Public Hearing-- Amendment to Travel Trailer Park-Campground Ordinance

Description

A hearing on an amendment to the Travel Trailer Park-Campground Ordinance is scheduled. After the hearing, the Board may choose to adopt the amendment as recommended by the Planning Board, revise the proposed language based on hearing input or choose to take no action at all. If no action is taken, any proposed campground that features camping cabins or alternative camping units must do so at a 50-50 ratio of RVs to camping cabins/alternative camping units. A draft set of motions and the proposed language is attached to this staff report.

PROPOSED REVISION TO TTPCO AS RECOMMENDED BY PLANNING BOARD.

Draft Language (new language is underlined)

Section 160. 22 (C) PARKS may be comprised of travel trailers sites, camping cabins, alternative camping units, and camping tent sites. The preliminary and the final site plan shall identify the proposed use of each space or camping area. If a PARK is proposed to feature other camping units than travel trailers, a minimum of 50% of all camping spaces shall be designated and used as travel trailer spaces or; the total number of camping cabins and alternative camping units shall be limited to a density of 14 units per acre with the remaining sites, if utilized, devoted to travel trailer camping sites.

Manteo Shallowbag Bay Dredge Project Change Order

Description

Request to approve Change Order 1 for the Manteo Shallowbag Bay Dredge Project to utilize the Contingency funds to dredge additional cubic yards in areas that are more prone to shoaling. The change order will utilize the remaining State funds to dredge areas within ranges 1 through 4 and remaining funds from the State Shallow Draft Navigation Grant fund and the Town of Manteo dredge within range 5.

Manteo (Shallowbag) Bay Maintenance Dredging Project

Description: On February 4, 2021, Salmons Dredging, Inc. was notified that the County has available funds to dredge additional material from Ranges 1 through 4 and Range 5 associated with the permitted channel template to a depth of -9.0 ft. relative to Mean Lower Low Water (MLLW). CPE will provide the locations where the additional dredging will be conducted to maximize the amount of volume dredged from the navigation channel and makes the following recommendation:

Owner and Contractor agree to modify the dimensions of the area to be dredged within the permitted footprint of the channel along Ranges 1 through 4 and Range 5. The modification includes widening the current 50' wide design channel within the permitted channel footprint along portions of Ranges 1 through 4 and Range 5 based on the Contractor's After-Dredge (AD) survey data as directed by the Engineer. Contractor will be responsible for removing material from the areas within the 100' wide permitted channel as directed by the Engineer to a depth of -9.0 ft. MLLW with 3H:1V side slopes from the existing grade down to the bottom of the channel. Contractor is eligible for payment of additional volume dredged but not to exceed 1,624 cubic yards of material within Ranges 1 through 4 and 339 cubic yards of material within Range 5.

Purpose: Maximize the quantity of material dredged from the navigation channel in Ranges 1-4 and Range 5 to a depth of -9.0 ft. MLLW in areas as directed by the Engineer.

Contract Quantity: The quantities of Item #3 - Channel Maintenance Dredging - Ranges 1-4 and Item #4 - Channel Maintenance Dredging - Range 5 will be changed by the issuance of this change order. Based on modifications described above, the original (max) contract quantity has increased from 30,639 cubic yards to 32,602 cubic yards. The revised schedule of quantities and prices are provided in the table below.

Contract Time:

The Date of Substantial Completion will be changed by the issuance of this Change Order. The work will be substantially completed on or before March 7, 2021 and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions on or before March 31, 2021.

Contract Cost:

The original contract cost was \$1,623,843.55. The changes to the quantities of Item #3 - Channel Maintenance Dredging - Ranges 1-4 and Item #4 - Channel Maintenance Dredging - Range 5 will result in a net increase in the contract amount of \$67,213.12 (\$55,605.76 for Ranges 1-4 and \$11,607.36 for Range 5) from \$1,623,843.55 to \$1,691,056.67. The bid and change order costs are provided in the table below.

