

## Re: Dare Home Health & Dare Hospice – Letter of Intent

Dear Mr. Outten,

The purpose of this letter (this "Letter of Intent") is to outline a non-binding proposal by Res-Care, Inc. d/b/a BrightSpring Health Services or its nominee ("BrightSpring" or "Purchaser") to acquire (the "Acquisition") substantially all of the assets and none of the liabilities of Dare Home Health & Dare Hospice (the "Agency" or the "Company") from the Dare County Board of Commissioners, the governing body of Dare County, a North Carolina political subdivision (the "County" or "Seller"). The Agency provides Medicare-certified home health and hospice services in Dare County, North Carolina under license number HC0494 and facility ID 943718, possessing Medicare Home Health Provider Number 34-7074 and NPI number 1285630384 and Medicare Hospice Provider Number 34-1584 and NPI number 1831194547 (the "Business").

1. **<u>Purchase Price</u>**. The aggregate purchase price for the Acquired Assets (as defined below) will be Two Million Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,900,000) in immediately available funds (the "Purchase Price").

Within five (5) working days of the Seller's notification to BrightSpring that the Seller has accepted this Letter of Intent, BrightSpring will wire to Seller ten percent (10%) of the Purchase Price as an earnest money deposit (the "Deposit"). If the Acquisition does not close for any reason, other than BrightSpring's breach of its binding obligations under this Letter of Intent or the Definitive Agreement (if one is executed by both parties hereto), the Deposit will be returned to BrightSpring by the Seller within five (5) working days.

The Seller shall establish a restricted fund balance account in the amount of Two Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$290,000) from either (a) existing cash reserves of the Seller, or (b) a portion of the Purchase Price (the "Restricted Fund Balance Account") for the purpose of securing indemnification obligations of the Seller set forth in the Definitive Agreement (as defined below). The Restricted Fund Balance Account shall be maintained for thirty-six (36) months following the Closing to secure such indemnity obligations, provided, however, that on the eighteen (18) month anniversary of the Closing the balance of the Restricted Fund Balance Account shall be reduced to One Hundred Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$145,000) plus any pending indemnity claims.

The Purchase Price will be decreased to adjust for any debt, consent fees or other contingent liabilities of the Seller that are not paid, resolved or otherwise extinguished on or before the Closing.

- 2. <u>Acquired Assets</u>. The assets and operations to be acquired (the "Acquired Assets") would include, but not limited to, inventory, supplies, personal property, contracts, work force, leaseholds, licenses, certificate of need, phone and fax numbers, provider numbers and agreements, intangible property, intellectual property and all other assets owned or used by Seller in connection with the operation of the Business.
- 3. <u>Excluded Assets</u>. The Acquired Assets would not include office equipment, furniture and fixtures, computer hardware, cash or cash equivalents (including investments), automobiles, bank accounts, accounts receivable and the name Dare Home Health & Dare Hospice (the "Excluded Assets"), which would be retained by the Sellers. BrightSpring may have use of certain Excluded Assets during the period between Closing (as defined below) and the issuance of the final CMS tie-in letter as necessary to operate the Business during such period.
- 4. <u>Sources of Funds</u>. BrightSpring plans on funding the acquisition from either cash on hand or its revolving line of credit ("Revolver") and will not require third party financing. As of January 31, 2021, BrightSpring is in compliance with all covenants in its Credit Agreement.
- 5. **Proration of Taxes.** Seller will pay all ad valorem, real property and personal property taxes due or accruing for time periods prior to the date of Closing. In addition, Seller will pay and be responsible for any outstanding payroll taxes, bed/provider taxes and other taxes and any penalties related thereto for time period prior to the date of Closing. Any ad valorem, real property and personal property taxes for the year in which the Acquisition is closed will be prorated as of the Closing, based on the actual number of days in the year. BrightSpring will pay all ad valorem, real property and personal property and personal property taxes due or accruing for time periods after the Closing.
- 6. **Expenses.** Each party shall pay 100% of their own fees, costs and expenses incurred relating to this contemplated transaction including, without limitation, all legal expenses relating to the negotiation, preparation and performance of a Definitive Agreement (as defined below), as well as broker's fees. Seller will pay the cost of any and all transfer taxes, sales taxes and income taxes due and payable in connection with the sale of the Acquired Assets to BrightSpring.
- 7. **Due Diligence.** BrightSpring and its representatives are prepared to complete all due diligence as expeditiously as possible. BrightSpring shall have thirty (30) days from the acceptance of this Letter of Intent (the "Acceptance Date") to complete a full due diligence examination of the Company and the Business, as well as the books, records, properties, equipment, contracts, customer relationships, caregiver and contractor relationships,

