of the funds awarded to the Grantee may be used to reimburse actual documented administrative expenses for the project, excluding any expenses pledged by the Grantee as match for this project and salary, benefits, and operating expenses that would normally have been paid by the Grantee.

If this Contract is terminated prior to the original end date, the Grantee may submit a final Request for Payment form. All unexpended funds shall be returned by the Grantee to the Agency within 60 days of the Contract termination date with a complete final financial report, accompanied by either a final invoice or a refund of any funds received but not expended. The Agency shall have no obligation to honor requests for payment based on expenditure reports submitted later than 60 days after termination or expiration of the contract period.

Reimbursement requests shall be completed on a "Request for Reimbursement" form furnished to the Grantee by the Agency. All reimbursement forms must include support documentation, including but not limited to; copies of invoices, individual time sheets and travel logs that have been signed by the employee and supervisor; salary registers or payrolls that include fringe benefits, hourly rates of pay, and signature of the Grantee's responsible financial person, cancelled checks and lease agreements.

Payment shall be made in accordance with the Contract Documents and as described in the Scope of Work, Attachment A.

Eligible expenditures for payment must be within the effective period noted in the Contract. Reimbursement may not be considered prior to the submission and final execution of the Contract.

All travel reimbursement shall be made in accordance with the current State rates, at the time of the expenditure, and shall be made in accordance with the "State Budget Manual".

Staff from the Division of Soil and Water Conservation or its designated agent will conduct a site visit and approve the work completed and submitted for reimbursement prior to releasing any payment to the Grantee. The Agency must determine that all work has been completed satisfactorily in accordance with the Best Management Practices for Selective Clearing and Snagging.

All matching funds, including in-kind and cash, must be spent concurrently with funds provided by the Contract. Both types of matching funds expended shall be accounted for on the monthly certified invoices.

Indirect costs are not allowable expenditures under this Contract.

X. Contract Administrators:

ATTACHMENT A SCOPE OF WORK STREAM DEBRIS REMOVAL PROJECT

Dare Soil and Water Conservation District (the "GRANTEE") will complete stream debris removal activities including cutting and removing downed trees, broken tops, and woody/vegetative debris that impede or potentially impede water flow in the streams and tributaries included in Table A1 below (taken from the application submitted by the GRANTEE). The GRANTEE must use its best judgment to only remove debris resulting from Hurricane Matthew or Tropical Storms Hermine and Julia.

TABLE A1: Stream/Ditch Segments to be Repaired

Attachment B

General Terms and Conditions

DEFINITIONS

Unless indicated otherwise from the context, the following terms shall have the following meanings in this Contract. All definitions are from 9 NCAC 3M.0102 unless otherwise noted. If the rule or statute that is the source of the definition is changed by the adopting authority, the change shall be incorporated herein:

- (1) "Agency" (as used in the context of the definitions below) shall mean and include every public office, public officer or official (State or local, elected or appointed), institution, board, commission, bureau, council, department, authority or other unit of government of the State or of any county, unit, special district or other political subagency of government. For other purposes in this Contract, "Agency" shall mean the entity identified as one of the parties hereto.
- (2) "Audit" means an examination of records or financial accounts to verify their accuracy.
- (3) "Certification of Compliance" means a report provided by the Agency to the Office of the State Auditor that states that the Grantee has met the reporting requirements established by this Subchapter and included a statement of certification by the Agency and copies of the submitted grantee reporting package.
- (4) "Compliance Supplement" refers to the North Carolina State Compliance Supplement, maintained by the State and Local Government Finance Agency within the North Carolina Department of State Treasurer that has been developed in cooperation with agencies to assist the local auditor in identifying program compliance requirements and audit procedures for testing those requirements.
- (5) "Contract" means a legal instrument that is used to reflect a relationship between the agency, grantee, and subgrantee.
- (6) "Fiscal Year" means the annual operating year of the non-State entity.
- (7) "Financial Assistance" means assistance that non-State entities receive or administer in the form of grants, loans, loan guarantees, property (including donated surplus property), cooperative agreements, interest subsidies, insurance, food commodities, direct appropriations, and other assistance. Financial assistance does not include