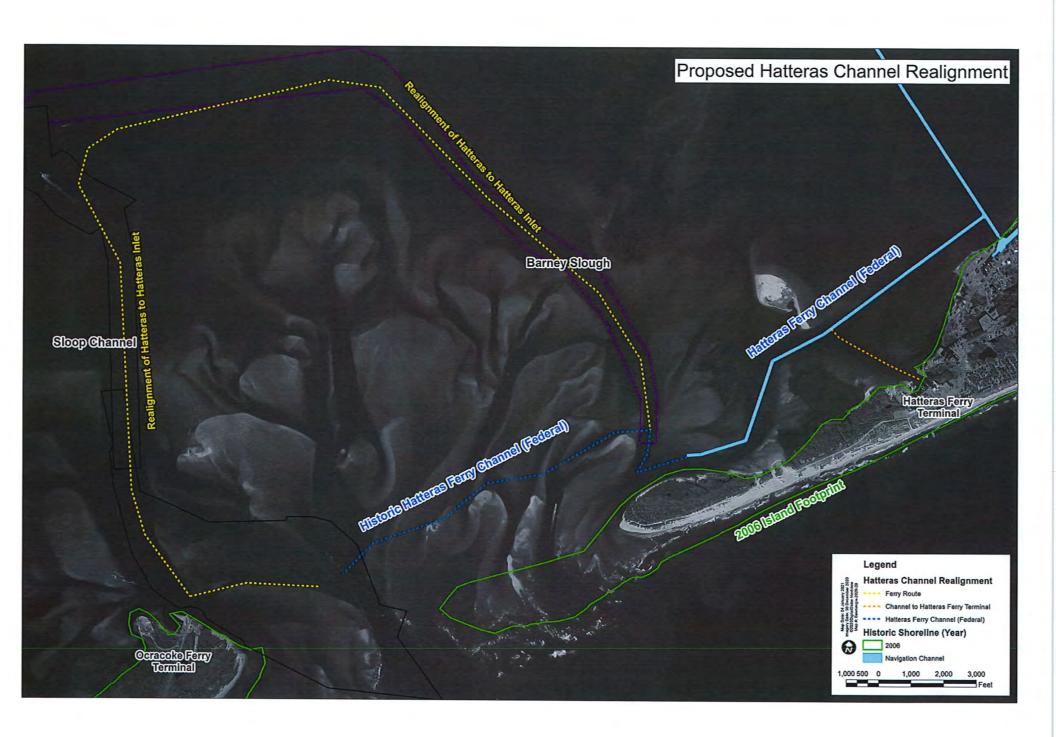

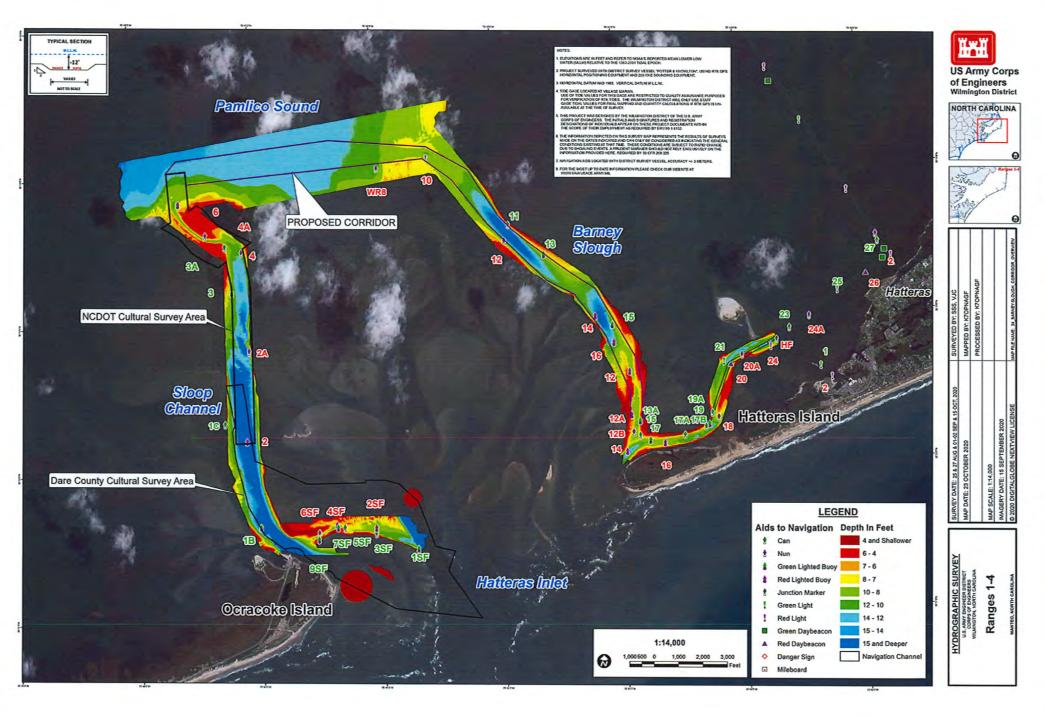

A RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS AMEND THE EXISTING FEDERAL AUTHORIZATION TO MEET THE ORIGINAL INTENT OF THE AUTHORIZATION OF SAFE NAVIGATION FROM HATTERAS TO THE HATTERAS INLET

WHEREAS, the waterway between Hatteras Island and Ocracoke Island, known as Hatteras Inlet and also known as Rollinson Channel, is a unique area in that it provides the only way for local watermen to get direct access to the Atlantic Ocean and for NCDOT to transport millions of people each year between Hatteras and Ocracoke Islands who, because there is no bridge, must travel between the two islands on ferry vessels; and

WHEREAS, the Hatteras Inlet waterway not only provides a direct channel to the Atlantic Ocean for commercial and recreational fishing vessels, it is the means of access for the United States Coast Guard to use when responding to potentially lifesaving ocean rescue missions; and

WHEREAS, Hatteras Inlet is subject to constantly shifting shoals and sandbars posing a clear and present danger for safe navigation between Hatteras and Ocracoke Islands and through the channel to the Atlantic Ocean that is known as the Hatteras Inlet Gorge; and

WHEREAS, the dangerous shoaling at Hatteras Inlet not only threatens the lives and property of commercial and recreational vessels it also jeopardizes the economy of the region by causing irreparable harm to charter boat operators, commercial fishing operations, seafood processing houses, marine repair facilities, and other local businesses on both Hatteras and Ocracoke Islands that depend on the Hatteras Inlet waterway; and