management relationships, physician and referral relationships, operations, business, finance, operating condition, clinical matters, legal and regulatory matters, and the historical and projected results of the operations of the Business. If BrightSpring has not completed its due diligence review by the end of the 30 days using good faith efforts, it will have the option to extend the due diligence period by an additional 15 days, provided BrightSpring provides Seller with written notice prior to the end of the 30-day period.

- 8. <u>Access to Information</u>. The Company shall give BrightSpring and its representatives reasonable access to the Business, including real property, equipment, books, records, financial information, clinical information, contracts, documents and the key management personnel of the Business, and such other documentation as BrightSpring may reasonably request. BrightSpring should not contact employees (other than members of the transaction team), customers, referral sources, caregivers or third parties to contracts except in coordination (or with the consent of) the Company.
- 9. **Definitive Agreement.** Any legal obligations of the parties with respect to the Acquisition will be contained in a definitive purchase and sale agreement containing the terms, representations, warranties, covenants, closing conditions, non-competition and nonsolicitation covenants and indemnities contained herein, usual and customary for healthcare transactions or as otherwise appropriate given the results of BrightSpring's due diligence examination (the "Definitive Agreement"). The Definitive Agreements will address BrightSpring's commitment to providing both home health and hospice services throughout the Agency's entire service area as of the Closing and will contain representations required by N.C. Gen. Stat. §131E-13(a). More specifically, the Definitive Agreement will incorporate terms outlining BrightSpring's commitment to: continue to provide the same or similar services that Seller provided immediately prior to the Closing to individuals in need of such services; ensure that indigent care is available to the population of the service area at levels related to need as previously demonstrated and determined mutually by Seller and Purchaser; not enact financial admission policies that have the effect of denying essential services or treatment solely because of a patient's immediate inability to pay for the services or treatment; and ensure that services of the Business are available to beneficiaries of governmental reimbursement programs (Medicaid/Medicare) without discrimination or preference because they are beneficiaries of those programs.
- 10. <u>**Closing Date.**</u> The parties shall use their commercially reasonable efforts to execute the Definitive Agreement by May 31, 2021 and to close the transaction as soon as possible thereafter (the "Closing").
- 11. Other Provisions and Conditions Precedent to Closing. BrightSpring's obligation to consummate the Acquisition also would be subject to certain conditions, those set forth in this Section 11. The provisions and conditions set forth in this Section 11 shall be subject to further negotiation in connection with the signing of the Definitive Agreement.

- a. <u>Due Diligence</u>. Prior to execution of the Definitive Agreement, BrightSpring and its representatives will have completed due diligence. In the event any fact, event or circumstance is discovered in connection with BrightSpring's due diligence examination and a party deems it prudent to disclose such finding prior to the closing of the transaction, BrightSpring and the Company agree to cooperate in good faith in preparing and reviewing any such report or disclosure; provided, however, no disclosure may be made without the Company's consent.
- b. <u>Definitive Agreement</u>. BrightSpring and the Company shall have executed the Definitive Agreement.
- c. <u>Internal Approvals</u>. BrightSpring shall have obtained approval of the transaction on or before entering into the Definitive Agreement.
- d. <u>Licensure and Regulatory Approvals</u>. The Company shall have obtained all material governmental approvals, consents, and licenses necessary to operate the Business as were required to operate the Business in the normal course at the time the parties entered into the Definitive Agreement. The Company will continue to maintain its provider agreements, provider numbers and billing privileges with respect to those governmental programs.
- e. <u>No Assumption of Contracts.</u> Although it intends to assume substantially all of the contracts related to the Business, BrightSpring is under no obligation to assume all or any of such contracts. Accordingly, BrightSpring will have the option to assume, at its sole discretion, any operating contracts, leases and agreements that affect the operation of the Business. The Seller will obtain all necessary consents, and pay any consent or related fees or costs, to assign such operating contracts, leases and agreements assumed by BrightSpring.
- f. <u>No Assumption of Liabilities</u>. BrightSpring will not assume any of the Seller's liabilities, including, without limitation, the Seller's non-interest-bearing current liabilities or any of the Seller's debt. However, BrightSpring will have the option, at its sole discretion, to assume specific liabilities to be identified during BrightSpring's due diligence review of the Acquired Assets, provided the liabilities are assumable. On or before the Closing, the Seller will pay and discharge all of its outstanding indebtedness and all payables of the Business relating to the period prior to the Closing.
- g. <u>Employees</u>. BrightSpring intends to hire substantially all of the Business' current employees after Closing and to make offers of employment to all such employees, subject to BrightSpring's established hiring policies and requirements (such as clean background checks, re-hire status, etc.). With respect to any of such employees that are hired by BrightSpring, those employees will be credited with their length of service to the Seller for BrightSpring's benefit plan purposes. Seller will be responsible for, and BrightSpring will not assume, the earned, accrued, used or unused personal leave, personal/paid time off, sick or vacation leave, employment contracts, bonuses or other