- amounts received as reimbursement for services rendered to individuals for Medicare and Medicaid patient services.
- (8) "Financial Statement" means a report providing financial statistics relative to a given part of an organization's operations or status.
- (9) "Grant" means financial assistance provided by an agency, grantee, or subgrantee to carry out activities whereby the grantor anticipates no programmatic involvement with the grantee or subgrantee during the performance of the grant.
- (10) "Grantee" has the meaning in G.S. 143C-6-23(a)(2): a non-State entity that receives a grant of State funds from a State agency, department, or institution but does not include any non-State entity subject to the audit and other reporting requirements of the Local Government Commission. For other purposes in this Contract, "Grantee" shall mean the entity identified as one of the parties hereto.
- (11) "Grantor" means an entity that provides resources, generally financial, to another entity in order to achieve a specified goal or objective.
- (12) "Non-State Entity" has the meaning in N.C.G.S. 143C-1-1(d)(18): Any of the following that is not a State agency: an individual, a firm, a partnership, an association, a county, a corporation, or any other organization acting as a unit. The term includes a unit of local government and public authority.
- (13) "Public Authority" has the meaning in N.C.G.S. 143C-1-1(d)(22): A municipal corporation that is not a unit of local government or a local governmental authority, board, commission, council, or agency that (i) is not a municipal corporation and (ii) operates on an area, regional, or multiunit basis, and the budgeting and accounting systems of which are not fully a part of the budgeting and accounting systems of a unit of local government.
- (14) "Single Audit" means an audit that includes an examination of an organization's financial statements, internal controls, and compliance with the requirements of federal or State awards.
- (15) "Special Appropriation" means a legislative act authorizing the expenditure of a

designated amount of public funds for a specific purpose.

- (16) "State Funds" funds means anv appropriated by the North Carolina General Assembly or collected by the State of North State funds include federal Carolina. financial assistance received by the State and transferred or disbursed to non-State Both federal and State funds maintain their identity as they are subgranted to other organizations. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. 143C-6-23(a)(1), the terms "State grant funds" and "State grants" do not include any payment made by the Medicaid program, the Teachers' and State Employees' Comprehensive Major Medical Plan, or other similar medical programs.
- (17) "Subgrantee" has the meaning in G.S. 143C-6-23(a)(3): a non-State entity that receives a grant of State funds from a grantee or from another subgrantee but does not include any non-State entity subject to the audit and other reporting requirements of the Local Government Commission.
- (18) "Unit of Local Government has the meaning in G.S. 143C-1-1(d)(29): A municipal corporation that has the power to levy taxes, including a consolidated city-county as defined by G.S. 160B-2(1), and all boards, agencies, commissions, authorities, and institutions thereof that are not municipal corporations.

Relationships of the Parties

Independent Contractor: The Grantee is and shall be deemed to be an independent Contractor in the performance of this Contract and as such shall be wholly responsible for the work to be performed and for the supervision of its employees. The Grantee represents that it has, or shall secure at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this agreement. Such employees shall not be employees of, or have any individual contractual relationship with, the Agency.

Subcontracting: The Grantee shall not subcontract any of the work contemplated under this Contract without prior written approval from the Agency. Any approved subcontract shall be subject to all conditions of this Contract. Only the subcontractors or subgrantees specified in the Contract documents are to be considered approved upon award of the Contract. The Agency shall not be obligated to pay for any work performed by any unapproved subcontractor or subgrantee. The Grantee shall be responsible for the performance of all of its subgrantees and shall not be relieved of any of the duties and responsibilities of this Contract.

Subgrantees: The Grantee has the responsibility to ensure that all subgrantees, if any, provide all information necessary to permit the Grantee to comply with the standards set forth in this Contract.