WHEREAS, because the most direct navigational route between Hatteras and Ocracoke Islands, known as the Connecting Route and also known as the Old Ferry Route, cannot be used due to shoaling, local vessels and NCDOT ferries are forced to take the only alternative route from Hatteras to the Hatteras Inlet Gorge; and

WHEREAS, the original intent of the 1940's federal authorization was to provide a route from Hatteras to the Hatteras Inlet Gorge to provide access to the Atlantic for all mariners with the understanding that that the route was sustainable because it was protected by Hatteras and Ocracoke Island; and

WHEREAS, an increase in the number of storms has changed the dynamic inlet by exposing the what used to be the direct route due to the erosion of Hatteras Island and Ocracoke Island going from a .25-mile-wide inlet in 1993 to a 2.3-mile-wide inlet in 2020; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Dare County Board of Commissioners supports the US Army Corps of Engineers submission to realign the Hatteras Channel to include Barney Slough, Sloop Channel and South Ferry Channel to provide a direct route to the Hatteras Gorge.

Transportation of Non-Custodial Substance Abuse Patients to Treatment Facilities

Description

Currently the Sheriff's Dept. transports substance abuse patients who are in custody to appropriate treatment facilities. There are more than one hundred substance abuse patients annually who are not in custody and need transportation to treatment facilities. (See attached summary)

Authorize hiring an additional Deputy Sheriff and authorize the Manager to execute such budget amendments as are necessary to fund the position.