> payouts for the employees of the Business for periods prior to the Closing. Seller and BrightSpring will negotiate in good faith the allocation of financial responsibility for any COBRA obligations related to current and former employees of the Business. Seller will transfer to BrightSpring the employee records of any and all employees hired by BrightSpring.

- h. <u>Consents</u>. Seller will deliver all consents, and pay any consent or related fees or costs, on or prior to the Closing including, without limitation, consents and estoppel certificates necessary or appropriate for any contracts, leases and/or licenses assumed in connection with the Acquisition. Such consents and estoppel certificates will be in a form reasonably acceptable to BrightSpring and will, among other things, confirm that all renewal options under the contracts and/or leases remain in full force and that BrightSpring will not be subject to any financial covenant requirements.
- i. <u>Title</u>. Seller has, or at the Closing will have, good and marketable title to the Assets free and clear of all covenants, conditions, restrictions, liens, charges or other encumbrances of any kind.
- j. <u>Litigation</u>. There shall be no pending or threatened litigation regarding the ownership of the Seller, the Business, the Company or the Acquired Assets, or with respect to the Acquisition or a Definitive Agreement.
- k. <u>Adverse Change</u>. There shall be no material adverse change in the market, business, financial condition, results of operations, clinical performance, physical condition, management, ownership, or structure of the Business prior to the Closing.
- 12. **Indemnification.** The Company and BrightSpring shall each indemnify, defend and hold the other party, its directors, employees, agents, and representatives harmless from any and all claims, losses, liabilities, demands, costs, expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, judgments, awards and causes of action, but only to the extent of actual damages (collectively, "Claims") arising from any breach or default in performance of any Binding Provision (as defined below) of this Letter of Intent caused by or resulting from the indemnifying party or its Representatives; except to the extent that such Claims arise from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the indemnified party.
- 13. <u>Non-Negotiation Period</u>. The Company hereby agrees that for a period commencing on the Acceptance Date and continuing through June 30, 2021 (the "Non-Negotiation Period"), the Company shall not (and shall instruct the Seller and their respective affiliates, employees and representatives not to):
  - a. negotiate, discuss or otherwise communicate with any other potential purchaser or lessee of (i) all or substantially all of the Business outside of the normal course, or (ii) all or substantially all of the Acquired Assets;

- b. solicit or encourage submission of any proposal or offer to acquire or lease (i) all or substantially all of the Business outside of the normal course, or (ii) all or substantially all of the Acquired Assets;
- c. participate in any discussion or negotiation regarding any proposal or offer to sell or lease (i) all or substantially all of the Business outside of the normal course, or (ii) all or substantially all of the Acquired Assets; or
- d. furnish to any person other than BrightSpring and its representatives any information regarding the Acquired Assets or the Business except as required by law or to continue to the operation of the Business; or
- e. cooperate in any way with or assist or participate in any proposal or offer from any person other than BrightSpring to acquire or lease (i) all or substantially all of the Business outside of the normal course, or (ii) all or substantially all of the Acquired Assets.
- 14. <u>Announcements</u>. No party shall announce the proposed transaction without the prior consent of the other, unless required by law.
- 15. <u>**Termination.**</u> This Letter of Intent may be terminated by either party in the event a Definitive Agreement is not executed on or before the expiration of the Non-Negotiation Period.