Assignment: No assignment of the Grantee's obligations or the Grantee's right to receive payment hereunder shall be permitted. However, upon written request approved by the issuing purchasing authority, the State may:

- (a) Forward the Grantee's payment check(s) directly to any person or entity designated by the Grantee, or
- (b) Include any person or entity designated by Grantee as a joint payee on the Grantee's payment check(s).

In no event shall such approval and action obligate the State to anyone other than the Grantee and the Grantee shall remain responsible for fulfillment of all Contract obligations.

Beneficiaries: Except as herein specifically provided otherwise, this Contract shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors. It is expressly understood and agreed that the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Contract, and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to the Agency and the named Grantee. Nothing contained in this document shall give or allow any claim or right of action whatsoever by any other third person. It is the express intention of the Agency and Grantee that any such person or entity, other than the Agency or the Grantee, receiving services or benefits under this Contract shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.

Indemnity

Indemnification: The Grantee agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Agency, including any of its Divisions, and any of its officers, agents and employees, from liability of any kind, and from any claims of third parties arising out of any act or omission of the Contractor in connection with the performance of this Contract to the extent permitted by law.

Default and Termination

Termination by Mutual Consent: The Parties may terminate this Contract by mutual consent with 60 days notice to the other party, or as otherwise provided by law.

Termination for Cause: If, through any cause, the Grantee shall fail to fulfill its obligations under this Contract in a timely and proper manner, the Agency shall have the right to terminate this Contract by

giving written notice to the Grantee and specifying the effective date thereof.

In that event, all finished or unfinished deliverable items prepared by the Grantee under this Contract shall, at the option of the Agency, become its property and the Grantee shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such materials, minus any payment or compensation previously made.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provision, the Grantee shall not be relieved of liability to the Agency for damages sustained by the Agency by virtue of the Grantee's breach of this agreement, and the Agency may withhold any payment due the Grantee for the purpose of setoff until such time as the exact amount of damages due the Agency from such breach can be determined. The filing of a petition for bankruptcy by the Grantee shall be an act of default under this Contract.

Waiver of Default: Waiver by the Agency of any default or breach in compliance with the terms of this Contract by the Grantee shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent default or breach and shall not be construed to be modification of the terms of this Contract unless stated to be such in writing, signed by an authorized representative of the Agency and the Grantee and attached to the Contract.

Availability of Funds: The parties to this Contract agree and understand that the payment of the sums specified in this Contract is dependent and contingent upon and subject to the appropriation, allocation, and availability of funds for this purpose to the Agency.

Force Majeure: Neither party shall be deemed to be in default of its obligations hereunder if and so long as it is prevented from performing such obligations by any act of war, hostile foreign action, nuclear explosion, riot, strikes, civil insurrection, earthquake, hurricane, tornado, or other catastrophic natural event or act of God.

Survival of Promises: All promises, requirements, terms, conditions, provisions, representations, guarantees, and warranties contained herein shall survive the Contract expiration or termination date unless specifically provided otherwise herein, or unless superseded by applicable federal or State statutes of limitation.

Intellectual Property Rights

Copyrights and Ownership of Deliverables: All deliverable items produced pursuant to this Contract are the exclusive property of the Agency. The Grantee shall not assert a claim of copyright or other property interest in such deliverables.

Compliance with Applicable Laws

Compliance with Laws: The Grantee shall comply with all laws, ordinances, codes, rules, regulations, and licensing requirements that are applicable to the conduct of its business, including those of federal, State, and local agencies having jurisdiction and/or authority.

Equal Employment Opportunity: The Grantee shall take affirmative action in complying with all federal and State statutes and all applicable requirements concerning fair employment of people with disabilities, and concerning the treatment of all employees without regard to discrimination by reason of race, color, religion, sex, national origin or disability. For additional information see Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C., 2000d, 2000e-16), Title XI of the Education amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683 and 1685-1686), and section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended (29 U.S.C. 794).