Transportation of Non-Custodial Substance Abuse Patients to Treatment Facilities

There is no system in place to provide transportation of non-custodial substance abuse patients to treatment facilities. The need is often late at night and the patient is left on his/her own to find transportation. This results in many in need of immediate treatment not getting that treatment, therefore perpetuating the substance abuse problem. The Substance Abuse Task Force has asked if Dare County could add a Deputy to the Sheriff's Department to provide this much needed transportation. The initial cost to up fit a deputy is \$18,150. The annual salary with benefits of a new deputy is \$66,305. In the future an additional vehicle will be required. The initial cost and the prorated salary will be paid for this year out of some combination of the Drug Court Diversion Program fund, contingency and/or the Sheriff's budget. Next year and the years that follow, the cost will be included in the Sheriff's budget. The Sheriff has approved this request.

At 9:01 a.m. Chairman Woodard called to order the regularly scheduled meeting with appropriate prior public notice having been given. (Due to audio technical difficulties the meeting was recessed). Meeting resumed at 9:11 a.m. Chairman Woodard read the invocation provided by Rev. Keith Dey and then led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

ITEM 1 - OPENING REMARKS - CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE

Following is a brief outline of the items mentioned by the Chairman during his opening remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety in a video on the Dare County website.

- Last week the County Manager, Vice-Chairman Overman and he met virtually with Representative Hanig, Senator Steinburg, DOT representatives and representatives of Burris and Tillis offices to discuss the critical replacement of the Alligator River Bridge.
- Thanked those who listened to the State of the County address last week which informed of Dare County's progress and successes in 2020.
- Asked everyone to continue participation in practicing the 3 W's. Currently there had been over 2,500 COVID cases in Dare County. To date in excess of 6,000 vaccinations had been administered. He thanked Dr. Davies and her staff for all of the hard work they have done since March.

ITEM 2 – PUBLIC COMMENTS

At 9:19 a.m. the County Manager opened the meeting for public comments via email to the Board at DCBOC@darenc.com. No one responded to the invitation to address the Board. The County Manager closed Public Comments at 9:20 a.m.

ITEM 3 - PRESENTATION OF COUNTY SERVICE PIN - February 2021

Shanna Fullmer, Director of Public Works, was recognized for her twenty-five years of service to Dare County. The County Manager presented the pre-recorded segment while a photograph of Ms. Fullmer was displayed.

ITEM 4 – CLARK CLUSTER HOME GROUP DEVELOPMENT (MARITIME RIDGE)

This agenda item was handled as a quasi-judicial proceeding. Before offering any testimony, the Assistant Planning Director, Noah H. Gillam, and all parties to this proceeding were duly sworn by the Clerk to the Board. Mr. Gillam outlined the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) application from Christopher and Kathryn Clark and noted their property in Frisco at 50636 NC 12 Highway was presently zoned S-1 and cluster homes were permitted. Mr. and Mrs. Clark proposed to construct four 900 sq. feet homes, each with two gravel parking spaces. Appearing on behalf of the applicant: Engineer Michael Strader indicated they were making use of the existing infrastructure and the application was a good proposed use and in complete compliance with the ordinance.

The County Manager asked Mr. Strader if he was authorized to speak for the applicants, which he affirmed. Mr. Outten then asked if they agreed to the admission into evidence of the material submitted by the Assistant Planning Director, which was on file in the Planning Department, the facts presented by the Planner, and the terms and conditions outlined in the CUP. He had seen the CUP and agreed on behalf of the applicants, Mr. and Mrs. Christopher Clark.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the proposed cluster home development and site plan submitted by Christopher and Kathryn Clark, as recommended by the Planning Board. Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 5 – ADDITIONAL REVISIONS TO TRAVEL TRAILER PARK AND CAMPGROUND ORDINANCE (Att. #1)

Donna Creef reviewed the substantial revisions adopted in October, 2020 to the Travel Trailer Park and Campground Ordinance. These included a provision for camper cabins and alternative camper units to be included at a campground at a 50/50 ratio. At the request of the Board in October, the Planning Board and staff had additional discussions regarding those ratios. The Planning Board had several months of discussions and now recommends amending the ordinance to allow 100% camper cabins or a higher ratio of camper cabins and alternative camping units at a decreased density. At 50/50 percent, there was a density of twenty-eight units per acre. The Planning Board proposed it may be appropriate to have the free-market forces decide what the appropriate ratio would be; however, if the ratio went up then the density would decline. There was also a Board request to make sure the lot coverage language was correct. Currently the ordinance excluded the wetlands areas but allowed pervious roads for balance. There was, therefore, no recommended change for the lot coverage language. There was a recommendation to change the language as to the ratios for camper cabins and alternative camper units. Before additional modifications could be made to the Travel Trailer Park and Campground Ordinance, a Public Hearing would be held and was suggested for February 16, 2021.