This non-binding proposal expresses the interest of BrightSpring in purchasing the Business and supersedes all previous written or oral negotiations, commitments, and writings. Except for the provisions of this paragraph and <u>Sections 6, 12, 13, and 15</u> (the "Binding Provisions"), this Letter of Intent does not constitute a binding agreement between the parties. The legal obligations of the parties with respect to any purchase of the Business would be contained solely in a Definitive Agreement. The parties agree that no party shall be entitled to any recourse, in the form of damages, equitable relief or otherwise, for expenses incurred or benefit conferred or lost before or after the date first written above in the event that there is a failure, for whatever reason, of the parties to agree on any term or terms and/or provisions of a Definitive Agreement. Each party reserves the right of final approval or disapproval, for any reason and in its absolute and sole discretion, of any Definitive Agreement or the advisability of a transaction.

BrightSpring is well positioned financially to assume ownership in the Business based on its strong balance sheet, proven expertise, and access to capital. Moreover, BrightSpring possesses the operational, clinical and management expertise necessary to accomplish a transaction of this size in a professional and expeditious manner.

## SUMMARY OF PROCESS TO ESTABLISH SERVICE DISTRICT

- A. The BOC must consider five items:
  - 1. Population
  - 2. Property values,
  - 3. Tax rates,
  - 4. Ability of district to pay,
  - 5. Any other matters that have bearing
- B. Based upon the information it receives, the Board must make four findings:
  - 1, Need
  - Impossible or impracticable to provide service county wide
  - 3. Economically feasible
  - 4. Demand by those taxed
- C. Prepare a report about the proposed Service District and have it available for public inspection four weeks in advance of a required public hearing
- D. Conduct a public hearing after mailing notices to all property owners within the district four weeks prior to the public hearing
- E. After the public hearing, adopt a resolution creating the Service District and setting the tax rate effective in the fiscal year following its adoption.







#### MINUTES

DARE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MEETING

Dare County Administration Building, Manteo, NC

#### 5:00 p.m., March 15, 2021

Commissioners present: Chairman Robert Woodard, Sr., Vice Chairman Wally Overman Rob Ross, Steve House, Jim Tobin, Danny Couch, Ervin Bateman

At 5:03 p.m. Chairman Woodard called to order the regularly scheduled meeting with appropriate prior public notice having been given. The prayer offered by George Lurie was read and then he led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

#### ITEM 1 – OPENING REMARKS – CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE

Following is a brief outline of the items mentioned by Chairman Woodard during his opening remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety in a video on the Dare County website:

- He met with Rep. Murphy this week who spoke with homebuilders. Later in the day Rep. Murphy met with Commissioner Tobin and he is very supportive of our inlet and dredging issues.
- Received his vaccine on Saturday without any side effects. He encouraged all fellow citizens to get their shots when made available to them.
- Rodanthe sound launch area construction would begin at the end of March and would take approximately ninety days. It would be a two-lane boat dock and be completed in two phases.
- Current TV had released a video in partnership with Manteo honoring Richard Etheridge and the history of the life-saving station. "Freedmen Surfmen Heroes" tells the unique story of the Pea Island Lifesaving Station, which was constructed in 1878.
- Gov. Cooper had opened up vaccines to those eligible in Group 4 as of March 14, 2021.
- Reported the Visitor's Bureau had released occupancy results for the 2020 season. Although many sections of the economy in some areas suffered, overall others did extremely well with rentals showing an increase of 73% from December, 2019.

#### **ITEM 2 – PUBLIC COMMENTS**

At 5:19 p.m. the Manager outlined the procedure for making public comments via email to <u>dcboc@darenc.com</u> or preregistering at a link to provide comments via virtual connection, as previously noticed. Following is a summary of all citizen remarks:

- Corey Bonner asked if anyone had considered contacting NIMS. He stated Dare County Emergency Response Plan was supposed to respond to overwash and there did not seem to be much collaboration from state organizations. He stated Avon was a village caught between a national park and a national seashore and did not agree with a tax paid by citizens to protect a beach and road they did not own.
- 2. Mary Ann Marsal indicated after the last meeting she had become convinced that beach nourishment was beneficial to the community and should be tried. She did not agree with the division of the area's two zones and stated there should be one district. Her taxes under the proposal would increase 45%.
- 3. Daniel Twining, a beachfront owner in Avon, strongly supported the Avon proposal and appreciated the work of the Board stating saving the beach was essential and they were willing to pay their fair share of the project costs.
- 4. Roberto Pierce, a navy veteran and new resident, noted he was researching some matters. Mr. Outten offered he could contact the County directly for any information he may be interested in receiving.
- 5. Via email: Charlie Myers, owner of Ride Hatteras Surf Shop, stated he supported the Avon project. He asked about long-term solutions to erosion issues, was opposed to perpetually nourishing the beach, concerned about losing the beach nourishment gain right after a storm and would like to see more county leadership to create a "more stable lifeline for Hatteras Island residents, businesses and visitors".

The County Manager closed Public Comments at 5:30 p.m.

#### ITEM 3 – BROADBAND

Prompted from discussions with Vice-Chairman Overman, Derek Kelly from Lumen Technologies, formerly known as CenturyLink, made a presentation with an overview of the current status of broadband in the area. He shared FCC's broadband maps which reflected areas where broadband speeds were less than 25x3 Mbs. COVID had brought many more students and parents relying upon working from home computers with reliable internet service. He explained, under current guidelines, if one home in a census block had service then the entire census block was considered served. The FCC had just received funding to have the maps redone to reflect location-based service. CenturyLink had won the auction to provide service to areas with a six-year build out program called RDOF (The Rural Digital Opportunity Fund) which could aid service to the East Lake area. Vice-Chairman Overman asked when the plans would begin. Mr. Kelly reported it was hopeful to have a timeline of plans by the end of the year.

He also gave an overview of the G.R.E.A.T. grant program and mentioned one challenge was the identification of underserved pockets. He said it would be helpful for Dare to partner with providers and help identify those pockets. Some counties were contributing up to 10% of

funding for the program. RDOF did not require any additional funding. Mr. Kelly explained if other service companies were present in a census area, such as Spectrum, then the area would not be eligible for G.R.E.A.T. grant programs. There were currently no Spectrum services in East Lake according to Mr. Kelly. Vice-Chairman Overman mentioned there had been preliminary conversations with the cable company to inquire as to any possible partnerships to reach underserved areas.

#### ITEM 4 – DISCUSSION OF A TAX SERVICE DISTRICT FOR UNINCORPORATED DARE COUNTY - AVON BEACH NOURISHMENT PROJECT (Att. # 1)

County Manager Outten reviewed the County had presented the Avon plan in February and now it needed to be decided whether to begin the involved statutory process of establishing the tax service district, which would include mailings and a public hearing, etc. He requested approval to start the process and explained afterward, at a future meeting, a vote could decide to put the district in place. During the budget process, the actual tax amount would be voted upon. Generally, it would take approximately sixty days to complete the process. MOTION

Commissioner Ross motioned to authorize the County Manager to begin the process to establish an Avon Service District.

Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### **ITEM 5 – PROCLAMATION ESTABLISHING APRIL 2021 AS "NORTH CAROLINA 811** SAFE DIGGING MONTH"

Chairman Woodard introduced this proclamation which celebrated the 43<sup>rd</sup> year of service of NC One Call System, also known as NC811. The notification center provided location of utilities on both residential and commercial projects to prevent environmental impact, damages to utility lines and potential injuries to workers and the general public during excavation projects.

#### MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the proclamation. Commissioner Bateman seconded the motion. VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### ITEM 6 – HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES – PUBLIC HEALTH PROCLAMATION **"TAKE DOWN TOBACCO DAY 2021"**

A pre-recorded presentation provided information on the dangers of e-cigarettes and other electronic products and how to increase awareness of the problems regarding tobacco use among the youth of Dare County. Commissioner House stated the heading on the Board's agendas read, "How will these decisions impact our children and families." He supported the proclamation. Commissioner Ross was impressed by the students and their message and expressed the need for an equally demonstrative campaign against the use of other intoxicants, such as marijuana.

#### MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to approve the proclamation. Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion. VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### ITEM 7 – PROPOSED DARE COUNTY SOCIAL MEDIA USE GUIDELINES & POLICY (Att. #2)

Dorothy Hester and Katelin Kight illustrated the new social media use guidelines. The policy had been updated once since its adoption in 2012. The update would establish two general social media accounts, Facebook and Instagram. The presentation reported estimations of 72% of adults used at least one social media platform. The County had a limited presence on Facebook with several individual departments. The current website was a primary communication tool and social media accounts could become a secondary tool. Katelin shared the number of followers to the Dare County Dept. of Health and Human Services Facebook page, which had grown from 1,318 on March 1, 2020 to 11,998 a year later. A Facebook account would serve as a tool for distribution of information such as County project updates, hurricane notifications and program information for other departments. There would be posting guidelines and filters assigned on the site. Mr. Outten remarked the county was coming into social media late in comparison with other areas over concerns regarding monitoring and proper archiving. The accounts would be a platform for questions and answers and not a political forum. He stated there would be Facebook comments that we would not like and we would have to accept. The concerns would be worth the benefits to getting out information. Commissioner Bateman said moving forward with these accounts would require careful monitoring. Ms. Hester asked that the policy be approved with a few minor revisions and to include a Flickr account.

#### **MOTION**

Commissioner House motioned to approve the Dare County Social Media Use Guidelines & Policy as presented with a few minor revisions.

Commissioner Bateman seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### **ITEM 8 – DARE COUNTY DREDGE MATERIAL PERMIT PROJECT**

Ken Willson, Sr., the Project/Program Manager at Coastal Protection Engineering, provided information regarding the short and long term needs for county dredge material placement. One goal was to provide additional capacity for maintenance of federal and nonfederal navigation channels. He stressed the need for alternatives of disposal to enhance coastal resilience. There were twenty-two different concept alternatives in the report, to include bird islands, new confined disposal facilities and thin layer placement options. There were eight recommendations developed to provide long-term and short-term strategies which utilized a screening matrix, as well as feedback from stakeholders. Recommendation #1 was the pursuit of permitting for both the Central and Southern Dare County Project Areas. Vice-Chairman Overman asked about the limiting factors of utilizing "Island H". Mr. Willson explained the area had an inside bowl which was formed by the construction of dykes. Wildlife Resource Commission and engineering factors had limits on the height of dykes for stability concerns. Green Island was a low elevation bird island which could have its elevation built up over time if permitted. Chairman Woodard asked if the County could do something similar to Portsmouth's Craney Island, which was a dredged material management area. Mr. Willson responded the big challenge was the economics and whether material was proper for placement. New bird islands would require their purpose and need in a project clearly established for dredge disposal to avoid disrupted use after development. Mr. Willson summarized the scope of work included in the existing contract provided for 14-18 months to obtain permits and various environmental documents to be completed to include additional

sediment sampling. Recommendation #2 provided for sediment sampling of channels to add to the existing Corps data to justify new project permits. Commissioner Tobin asked the approximate cost of the Vibracore data to establish the mineralogy of the material. The estimate was \$130,000. Vice-Chairman Overman asked about placing material at Fort Raleigh given the present escarpment. Mr. Willson explained some concerns regarding material placement below the water line and offered the Park Service was proposing to retain it as a natural shoreline environment. Recommendation #3 included the development of numerical models for alternatives in the Northern Roanoke Sound. Integration of Corps data into a GIS system was a long-term Recommendation #4 and would aid in evaluating trends. The assessment of confined disposal facility alternatives in three locations was identified as long-term Recommendation #5. Recommendations #6 and #7 suggested funding for projects which align with some goals of Corps projects. If CPE's recommendation #1 was approved Mr. Willson suggested moving forward with number two as quickly as possible because of the lag time required for securing the funding with matching from the state. Mr. Outten asked if grant funding for the thin layer placement was available and Mr. Willson felt further discussions needed to be accomplished with the Corps to screen the beneficial use projects. MOTION

Commissioner Tobin motioned to approve CPE's Recommendation No. 1. Vice-Chairman Overman seconded the motion. VOTE: AYES unanimous

It was the consensus of the Board to discuss the other recommendations at their upcoming retreat.

#### **ITEM 9 – ALLIS HOLDINGS, LLC DECLARATION OF CONSERVATION EASEMENT**

On December 21, 2020 the Board approved the request for a conservation easement by Allis Holdings, LLC to be located near a Dare County water tower on Duck Road. The County Manager advised the language needed to be changed to allow for an easement for the staging of future County repairs and maintenance to the water tower.

#### MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to reapprove the declaration of a conservation easement with the inclusion of an easement for County future maintenance and repairs.