Executive Order 24: In accordance with Executive Order 24, issued by Governor Perdue, and N.C.G.S.§ 133-32, a vendor or contractor (i.e. architect, bidder, contractor, construction manager, design professional, engineer, landlord, offeror, seller, subcontractor, supplier, vendor, or grantee), is prohibited from making gifts or giving favors to any employee of the Agency of Agriculture and Consumer Services. This prohibition covers those vendors, contractors, and/or grantees who:

- (a) have a Contract with a governmental Agency; or
- (b) have performed under such a Contract within the past year; or
- (c) anticipate bidding on such a Contract in the future.

Confidentiality

Confidentiality: Any information, data, instruments, documents, studies or reports given to or prepared or assembled by the Grantee under this agreement shall be kept as confidential and not divulged or made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the Agency. The Grantee acknowledges that in receiving, storing, processing or otherwise dealing with any confidential information it will safeguard and not further disclose the information except as otherwise provided in this Contract.

Oversight

Access to Persons and Records: The State Auditor and the using agency's internal auditors shall have access to persons and records as a result of all Contracts or grants entered into by State agencies or political subdivisions in accordance with General Statute 147-64.7 and Session Law 2010-194, Section 21 (i.e., the State Auditors and internal auditors may audit the records of the contractor during the term of the Contract to verify accounts and data affecting fees or performance).

Record Retention: Records shall not be destroyed, purged or disposed of without the express written consent of the Agency. State basic records retention policy requires all grant records to be retained for a minimum of five years or until all audit exceptions have been resolved, whichever is longer. Contract is subject to federal policy and regulations, record retention may be longer than five years since records must be retained for a period of three years following submission of the final Federal Financial Status Report, if applicable, or three years following the submission of a revised final Federal Financial Status Report. Also, if any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit, disallowance action, or other action involving this Contract has been started before expiration of the five-year retention period described above, the records must be retained until completion of the action and resolution of all issues which arise from it, or until the end of the regular five-year period described above, whichever is later.

Miscellaneous

Choice of Law: The validity of this Contract and any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties to this Contract, are governed by the laws of North Carolina. The Grantee, by signing this Contract, agrees and submits, solely for matters concerning this Contract, to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of North Carolina and agrees, solely for such purpose, that the exclusive venue for any legal proceedings shall be Wake County, North Carolina. The place of this Contract and all transactions and agreements relating to it, and their situs and forum, shall be Wake County, North Carolina, where all matters whether sounding in Contract or tort, relating to the validity, construction, interpretation, and enforcement shall be determined.

Headings: The Section and Paragraph headings in these General Terms and Conditions are not material parts of the agreement and should not be used to construe the meaning thereof.

Time of the Essence: Time is of the essence in the performance of this Contract.

Care of Property: The Grantee agrees that it shall be responsible for the proper custody and care of any property furnished to it for use in connection with the performance of this Contract and will reimburse the Agency for loss of, or damage to, such property. At the termination of this Contract, the Grantee shall contact the Agency for instructions as to the disposition of such property and shall comply with these instructions.

Amendment: This Contract may not be amended orally or by performance. Any amendment must be made in written form and executed by duly authorized representatives of the Agency and the Grantee.

Severability: In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction holds that a provision or requirement of this Contract violates any applicable law, each such provision or requirement shall continue to be enforced to the extent it is not in violation of law or is not otherwise unenforceable and all other provisions and requirements of this Contract shall remain in full force and effect.

Travel Expenses: Reimbursement to the Grantee for travel mileage, meals, lodging and other travel expenses incurred in the performance of this Contract shall be reasonable and supported by documentation. State rates shall be used. International travel shall not be reimbursed under this Contract.