The Board began discussion and received clarifications from both Ms. Creef and Mr. Outten. Ms. Creef explained that per the example provided there was a 1,500 square foot requirement for campground sites. In a fixed layout of 1,500 square feet, an acre would accommodate twenty-eight sites. Commissioner Ross noted that as the travel trailer sites decrease, the cabins increase and the density decreases. With the Planning Board example, at the fifty percent level, there would be 140 trailers and 140 cabins. At the one hundred percent level, the trailers would be gone and the cabins remain at 140. Ms. Creef explained that was the tradeoff. If developers decided to have all cabins they would be held to the fourteen units per acre requirement. There would be fourteen camper/cabins per acre regardless of the total size of the tract. With a 100 percent of camper/cabins, there would be a proposed increase in developer overhead and maintenance expenses. The vacant property of the travel trailer site would have no anticipated upkeep costs. The Planning Board's goal was to address both the concerns of the Board and the public comments recently received. At 100 percent camper cabins, there would be a decrease in density so there would not be an inconsistency with the group-housing standards. In the October meeting, the discussion involved the definition distinction that a campground needed to have both cabins and travel trailer sites. The benefit of the 50/50 ratio for the developer would be increased density overall.

Commissioner Bateman commended the Planning Board for their due diligence. He offered an example where he had recently visited a campsite with 480 sites. At the time only four of the ninety-six small houses were occupied and all of the trailers were rented. He felt the ordinance allowed a developer the flexibility of having travel trailers and later, if the market shifted to the popularity of cabins, the ability of building cabins on previous trailer sites. Chairman Woodard agreed and noted travel trailers were currently very popular and preferred to cabin rentals.

MOTION

Commissioner Couch motioned to schedule a Public Hearing for February 16, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. on the proposed revisions to the Travel Trailer Park and Campground Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board.

Commissioner House seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 6 – DARE COUNTY HOME HEALTH HOSPICE, (Att. #2)

Mr. Outten explained in an effort to find ways to solve some of the problems with the Dare Home Health and Hospice the Board had previously authorized retaining counsel to investigate whether it would make sense to sell the agency. In order to solicit information and potential proposals, the statute required publication of a notice and a resolution of intent. Mr. Outten reiterated no decisions had been made and this step would allow the County to solicit proposals for consideration. He read the resolution into the record, a copy of which would be on file with the Clerk to the Board. Commissioner House restated no decision had yet been made. The resolution would allow the county to look at all available options.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to adopt the Resolution Supporting Home Health and Hospice Request for Proposal.

Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

ITEM 9 - COMMISSIONERS' BUSINESS & MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

Commissioners and the County Manager frequently make extensive remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety in a video on the Dare County website. Following is a brief summary outline of the items mentioned by Commissioners during this segment:

Commissioner Bateman

Congratulated Shanna Fullmer for her hard work and service.

Commissioner Couch

- He thanked Shanna for her dedication and noted the position was a "lightning rod" for public comment and response.
- Noted the Rodanthe Bridge was close to being completed by the end of the year. The project had employed many local residents and may be done by the fall.

Commissioner Tobin

• Thanked Dr. Davies and her staff for operating an amazing program of vaccine rollout.

Commissioner Ross

- Asked everyone to keep Tatum Love, a junior from First Flight High School, who was recently injured in an automobile accident in their thoughts and prayers.
- He reported the new officers of the Albemarle Commission were as follows: Lloyd Griffin is the Chairman, Jordan Davis is Vice-Chair and Fondella Leigh is Secretary.
- He and his wife received their COVID vaccines last week and he thanked Dr. Davies and all those involved with the professional and smoothly run operation.