Commissioner Bateman seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### ITEM 10 – AWARD OF FY2020-2021 EQUIPMENT FINANCING

Dave Clawson, Finance Director, explained their department had received proposals from seven financial institutions for the financing of County vehicles and equipment, such as garbage trucks, ambulances and sheriff vehicles. These purchases were approved in the 2020-2021 operating budget. Banc of America Public Capital Corp (BAPCC) was the lowest cost proposal at 0.6734% for a three year term over thirty-six months.

#### MOTION

Commissioner House motioned to adopt the resolution to award the financing to BAPCC and authorize the County Manager and staff to execute all the necessary financing documents. Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### ITEM 11 – CONSENT AGENDA

The Manager announced the items as they were visually displayed in the meeting room. **MOTION** 

Commissioner House motioned to approve the Consent Agenda:

Commissioner Bateman seconded the motion.

VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### **ITEM 12 – BOARD APPOINTMENTS**

- <u>Rodanthe-Waves-Salvo Community Center</u> Commissioner Couch motioned to appoint Cheryl Blankenship. Commissioner House seconded the motion. VOTE: AYES unanimous
- <u>Manns Harbor Marina Commission</u> Commissioner House motioned to reappoint Cyndy Holda, Ladd Bayliss, Jonathan Oglesby and Jessie "Troy" Outland, Jr. for another term. Commissioner Tobin seconded the motion. VOTE: AYES unanimous

#### ITEM 13 – COMMISSIONERS' BUSINESS & MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

Commissioners and the County Manager frequently make extensive remarks, which can be viewed in their entirety on the Dare County website. Following is a brief summary outline of the items mentioned during this segment:

Commissioner Tobin

- Congressman Murphy had met with him at the NC Industrial Park Authority and they
  discussed the County's dredging needs and the importance of our waterways while they
  toured various boating facilities.
- He introduced a video regarding the County's new dredge, to be named *Miss Katie*. It was scheduled for delivery in April, 2022 and would help maintain inlets especially after a storm. The Oregon Inlet Task Force would schedule when and where the dredge went after completion. He announced the steel had begun to be cut for the new vessel.

#### Commissioner Ross

• The subgroup meetings to discuss the Outer Banks event site in Nags Head continued and were chaired by Lee Nettles. There were still unsettled matters regarding a proposed hotel along with parking issues. He would provide updates.

#### Commissioner House

Dare County Board of Commissioners - March 15, 2021

- He encouraged all local watermen to take the survey on the NC Division of Marine Fisheries website to help determine the effects of water quality in our fisheries.
- Reminded everyone of the new SPCA ribbon cutting on March 19 at 11:00 a.m.
- He highlighted several events for "today in history": The assassination of Julius Caesar in 44 BC, the birthdays of President Andrew Jackson (1767) and Ruth Bader Ginsburg (1933) along with the anniversary of when Maine became the twenty-third state (1820).

#### Vice-Chairman Overman

- He had participated in the March for Meals program and delivered meals to several seniors. It was a great program and truly benefited those it served.
- He thanked Derek Kelly for his broadband discussion. Vice-Chairman mentioned he had spoken with the government relations director at Charter/Spectrum and requested an estimate on the cost to add coverage into the mainland areas where it did not currently exist. He hoped to provide an update during the retreat.

#### Commissioner Bateman

• Noted he had nothing additional to share.

#### Commissioner Couch

- Was pleased to announce work had begun on the Hatteras Village multi-use pathway. The pandemic had been hard on the restaurants and shops and it was hopeful the pathway would be completed by August, 2021.
- Noted tourism and visitor traffic had been closed for approximately six weeks in 2020 and predicted 2021 would be a "bang up year" with the Outer Banks as the "destination".

#### MANAGER'S/ATTORNEY'S BUSINESS

County Manager Outten explained dredging the Hatteras South Ferry Channel had been met with various difficulties which had cost both additional time and funds. There were ten more days of dredging needed, which would exceed the dredging budget by approximately \$58,000. He asked for authority to sign the appropriate budget amendment to move \$60,000 from contingency to the Hatteras dredging fund. The transfer would allow for the completion of the project.