Sales/Use Tax Refunds: If eligible, the Grantee and all subgrantees shall: (a) ask the North Carolina Department of Revenue for a refund of all sales and use taxes paid by them in the performance of this Contract, pursuant to G.S. 105-164.14; and (b) exclude all refundable sales and use taxes from all reportable expenditures before the expenses are entered in their reimbursement reports.

Advertising: The Grantee shall not use the award of this Contract as a part of any news release or commercial advertising.

Indirect Costs Policy: The Agency has adopted a "Zero" policy that indirect costs are unallowable expenditures in all State funded grant applications and/or grant guidance, informational or directional documents.

Allowable Uses of State Funds: Expenditures of State funds by any grantee shall be in accordance with the Cost Principles outlined in the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) CFR Title 2, Part 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, as applicable. If the grant funding includes federal sources, the grantee shall ensure adherence to the cost principles established by the Federal Office of Management and Budget. [09 NCAC 03M.020]

Purpose of Form

A person who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) to report, for example, income paid to you, real estate transactions, mortgage interest you paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made to an IRA.

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN to the person requesting it (the requester) and, when applicable, to:

- 1. Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued),
 - 2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding, or
- 3. Claim exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee. If applicable, you are also certifying that as a U.S. person, your allocable share of any partnership income from a U.S. trade or business is not subject to the withholding tax on foreign partners' share of effectively connected income.

your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

Definition of a U.S. person. For federal tax purposes, you are considered a U.S. person if you are:

- · An individual who is a U.S. citizen or U.S. resident alien,
- · A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States,
- . An estate (other than a foreign estate), or
- A domestic trust (as defined in Regulations section 301.7701-7).

Special rules for partnerships. Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax on any foreign partners' share of income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, a partnership is required to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid withholding on your share of partnership income.

The person who gives Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of net income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States is in the following cases:

- . The U.S. owner of a disregarded entity and not the entity,
- The U.S. grantor or other owner of a grantor trust and not the trust, and
- The U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust) and not the beneficiaries of the trust.

Foreign person. If you are a foreign person, do not use Form W-9. Instead, use the appropriate Form W-8 (see Publication 515, Withholding of Tax on Nonresident Aliens and Foreign Entities).

Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien. Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an exemption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the payee has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items:

- 1. The treaty country. Generally, this must be the same treaty under which you claimed exemption from tax as a nonresident alien.
 - 2. The treaty article addressing the income.
- 3. The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
- The type and amount of income that qualifies for the exemption from tax.
- 5. Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. law, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity not subject to backup withholding, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8.

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS a percentage of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

You will not be subject to backup withholding on payments you receive if you give the requester your correct TIN, make the proper certifications, and report all your taxable interest and dividends on your tax return.

Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

- 1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
- 2. You do not certify your TIN when required (see the Part II instructions on page 3 for details),
 - 3. The IRS tells the requester that you furnished an incorrect TIN,
- 4. The IRS tells you that you are subject to backup withholding because you did not report all your interest and dividends on your tax return (for reportable interest and dividends only), or
- 5. You do not certify to the requester that you are not subject to backup withholding under 4 above (for reportable interest and dividend accounts opened after 1983 only).

Certain payees and payments are exempt from backup withholding. See the instructions below and the separate Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9.

Also see Special rules for partnerships on page 1.

Updating Your Information

You must provide updated information to any person to whom you claimed to be an exempt payee if you are no longer an exempt payee and anticipate receiving reportable payments in the future from this person. For example, you may need to provide updated information if you are a C corporation that elects to be an S corporation, or if you no longer are tax exempt. In addition, you must furnish a new Form W-9 if the name or TIN changes for the account, for example, if the grantor of a grantor trust dies.

Penalties

Failure to furnish TIN. If you fail to furnish your correct TIN to a requester, you are subject to a penalty of \$50 for each such failure unless your failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.

Civil penalty for false information with respect to withholding. If you make a false statement with no reasonable basis that results in no backup withholding, you are subject to a \$500 penalty.

Criminal penalty for falsifying information. Willfully falsifying certifications or affirmations may subject you to criminal penalties including fines and/or imprisonment.