Commissioner House

- Congratulated Dr. Davies for going above and beyond during the pandemic and applauded how smoothly the vaccine operation was being run.
- Mentioned there was a funding page for Tatum Love and urged contribution.
- NC House of Representative Tim Moore had recently announced the 2021/22 committee and chairman assignments. He added the Marine Resources and Aqua Culture Committee and had appointed Representative Hanig as chairman. Rep. Hanig had a good knowledge of both commercial and leisure fishing issues.
- The CCA (Coastal Conservation Association-North Carolina) had filed a lawsuit against the State and a few fishing trawlers about the use of shrimp trawling and gill nets. The NC Fisheries Association had joined with the state to file a motion in court to dismiss the action and to lay hands with the state to combat the facts of the lawsuit.
- He noted yesterday was the 100th anniversary of the shipwreck known as the *Carroll A. Deering*, which went aground in Cape Hatteras. The vessel had been found with no crew, life jackets or life rafts and became known as the *Ghost Ship*.

Vice-Chairman Overman

- Extended his thanks to Shanna Fullmer for her 25 years of services.
- Expressed best wishes and prayer for Tatum Love during recovery.
- Inquired whether the Board or County might prepare an amicus curiae brief to join the state in the CCA lawsuit. County Attorney Outten advised such a brief could be filed; however, it would be necessary to join as a defendant or third-party defendant dependent on whether the current parties felt it would benefit the action. He advised an amicus brief could not be filed at the trial level.

MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

County Manager Outten mentioned the administering of the COVID vaccine was going smoothly; however, there continued to be an issue with the number of doses released to the County. He assured Dr. Davies and her staff were doing everything possible to secure additional doses.

Mr. Outten asked for a Closed Session pursuant to NCGS 143-318.11(a)(5) to instruct the County staff, or negotiating agents, concerning the position to be taken by or on behalf of the County in negotiating the price and other material terms of a contract, or proposed contract, for the acquisition of real property by purchase, option, exchange, or lease in the matter of Conch Street Endeavors and to maintain attorney/client privilege.

MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to go into Closed Session pursuant to the provisions of the North Carolina General Statutes cited by the County Manager.

Commissioner Bateman seconded the motion.

The Firefighters' Relief Fund (FRF) was established in 1907 to financially assist firefighters that are injured while performing their duties, and to insure that no firefighter would become financially destitute through no fault of their own. The FRF is funded by a portion of the Gross Premium Tax (GPT) (G.S. 105-228.5(d)(3) on insurance policies containing fire and lighting protection, as well as certain automotive policies. These funds are collected and distributed by the Commissioner of Insurance to the Fire Department. The Fire Department must appoint a Local Relief Fund Board as required by NC General Statute 58-84 to oversee and administer the Fund as prescribed in GS 58-84.

Article 84. Local Firefighters' Relief Funds.

§ 58-84-30. Trustees appointed; organization.

For each county, town or city complying with and deriving benefits from the provisions of this Article, there shall be appointed a local board of trustees, known as the trustees of the local Firefighters' Relief Fund, to be composed of five members, two of whom shall be elected by the members of the local fire department who are qualified as beneficiaries of such fund, two of whom shall be elected by the mayor and board of aldermen or other local governing body, and one of whom shall be named by the Commissioner of Insurance. Their selection and term of office shall be as follows:

- (1) The members of the fire department shall hold an election to elect two representatives to the board to serve at the pleasure of the members of the department. The elected representatives may serve until their resignation or until the department holds an election to replace them. Board members elected pursuant to this subdivision shall be either (i) residents of the fire district or (ii) active or retired members of the fire department.
- 2) The mayor and board of aldermen or other local governing body shall appoint two representatives to the board to serve at the pleasure of the governing body. Board members appointed pursuant to this subdivision shall be residents of the fire district.

(3) The Commissioner of Insurance shall appoint one representative to serve as trustee who shall serve at the pleasure of the Commissioner. The member appointed pursuant to this subdivision shall be either (i) a resident of the fire district or (ii) an active or retired member of the fire department.