#### <u>MOTIÓN</u>

Commissioners Tobin, House, Couch, Ross and Vice-Chairman Overman motioned to allow for the transfer of \$60,000 from the contingency fund to the Hatteras dredging fund and authorize the County Manager to sign the necessary budget amendments. Commissioner Bateman seconded the motion.

#### VOTE: AYES unanimous

Several meetings ago the Board had discussed realigning an easement between property lines along Airport Road. County water crews had confirmed the existence of a culvert in the area with ground penetrating radar. Before moving the easement, the owner of the lots would have to have the culvert moved. Discussions regarding stormwater issues in the area would continue at the upcoming Board retreat.

Mr. Outten stated the Board had agreed to purchase the Mako Mike's property at the last meeting with a noted purchase price to construct a new EMS station with Kill Devil Hills. The

seller had advised he may avail himself to receive tax deductions by providing the County with a donation. The contract would still reflect the County's agreed upon purchase price.

He gave an update on the Rodanthe boat dock project. Businesses and those who relied upon the dock had voiced concerns over the negative impacts of any long closure. Brent Johnson was working to resolve some of those issues. Inquiry had been made to the Wildlife Resources Commission to delay the project until the "off season"; however, stalling the work for three to four years with the uncertainty of funding was not an option. Alternative solutions were being investigated, such as limited use while under the construction.

Vice-Chairman Overman mentioned Wildlife Resources currently had a project underway at Pirate's Cove Bridge with completion in May. Commissioner Tobin added it would increase parking with added trailer parking. Mr. Outten advised the Rodanthe project was trying to accommodate a multitude of uses to include use by commercial fisherman, a helipad, recycling and the need to stage construction materials.

Dorothy Hester gave reminder of the opening of the new SPCA this week with a ribbon cutting. The event would be available online with limited access of the new facility afterward.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Chairman Woodard asked for a motion to adjourn. MOTION Commissioner Ross motioned to adjourn the meeting. Commissioners Tobin and House seconded the motion. VOTE: AYES unanimous

At 8:17 p.m., the Board of Commissioners adjourned until 9:00 a.m., April 7, 2021.

Amendment to Grant Project Ordinance for Coronavirus Relief Fund

#### Description

The attached amends the budget for estimated FEMA expenses in the Coronavirus Relief Fund, decreasing the total estimate by \$23,661. Each line item was and is an estimate of what will be filed for approval by FEMA for reimbursement. The one significant item is a decrease of \$113,960 to the checkpoints line item as FEMA has denied this filing for equipment use allowances. That denial will be appealed. All other changes are changes in estimates.

#### County of Dare, North Carolina Grant Project Ordinance for Coronavirus Relief Fund

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Dare, North Carolina that, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following grant project ordinance, originally adopted on June 1, 2020 and amended on June 15, 2020, July 20, 2020, August 3, 2020, and September 21, 2020, is hereby amended:

Section 1 This ordinance is to change the budget for NC C-19 Relief Fund/CARES Act grant through the State due a change in FEMA coverage.

The NC CRF is a pass-through of federal CARES Act funds. Eligible expenditures must be incurred during 3/1/2020 through 12/30/2021.

All units of local government have been declared FEMA eligible for Emergency Protective Measures (EPM) for eligible expenditures 1/30/2020 through 9/14/2020. FEMA extended eligible expenditures beginning 9/15/2020 only for EPM for first responders and Emergency Operations Centers.

<u>Section 2</u> The following budget shall be conducted within the Coronavirus Relief Fund (fund #14). The level of budgetary control for expenditures for the NC C-19 Relief Fund grant is the grant total.

<u>Section 3</u> The amended budget matches the County C19 Grant Plan and revisions filed with the State for the NC CRF. The budget shall be amended as the Plan is approved or changed by the Board of Commissioners.

<u>Section 4</u> The following amounts are changed and appropriated for the projects:

<u>Section 6</u> The Finance Officer is directed to report the financial status of the project as a part of the normal monthly, quarterly, and annual reporting processes.

<u>Section 7</u> The Coronavirus Relief Fund is a multi-year Special Revenue Fund for non-recurring activities. All funds are appropriated pursuant to section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the NCGS, therefore, appropriations do not lapse at the end of the fiscal year. The legal level of budgetary control is the total fund budget.

<u>Section 8</u> Copies of this capital project ordinance shall be furnished to the Budget Officer, the Finance Officer and to the Clerk to the Board of Commissioners.