Misuse of TINs. If the requester discloses or uses TINs in violation of federal law, the requester may be subject to civil and criminal penalties.

Specific Instructions

Name

If you are an individual, you must generally enter the name shown on your income tax return. However, if you have changed your last name, for instance, due to marriage without informing the Social Security Administration of the name change, enter your first name, the last name shown on your social security card, and your new last name.

If the account is in joint names, list first, and then circle, the name of the person or entity whose number you entered in Part I of the form.

Sole proprietor. Enter your individual name as shown on your income tax return on the "Name" line. You may enter your business, trade, or "doing business as (DBA)" name on the "Business name/disregarded entity name" line.

Partnership, C Corporation, or S Corporation. Enter the entity's name on the "Name" line and any business, trade, or "doing business as (DBA) name" on the "Business name/disregarded entity name" line.

Disregarded entity. Enter the owner's name on the "Name" line. The name of the entity entered on the "Name" line should never be a disregarded entity. The name on the "Name" line must be the name shown on the income tax return on which the income will be reported. For example, if a foreign LLC that is treated as a disregarded entity for U.S. federal tax purposes has a domestic owner, the domestic owner's name is required to be provided on the "Name" line. If the direct owner of the entity is also a disregarded entity, enter the first owner that is not disregarded for federal tax purposes. Enter the disregarded entity's name on the "Business name/disregarded entity name" line. If the owner of the disregarded entity is a foreign person, you must complete an appropriate Form W-8.

Note. Check the appropriate box for the federal tax classification of the person whose name is entered on the "Name" line (Individual/sole proprietor, Partnership, C Corporation, S Corporation, Trust/estate).

Limited Liability Company (LLC). If the person identified on the "Name" line is an LLC, check the "Limited liability company" box only and enter the appropriate code for the tax classification in the space provided. If you are an LLC that is treated as a partnership for federal tax purposes, enter "P" for partnership. If you are an LLC that has filed a Form 8832 or a Form 2553 to be taxed as a corporation, enter "C" for C corporation or "S" for S corporation. If you are an LLC that is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner under Regulation section 301.7701-3 (except for employment and excise tax), do not check the LLC box unless the owner of the LLC (required to be identified on the "Name" line) is another LLC that is not disregarded for federal tax purposes. If the LLC is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner, enter the appropriate tax classification of the owner identified on the "Name" line.

Other entities. Enter your business name as shown on required federal tax documents on the "Name" line. This name should match the name shown on the charter or other legal document creating the entity. You may enter any business, trade, or DBA name on the "Business name/ disregarded entity name" line.

Exempt Payee

If you are exempt from backup withholding, enter your name as described above and check the appropriate box for your status, then check the "Exempt payee" box in the line following the "Business name/ disregarded entity name," sign and date the form.

Generally, individuals (including sole proprietors) are not exempt from backup withholding. Corporations are exempt from backup withholding for certain payments, such as interest and dividends.

Note. If you are exempt from backup withholding, you should still complete this form to avoid possible erroneous backup withholding.

The following payees are exempt from backup withholding:

- 1. An organization exempt from tax under section 501(a), any IRA, or a custodial account under section 403(b)(7) if the account satisfies the requirements of section 401(f)(2),
 - 2. The United States or any of its agencies or instrumentalities,
- A state, the District of Columbia, a possession of the United States, or any of their political subdivisions or instrumentalities,
- 4. A foreign government or any of its political subdivisions, agencies, or instrumentalities, or
- An international organization or any of its agencies or instrumentalities.

Other payees that may be exempt from backup withholding include:

- 6. A corporation,
- 7. A foreign central bank of issue,
- 8. A dealer in securities or commodities required to register in the United States, the District of Columbia, or a possession of the United States
- 9. A futures commission merchant registered with the Commodity Futures Trading Commission,
 - 10. A real estate investment trust,
- 11. An entity registered at all times during the tax year under the Investment Company Act of 1940,
 - 12. A common trust fund operated by a bank under section 584(a),
 - 13. A financial institution.
- 14. A middleman known in the investment community as a nominee or custodian, or
- 15. A trust exempt from tax under section 664 or described in section 4947.

The following chart shows types of payments that may be exempt from backup withholding. The chart applies to the exempt payees listed above, 1 through 15.

Part I. Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)

Enter your TIN in the appropriate box. If you are a resident alien and you do not have and are not eligible to get an SSN, your TIN is your IRS individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN). Enter it in the social security number box. If you do not have an ITIN, see *How to get a TIN* below

If you are a sole proprietor and you have an EIN, you may enter either your SSN or EIN. However, the IRS prefers that you use your SSN.

If you are a single-member LLC that is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner (see *Limited Liability Company (LLC)* on page 2), enter the owner's SSN (or EIN, if the owner has one). Do not enter the disregarded entity's EIN. If the LLC is classified as a corporation or partnership, enter the entity's EIN.

Note. See the chart on page 4 for further clarification of name and TIN combinations.

How to get a TIN. If you do not have a TIN, apply for one immediately. To apply for an SSN, get Form SS-5, Application for a Social Security Card, from your local Social Security Administration office or get this form online at www.ssa.gov. You may also get this form by calling 1-800-772-1213. Use Form W-7, Application for IRS Individual Taxpayer Identification Number, to apply for an ITIN, or Form SS-4, Application for Employer Identification Number, to apply for an EIN. You can apply for an EIN online by accessing the IRS website at www.irs.gov/businesses and clicking on Employer Identification Number (EIN) under Starting a Business. You can get Forms W-7 and SS-4 from the IRS by visiting IRS.gov or by calling 1-800-TAX-FORM (1-800-829-3676).

If you are asked to complete Form W-9 but do not have a TIN, write "Applied For" in the space for the TIN, sign and date the form, and give it to the requester. For interest and dividend payments, and certain payments made with respect to readily tradable instruments, generally you will have 60 days to get a TIN and give it to the requester before you are subject to backup withholding on payments. The 60-day rule does not apply to other types of payments. You will be subject to backup withholding on all such payments until you provide your TIN to the requester.

Note. Entering "Applied For" means that you have already applied for a TIN or that you intend to apply for one soon.

Caution: A disregarded domestic entity that has a foreign owner must use the appropriate Form W-8.

Part II. Certification

To establish to the withholding agent that you are a U.S. person, or resident alien, sign Form W-9. You may be requested to sign by the withholding agent even if item 1, below, and items 4 and 5 on page 4 indicate otherwise.

For a joint account, only the person whose TIN is shown in Part I should sign (when required). In the case of a disregarded entity, the person identified on the "Name" line must sign. Exempt payees, see Exempt Payee on page 3.

Signature requirements. Complete the certification as indicated in items 1 through 3, below, and items 4 and 5 on page 4.

- 1. Interest, dividend, and barter exchange accounts opened before 1984 and broker accounts considered active during 1983. You must give your correct TIN, but you do not have to sign the certification.
- 2. Interest, dividend, broker, and barter exchange accounts opened after 1983 and broker accounts considered inactive during 1983. You must sign the certification or backup withholding will apply. If you are subject to backup withholding and you are merely providing your correct TIN to the requester, you must cross out item 2 in the certification before signing the form.
- **3.** Real estate transactions. You must sign the certification. You may cross out item 2 of the certification.

²However, the following payments made to a corporation and reportable on Form 1099-MISC are not exempt from backup withholding: medical and health care payments, attorneys' fees, gross proceeds paid to an attorney, and payments for services paid by a federal executive agency.

- 4. Other payments. You must give your correct TIN, but you do not have to sign the certification unless you have been notified that you have previously given an incorrect TIN. "Other payments" include payments made in the course of the requester's trade or business for rents, royalties, goods (other than bills for merchandise), medical and health care services (including payments to corporations), payments to a nonemployee for services, payments to certain fishing boat crew members and fishermen, and gross proceeds paid to attorneys (including payments to corporations).
- 5. Mortgage interest paid by you, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, qualified tuition program payments (under section 529), IRA, Coverdell ESA, Archer MSA or HSA contributions or distributions, and pension distributions. You must give your correct TIN, but you do not have to sign the certification.

Secure Your Tax Records from Identity Theft

Identity theft occurs when someone uses your personal information such as your name, social security number (SSN), or other identifying information, without your permission, to commit fraud or other crimes. An identity thief may use your SSN to get a job or may file a tax return using your SSN to receive a refund.

To reduce your risk:

- · Protect your SSN,
- · Ensure your employer is protecting your SSN, and
- . Be careful when choosing a tax preparer.

If your tax records are affected by identity theft and you receive a notice from the IRS, respond right away to the name and phone number printed on the IRS notice or letter.

If your tax records are not currently affected by identity theft but you think you are at risk due to a lost or stolen purse or wallet, questionable credit card activity or credit report, contact the IRS Identity Theft Hotline at 1-800-908-4490 or submit Form 14039.

For more information, see Publication 4535, Identity Theft Prevention and Victim Assistance.

Victims of identity theft who are experiencing economic harm or a system problem, or are seeking help in resolving tax problems that have not been resolved through normal channels, may be eligible for Taxpayer Advocate Service (TAS) assistance. You can reach TAS by calling the TAS toll-free case intake line at 1-877-777-4778 or TTY/TDD 1-800-829-4059.

Protect yourself from suspicious emails or phishing schemes. Phishing is the creation and use of email and websites designed to mimic legitimate business emails and websites. The most common act is sending an email to a user falsely claiming to be an established legitimate enterprise in an attempt to scam the user into surrendering private information that will be used for identity theft.

The IRS does not initiate contacts with taxpayers via emails. Also, the IRS does not request personal detailed information through email or ask taxpayers for the PIN numbers, passwords, or similar secret access information for their credit card, bank, or other financial accounts.

If you receive an unsolicited email claiming to be from the IRS, forward this message to *phishing@irs.gov*. You may also report misuse of the IRS name, logo, or other IRS property to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 1-800-366-4484. You can forward suspicious emails to the Federal Trade Commission at: *spam@uce.gov* or contact them at *www.ftc.gov/idtheft* or 1-877-IDTHEFT (1-877-438-4338).

Visit IRS.gov to learn more about identity theft and how to reduce your risk.

Privacy Act Notice

Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code requires you to provide your correct TIN to persons (including federal agencies) who are required to file information returns with the IRS to report interest, dividends, or certain other income paid to you; mortgage interest you paid; the acquisition or abandonment of secured property; the cancellation of debt; or contributions you made to an IRA, Archer MSA, or HSA. The person collecting this form uses the information on the form to file information returns with the IRS, reporting the above information. Routline uses of this information include giving it to the Department of Justice for civil and criminal litigation and to cities, states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. possessions for use in administering their laws. The information also may be disclosed to other countries under a treaty, to federal and state agencies to enforce civil and criminal laws, or to federal law enforcement and intelligence agencies to combat terrorism. You must provide your TIN whether or not you are required to file a tax return. Under section 3406, payers must generally withhold a percentage of taxable interest, dividend, and certain other payments to a payee who does not give a TIN to the payer. Certain penalties may also apply for providing false or fraudulent information.

You must show your individual name and you may also enter your business or "DBA" name on the "Business name/disregarded entity" name line. You may use either your SSN or EIN (if you have one), but the IRS encourages you to use your SSN.

List first and circle the name of the trust, estate, or pension trust. (Do not furnish the TIN of the personal representative or trustee unless the legal entity itself is not designated in the account title.) Also see Special rules for partnerships on page 1.
